I. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS: -

 (a) Candidates seeking admission to M.P.T course 2025-2026 session for Government Medical College and Government Quota seats in Self-financing Medical Colleges affiliated to the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R Medical University can be accessed from the following website:

www.tnmedicalselection.net

- (b) Candidates should submit their online filled in application form upto 5.00 PM on 31.08.2025, thereafter there is no provision for the candidates to submit their online application form.
- (c) Non-refundable application fee of Rs.1000/-
 - Method of all fee payments through online payment portal only.
 - Candidates have to pay application fee through online via Debit card / Credit card / Net Banking or RTGS / UPI.
 - All Candidates should make sure to apply in time and avoid last minute rush.
 - Candidates must note that mere deduction of fee from the Bank account is not a proof of fee payment.
- (d) Service Candidates should upload their Service particulars along with the filled-in online application forms. (Duly certified by the Forwarding Authority with date and seal)
- (e) Applications with incomplete or insufficient particulars and enclosures will not be accepted.

II. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:-

- 2. (a) Candidate should be a citizen of India.
 - (b) Candidates who are claiming Nativity of Tamil Nadu should upload their certificate of Nativity of Tamil Nadu issued by the competent authority from the Revenue Department of Tamil Nadu with official seal. Candidates who are claiming community reservation of Tamil Nadu should upload the following certificates:
 - i. Candidate's Community certificate issued by Competent authority from Revenue Department of Tamil Nadu with official seal.
 - ii. Community Certificate of either of parents issued by competent authority from Revenue Department of Tamil Nadu with official seal.
 - (c) Those who have studied from 11th standard onwards and undergone B.P.T in Tamil Nadu should upload the nativity certificate.
 - (d) Nativity certificate submitted later will not be accepted.
 - (e) The Candidates are instructed to upload the following documents in addition to above:
 - Copy of Aadhaar Card
 - > Any one of the following as supportive documents:
 - Driving Licence
 - Voter's ID
 - Passport
 - Copy of Parent's Documents (Aadhaar card and School Certificate).

If the copy of the supporting document is not produced, then the application form will not be accepted.

3. Candidates should possess a B.P.T Degree awarded by the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R Medical University or any other University recognized as equivalent thereto by the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University / Physiotherapy Council.

Candidates who have qualified from other Universities should submit the Eligibility Certificate from the Tamil Nadu Dr.MGR Medical University, Guindy, Chennai-32 at the time of admission.

4. Candidates should have obtained not less than 50% of the total marks obtained in all semesters taken together in the B.P.T. Degree course. In case of failure(s) the pass marks in the subsequent attempt(s) shall be taken for calculation purpose. Number of attempts is not considered for calculation of marks.

Candidates should have completed Internship before 31.08.2025

- 5. A candidate who has already completed or acquired a Postgraduate Degree in any Branch in M.P.T. course or is undergoing M.P.T. Course in any Branch is ineligible to apply for any other specialty in M.P.T course.
- 6. The following category of B.P.T. Graduates will be treated as Service candidates:
 - i. B.P.T. graduates serving in Tamil Nadu Government Medical Service on a regular basis and who have completed two years of service as on 31.03.2025.
 - ii. B.P.T. graduates who are approved probationers serving in local bodies who have completed 2 years of service as on 31.03.2025.

- 7. The following categories of B.P.T. Graduates will be considered for selection under open quota as non service candidates only:
 - a) B.P.T. graduates who are serving in the institutions of Govt. of India in Tamil Nadu and Public Sector Undertaking and Organization under the control of Government of India in Tamil Nadu.
 - b) B.P.T. Graduates who have not been selected by TNPSC / MRB and are serving purely Under temporary category in Tamil Nadu Medical Service / Local bodies.
 - c) B.P.T. Graduates serving in Private sector.

