MAHARASHTRA STATE QUOTA AND UNAIDED PRIVATE / MINORITY COLLEGES:
NEET-UG 2025

1. INTRODUCTION

The Medical Council of India published Gazette dated 23/06/2017. Clause 5A regarding Common Counseling is added. The Added clause 5A is as under:

Common Counseling

- 1.1 There shall be a common counseling for admission to Health Science course in all Government / Corporation / Government Aided / Government Unaided / Minority Institutions on the basis of merit list of the National Eligibility Entrance Test (NEET UG 2025).
- 1.2 The Designated Authority for counseling for the 15% (MBBS/BDS) All India Quota seats of the contributing States shall be the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS, New Delhi).
- 1.3 The Designated Authority for counseling for the 15% (AYUSH Courses) All India Quota seats of the contributing States shall be the as appointed by Ministry of Ayush New Delhi i.e. (AACCC).
- 1.4 In Chapter II under Clause 5 “Selection of Students” sub-clause ‘5A’ (2) and (3) as added vide notification dated 10/03/2017, shall be substituted with the Following: -

Clause 5A (2) Shall be substituted as under:

The Designated Authority for counseling for the 15% all India quota seats of the contributing States and all MBBS seats of Medical Educational institutions of the Central Government, Universities established by an Act of Parliament and the Deemed Universities shall be the Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India.

Clause 5A (3), Shall be substituted as under:

The counseling for admission to MBBS course in a State/Union Territory, including, Medical Educational Institutions established by the State Government, University established by an Act of State/Union Territory Legislature, Trust, Society, Minority Institutions, Municipal Bodies or a company shall be conducted by the State/Union Territory Government.

- 1.5 The Counseling for all admission to MBBS / BDS / BAMS / BHMS / BUMS / BNYS / BPTth / BOTth / BASLP / BP&O Courses in all Health Science Educational Institutions in a State/Union territory, including Health Science Educational Institutions established by the Central Government, State Government, University, Trust, Society / Minority Institutions / Corporations or a Company shall be conducted by the State / Union Territory Government. Such common counseling shall be under the over-all superintendence, direction and control of the State / Union Territory Government.
- 1.6 This procedure is applicable for NEET UG 2025 admissions for the academic year 2025-2026. No promise is implied therein for subsequent years and no expectations should be based on this procedure for future.
- There shall be a single eligibility cum entrance examination namely 'National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test for admission to all Health Science courses' for academic year 2025-26.
 - In order to be eligible for admission to Health Science Courses for a particular academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum marks in 'National Eligibility-Cum-Entrance Test' held for the said academic year, besides obtaining minimum prescribed marks at the qualifying examination as prescribed by respective central council.
 - The reservation of seats for respective categories shall be as per applicable laws prevailing in States / Union Territories. An All-India merit list as well as State-wise merit list of the eligible candidates shall be prepared on the basis of the merit (AIR) in National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test and candidates shall be admitted to Health Science courses from the said lists only.
 - No candidate who has failed to obtain the minimum eligibility marks as prescribed by the respective Central Council shall be admitted to respective course in the said academic year.
 - All admissions to Health Science courses within the respective categories shall be based solely on merit (AIR) in the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test.
 - National Testing Agency shall be the organization to conduct National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test for admission to MBBS/BDS/BAMS/BUMS/BHMS courses.

Accordingly, the **National Testing Agency**, Delhi conducted the National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test for the session 2025-26 on Sunday, 04th May 2025. **The responsibility of the National Testing Agency is limited to the conduct of the entrance examination, declaration of result and providing merit list to the Counselling Authorities.**

Besides MBBS/BDS/BAMS/BHMS/BUMS, the admission to other health Sciences courses i.e BNYS/BPTh/BOTTh/BASLP and BP&O will be filled on the basis of merit list of NEET UG 2025. (Annexure - K)

15% seats in Government, Corporation and Govt.-Aided Medical and Dental Colleges of Maharashtra will be filled by Directorate General of Health Services, New Delhi (DGHS) on the basis of All India NEET Rank as per direction of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Writ Petition No.267 of 2017, order dated: 09/05/2017 and Annexure – “L” Dated: 13/04/2017.

15% seats in Government / Govt.-Aided & Unaided Private / Minority Colleges of AYUSH courses in Maharashtra will be filled by AACCC or as per the directions of AACCC as per NCISM notification dated: 16/02/2022 (Annexure – “DD” - Relevant Pages) and 28/02/2022. (Annexure - “EE” - Relevant Pages).