III. PROCEDURE FOR FILLING AND SUBMISSION OF THE APPLICATION:-

- 8. a. Candidates should upload the necessary enclosures while submitting the online application.
 - b. Recent passport size photograph to be uploaded in the application form.
 - c. SC / SCA / ST Candidates of Tamil Nadu Nativity are exempted from application fee.
- 9. The candidates should fill the online Application form carefully.
- 10. A candidate should submit only ONE online application form.
- 11. The Government Orders issued and to be issued from time to time pertaining to any of the matters contained in the prospectus should be read as part and parcel of this prospectus and such terms and conditions in the Government Order are deemed to have been incorporated in this prospectus.
- 12. Service candidates should upload their application along with the service particulars with the remarks of the forwarding authority duly signed with seal and date as prescribed in the application form. The Online Applications of the Service candidates who have completed two years of continuous, regular service as on 31.03.2025 excluding availed leave alone will be considered. The Head of the Directorates have to issue a Certificate of completion of the required service.
- 13. Candidates must upload the following documents along with the application:
 - i. B.P.T. course completion Certificate.
 - ii. B.P.T. Degree Certificate or Provisional Pass Certificate.
 - iii. First year / Semester to Final year/Semester B.P.T., Mark sheets.
 - iv. Valid Community Certificate issued by the competent authority from Revenue Department of Tamil Nadu with Office Seal and date.
 - v. Eligibility certificate from The Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University for candidates who have qualified B.P.T., degree course from other Universities.
 - vi. Attempt Certificate in Final Year B.P.T. course.
 - vii. Nativity certificate (if applicable) with supportive document.
 - viii. Copy of posting order (For service candidates).

Candidates are instructed to produce the abovementioned original Certificates/ Documents at the time of admission for certificate verification.

14. It should be the responsibility of the candidate to give the correct mailing address on the main application form. If there is any change of address it should be intimated immediately to the Selection Committee in writing.

IV. RANK LIST:-

15. A common Rank List for M.P.T course will be prepared for a total mark of 100 by computing of academic marks for 90 and experience marks for 10.

CALCULATION OF ACADEMIC MARKS:

16. The total marks obtained must be reduced to the base of 90 marks and the weighted total marks obtained should be calculated accurate to two decimals. The academic marks are arrived at as shown below:

i. EXAMPLE:

Year of Study	Maximum Total Marks Prescribed	Total Marks Obtained
FIRST	700	500
SECOND	900	730
THIRD	1000	860
FOURTH	1000	890
GRAND TOTAL	3600	2980

Therefore Academic Marks –

 $(2980/3600) \times 90 = 74.50$

- ii. One mark for each completed year of experience as on 31.03.2025 which is calculated from the last date of the month of passing B.P.T. Degree Examination, subject to a maximum of 10 marks shall be awarded as experience mark for both Service and Non-Service candidates. Two marks will be awarded to each year of Government service in hilly areas and it will be awarded to a maximum of 10 marks. Altogether the total marks awarded for experience will be restricted to 10 marks for all candidates including candidates from hilly areas. Fractional values of a year will not be counted for awarding marks for experience and experience in hilly regions.
- iii. Candidates who have furnished the mark sheets only in grades, they should furnish the actual marks obtained from the University. If not, only the minimum marks of the grade will be considered.
- 17. The Secretary, Selection Committee will publish the rank list on the following website: www.tnmedicalselection.net

18. **DETERMINATION OF INTER-SE-MERIT**

In case of two or more candidates obtaining equal marks out of total of 100 marks, the inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be determined on the basis of the following order of preference:

a) Least number of appearances in the final Semester / final year of B.P.T. Examination.

- b) Total marks obtained in the final Semester / final year Examination of B.P.T. course.
- c) Seniority in age

V. COUNSELLING PROCEDURE: -

- 19. a) (i) Admission to M.P.T Course, shall be made by the ONLINE COUNSELLING based on rank following the rule of reservation / roster system by Government of Tamil Nadu. The detailed online counselling procedure are available in Annexure.
 - (ii) Candidates who have not registered and choice locked in the 1st round of ONLINE COUNSELLING will be permitted to the subsequent rounds of ONLINE COUNSELLING.
 - b) Candidates will be allotted seats in online counselling according to their ranks.
 - c) Option once given during the online counselling cannot be changed later.
 Request for change of Branch / College, from one to another is not permitted after an option has been exercised at the time of online counselling.
 - d) Request for transfer from one college / branch will not be allowed strictly after the cutoff date.
 - e) Mutual transfer / Individual request for transfer of college will not be permitted under any circumstances.
- 20. Candidates selected for admission should give a self-declaration form at the time of admission that he / she is liable for forfeiture of selection / admission if suppression of facts are found at any time during or after admission to the course.