- 1.7 Instructions in this information brochure are liable to change based on decisions taken by Central Government / National Medical Commission (NMC) / National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) / National Commission for Homeopathy (NCH) / State Government / Competent Authority / Constitutional Authority / Hon'ble Supreme Court and High Court from time to time.
- 1.8 For academic year 2025-2026, online NEET-UG 2025 examination had been conducted by Competent Authority appointed by Government of India, New Delhi.
 - The validity of result of NEET UG 2025 shall be only for current admission session i.e., 2025-26 for MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS, BUMS, BNYS, BPTh, BOTTh, BASLP and BP&O courses, and cannot be carried out for the next session of admission for MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS, BUMS, BNYS, BPTh, BOTTh, BASLP and BP & O courses.
 - **COMPETENT AUTHORITY:** The Commissioner, State CET Cell, Mumbai has been designated as Competent Authority for selection and admissions at:
 - (i) Government / Corporation / Government Aided Colleges under Health Science Courses and (ii) Unaided Private & Minority Colleges under Health Science Courses for the year 2025-26, as per provisions of section 2(e) and section 10(4) of the Act (for Unaided Private & Minority Medical colleges) and Government Resolution No. MED-1015/CR 396/15/Edu-2, Dated: 16/12/2015 (for Government / Corporation Colleges). (Annexure - M)

These admissions will be done on the available seats at disposal of Competent Authority in State Quota Seats of Government / Corporation / Government Aided

/ State Quota seat for Central Government / Unaided Private & Minority Colleges under Health Science Courses from state of Maharashtra. The Competent Authority will supervise and control the selection process by implementing these procedures.

The Competent Authority will issue necessary executive instructions for implementation of these procedures and provide relevant information to be published or communicated. The Competent Authority will declare time-table, details of the date(s) of various procedures relating to admission process, in consultation with Nodal officer.

- **Nodal Officer:** Director of Medical Education and Research, Mumbai will act as Nodal Officer to guide and supervise admission process of MBBS / BDS / BPTTh / BOTTh / BASLP / BP&O and Director of Ayush, Mumbai will act as Nodal Officer to guide and supervise this admission process of BAMS / BHMS / BUMS / BNYS.

2. Application process and provisional Merit list

The Commissioner, State CET CELL, Mumbai will conduct the admission process for all the Health Science courses in the State of Maharashtra. Online applications will be invited from eligible candidate(s) for admission to all Government / Corporation, Private & Minority Colleges. Online application form will be made available on website www.mahacet.org.

2.1 Admission processing Fee: Cost of online application form of NEET-UG 2025 is

- Rs. 1000/- for State quota seats of MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS and BUMS courses and all seats (State quota + Institutional quota) of BNYS, BPTTh, BOTTh, BASLP and BP&O courses.
- Rs 5000/- for Institutional quota seats of MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS and BUMS courses only and
- Rs. 6000/- for both quota of MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS and BUMS courses only. This application fee is non refundable; hence candidates are advised to go through the Information Brochure and ascertain the eligibility. It is sole responsibility of candidate to ascertain eligibility and also online payment of fees within prescribed period, failing which online application will be rejected.

2.2 The provisional State merit list for seats under State quota in Government / Corporation / Government Aided and all the quota seats in Private / Minority colleges will be published on the website of State CET CELL as per constitutional and / or specified reservation claimed by candidate(s).

The list of applicants will be prepared on the basis of information submitted by candidate(s) through online process made available on website www.mahacet.org. The provisional state merit list will be prepared on the basis of the information filled in the registration form and the documents uploaded by the Candidate. The verification of Original Documents shall be done by the admitting college authorities in which the candidate submits her/his documents for admission.

- 2.3 During online process, there will be choice for opting Institutional quota seats (15%) for MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS and BUMS courses at Unaided Private / Minority colleges. The admission process fee (non-refundable) for Institutional quota seats of MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS and BUMS will be Rs. 5000/-. Admission will be on the basis of NEET UG 2025 rank and on All India basis including NRI, OMS & OCI. For admission to Institutional quota seats other than MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS and BUMS courses at Unaided Private / Minority colleges, candidate(s) will have to apply at respective Institute.

3. DEFINITIONS

- a. **“Act”** means the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015);
- b. **“Admission Reporting Institution”** means an institution where the Candidate shall report for confirmation for admission by submission of documents and payment of fees;
- c. **“Application Form”** means the prescribed form to be filled up online or offline by the candidate for admission to the Courses as defined in clause (e);
- d. **“CAP Seats”** means the seats filled in through the Centralized process of admission carried out by the Competent Authority/Commissioner State CET CELL;
- e. **“Courses”** means the Undergraduate Medical Courses or Undergraduate Dental Courses, as the case may be, conducted in the State as per the approval of the MCI & DCI and NCISM (National Commission for Indian System of Medicine), NCH (National Commission for Homeopathy) affiliated to MUHS;
- f. **“Document Verification Centre”** means the city or town declared by the competent authority where the document verification is to be conducted;
- g. **“DCI”** means the Dental Council of India constituted under the Dentists Act, 1948 (16 of 1948);
- h. **“Eligible Candidates”** means the candidates who are eligible for different professional courses as notified by the Government, from time to time, under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act;