The Tuition fee will be forfeited for such candidates.

The selection / admission shall be liable for cancellation based on the declaration at any time during or after the admission.

- 21. Candidates who have not registered and not choice locked at the scheduled date and time of online counselling will not be considered for admission. However the Selection Committee reserves the right to permit the candidate to attend the subsequent online counselling, if a valid reason is communicated to the Selection Committee before the commencement of subsequent online counselling.
- 22. The candidates should produce their Original Certificates in person at the time of joining in their selected institution / Medical Colleges along with the photo copy of Original Certificates to the concerned institution / Medical Colleges.
- 23. Any change or modification and relevant information pertaining to this admission process will be made available immediately on the website.
- 24. All candidates attending the online counselling will have to remit a non-refundable amount of ₹500/- (Non-refundable) through ONLINE via Debit Card / Credit Card / Net Banking as Registration fee.
- 25. a. The Selection will be made by Online Counselling based on rank and by applying Rule of Reservation / Roster method followed by the Government of Tamil Nadu.
 - Roster method will be followed if the seats are more than 1 and less than 8 in each branch as per G.O.Ms.No.241, dated. 29-10-07 of Personnel and Administrative

Reforms (K) Department of Government of Tamil Nadu. This is subject to the final verdict of the Supreme Court of India in the SLP 14014-15/09 filed by this Government against the orders passed by the Bench of the High Court of Madras dated 12.05:2009 in W.A Nos.763 & 764 / 2007 and W.P No. 7067 / 2009.

If the seats are 8 and more, the rule of reservation shall be asfollows: -

Open Competition - 31%
Backward Class - 30%
Most Backward class - 20%
Scheduled Caste - 18%
Scheduled Tribe - 1%

Within the 30% reservation for Backward Classes 3.5% reservation will be provided for Muslims.

16% of seats out of 18% Quota earmarked to Scheduled Caste shall be allocated to the Arunthathiyar Community.

b. 50% of seats will be made available for service candidates and the other 50% of seats are for Open Quota to be filled on the basis of rank from Service and Non–Service candidates put together. In case of an odd number of vacancy, among the seats, that vacant seat shall be filled up by consideration of rank and communal reservation.

Vi. METHOD OF SELECTION & ADMISSION:-

- 26. a) Selection and admission of students to the seats earmarked as Government quota in Self-Financing and Government Aided Institutions will be subject to the Central and State Act and Rules proposed by the respective Government. The seat matrix for these institutions will be displayed during counselling.
 - b) Service candidates taking allotment in Self-financing colleges will not be paid salary and they have to avail leave to which they are eligible for the period of study on their own after obtaining prior permission from their concerned Head of Department.
 - c) Stipend / Fee structure/ Bond amount/ any other conditions will be as per the Rules prevailing in the concerned Institution.

VI. DURATION OF COURSE AND TUITION FEES: -

(27) (i) The Duration of the M.P.T course shall be 2 years.

The selected candidates have to pay any balance of the Tuition Fee (if any) and other special fees etc., at the time of admission in their respective Medical Colleges / Institutions.

(ii) Selected candidates should pay an amount of 6500/- through ONLINE payment Portal via Debit Cart / Credit Card / Net Banking / UPI towards Tuition Fee for taking the allotment order. This will be adjusted towards the tuition fee that has

to be paid to the colleges and the balance amount, towards tuition fee has to be paid in the respective colleges at the time of joining the course. The Tuition Fee is Non-refundable, if the candidate discontinues or does not join the course.

(iii) Students of SC/SCA/ST and SC converted Christianity community, whose parents' / guardians annual income is less than Rs.2,50,000/- (Rupees Two lakhs only) are exempted from payment of all compulsory, Non-refundable fees (Enrolment/ Registration, Tuition, Games, Union, Library, Magazine, Medical Examination and such other fee compulsorily payable by the scholar to the Institution or University / Board) and also exempted from all compulsory. Non refundable fees fixed by the "Fee Committee". The fees, so exempted shall be claimed by the respective Institutions under the Scholarship Programme of the Government of India in G.O.(Ms) No.6, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, dated: 09.01.2012 and as per G.O.(Ms) No.92, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, dated 11.09.2012.

(iv) Discontinuation fee:-

The students who are allotted and joined in any of the seats in Government Medical Colleges and discontinue the course after the cut-off date should pay the Discontinuation fee of Rs. 1,50,000/- (Rupees One Lakh fifty thousand only) by means of Demand Draft in favour of "The Secretary, Selection Committee, Directorate of Medical Education and Research, Kilpauk Chennai 10 payable at Chennai.

VII. STIPEND & SECURITY AMOUNT: -

- 28. All service candidates serving in Tamil Nadu Government under the control of the Directorate of Medical Education and Research / Directorate of Public Health and Preventive Medicine / Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services and Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services (ESI) selected and allotted for M.P.T Course in Government Institutions shall undergo the course and be paid salary / Stipend / Bond as per the Government Orders in force.
- 29. a) All Service candidates of Tamil Nadu shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.5,00,000/-(Rupees Five lakhs only) as security amount with the undertaking that they will serve the Government of Tamil Nadu till superannuation. Two permanent Government servants in the same or higher rank than the candidate shall execute sureties. The prescribed form will be available in the colleges at the time of admission. The service candidates shall serve for the Government of Tamil Nadu after the completion of the course until superannuation.

The Service candidates should have 5 years left over service after completion of course

b) Non-Service candidates of Tamil Nadu shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.5,00,000/-(Rupees Five lakhs only) as security amount with the undertaking that they will serve the Government of Tamil Nadu for a period of not less than two years if required. During the above period they will be paid a salary on par with the fresh recruits of the Government of Tamil Nadu Government Medical Service and the Government of Tamil Nadu will reckon their services if required within a period of two years from the date of completion of their postgraduate degree courses. Two permanent Government servants shall be sureties. The prescribed form will be available in the colleges at the time of admission. The bond will become infructuous if he / she serves the Government of Tamil Nadu if required for a minimum period of two years.

c) If for any reason, the candidate is unable to serve the Government for the above said period, the bond amount has to be credited to the relevant Head of account.

The Security Bonds are governed by clause (c) under exemption under article 57 of schedule of the Indian Stamp Act, 1879 (Central Act II of 1879). Hence the Security Bonds executed need not be stamped.

IX. HEPATITIS - B VACCINATION: -

30. All the Selected candidates for admission to M.P.T course for 2025-2026 session should take Hepatitis – B vaccine and submit a medical certificate from an authorized Medical Officer as proof thereof, to the Head of the Institution at the time of joining. Admission to any Post Graduate course will not be allowed by the Heads of Institutions without the medical certificate. The candidate should take further doses at the prescribed intervals as required.

(b) Candidates should inform the change of Mail address, change of postings etc., immediately to the Selection Committee in writing.

RAGGING:-

- 32. The candidates who join M.P.T Course should not indulge in any kind of agitation / strike / ragging activity inside / outside the college campus during the course of study. Candidates found to be taking part in any such activities mentioned above will be expelled from the course / college, at any point during the course of study and criminal action will be taken against them.
- 33. Candidates who have applied for M.P.T Course are deemed to have read the contents in the Prospectus and agree with all the conditions and clauses and will not have the right to challenge any of the clauses contained in this Prospectus.

- 2. Polaroid photograph are NOT acceptable.
- 3. Photograph must be snapped on or after 1st August 2025
- 4. Photograph must be taken with a placard indicating name of candidate (as in the application) and date of taking photograph.
- 5. In case the name and date are written on the photograph after taking it, the application will be rejected.
- 6. The name and date on the photograph must be clear and legible.
- 7. Photograph should NOT have cap and goggles. Spectacles are allowed.
- 8. One photograph each should be pasted (NOT STAPLED) on Application Form
- 9. Photograph should be attested by a Gazetted Officer / Dean / Principal with a clear stamp.
- 10. Applications not complying with these instructions or with unclear photographs Will be rejected.
- 11. Keep a few identical photographs in reserve for use at the time of Entrance Examination / Admission.