- i. **“HSC”** means the Higher Secondary School Certificate (**Standard XII**) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education as per the provisions of the Maharashtra Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Boards Act, 1965 (Mah XLI of 1965) or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;
- j. **“Institutional Quota”** means seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Institution level as declared by the Government or appropriate authority from time to time;
- k. **“inter-se-merit”** means the order of merit in respect of various classes or category of Candidates;
- l. **“Minority Quota”** means seats earmarked for the Minority Community students from within the State of Maharashtra, belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs;
- m. **“MUHS”** means the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences established under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998 (Mah. X of 1999);
- n. **“MCI”** means the Medical Council of India constituted under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956);
- o. **“National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test”** or **“NEET”** means the examination conducted by Central Board of Secondary Education, Delhi for admission to under graduate Medical and Dental Courses.
- p. **“Non-Resident Indian (NRI)”** means, a person who is “not ordinary resident” as defined under sub-section (6) of section 6 of the Income Tax Act, 1961 and has been issued a Non-Resident Indian certificate accordingly by an Indian Mission or Post abroad and includes his child or ward as defined in the Guardians and Wards Act, 1890”.
- q. **“Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)”** means a candidate or a person registered as an Overseas Citizen of India as declared by the Central Government under section 7A of the Citizenship Act 1955, and includes Persons of Indian Origin (PIO).

Explanation—For the purposes of this clause, all the existing Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) card-holders registered under Notification of the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs No. F.No. 26011/04/98- F. I, dated 19th August 2002 and shall now be deemed to be Overseas Citizens of India, (OCI) cardholders by virtue of Notification of Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, No. 25024/9/2014-F.I, dated 9th January 2015.

- r. **“Qualifying Examination”** means the Higher Secondary Certificate (**12th Standard**) or equivalent examination, from an institution situated in the State of Maharashtra with English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology (**Botany and Zoology**) at the time of admission;
- s. **“SSC”** means the Secondary School Certificate (**Standard - X**) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education as per the provisions of the Maharashtra Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Boards Act, 1965 (Mah. XLI of 1965) or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;
- t. **“EWS”** means Economically Weaker Section, include persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SC, ST, DT-A, NT-B, NT-C, NT-D, OBC (Including SBC) & SEBC; and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 800,000/- as per Government resolution of General Administration Department ROD-4019/C.R 31/ 16-A, dated 12 February 2019 and Government Resolution no. MED-1018/C.R 37/19/Edu-2, dated 07th March, 2019. This reservation is subject to Hon’ble Supreme Courts / High Courts decision in W.P (C) No. 961/2021 and related petitions.
- u. **“Specified Reservation”** means Reservation other than constitutional like Female, Hilly area, PWD, Defence and MKB are classified as specified Reservation. During allotment of seat in specified Reservation seat will be filled first.
- v. **“Orphan”** means a child— (i) who is without biological or adoptive parents or legal guardian; or (ii) whose legal guardian is not willing to take, or capable of taking care of the child; as defined in Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) act 2015 and Government Letter no. MED-1018/C.R.201/18/Edu-2, dated 20th June, 2018.
- w. **“OMS”** means candidate who have passed 10th / 12th or both from Outside Maharashtra State and who is not Domicile of Maharashtra.
- x. **“NMC”** means National Medical Commission Act (30 of 2019) shall come into force with effect from 25 day of September 2020 as per notification of Ministry Health and Family Welfare, New Delhi dated 24.09.2020.
- y. **“MCC”** means Medical Counseling Committee.
- z. **“AACCC”** means Ayush Admissions Central Counseling Committee.
- aa. **“NCISM”** means National Commission for Indian System of Medicine.
- bb. **“NCH”** means National Commission for Homeopathy.
- cc. **“SEBC”** means Socially & Educationally Backward Classes.
- dd. **“B.N.Y.S. Course”** means the Bachelor of Naturopathy and Yogic Sciences course conducted in the State as per the approval of the State Government and affiliated to MUHS.

4. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO HEALTH SCIENCE DEGREE COURSES

4.1 The candidate must be an Indian National.

The candidate must be registered with State CET Cell, Mumbai through online application on website of State CET Cell.

4.1.1 Indian Citizen

4.1.2 Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) Candidate will be eligible for Government / Corporation / Government Aided / Private unaided college for academic year 2025-26 provided such candidate has obtained the OCI status before 04/03/2021 and also has passed 10th & 12th from the State of Maharashtra and should be domicile of Maharashtra or staying in state of Maharashtra for minimum period of 10 years. **(As per Annexure – CC and Hon’ble Supreme Court Order in W.P (C) No. 891 of 2021 dated 03/02/2023)**

4.1.3 Eligibility for Institutional Quota (For MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS and BUMS Courses): Any eligible candidate on All India basis can be admitted including Non-Resident Indians (NRI) and Overseas Citizens of India (OCI), as well as Outside Maharashtra candidate (OMS) who had appeared for the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test and declared eligible for admission to **MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS and BUMS Courses** respectively, in accordance with inter-se-merit amongst candidates who apply for institutional quota seats. **These seats will be filled by Competent Authority through CAP.**

(As per Notification No.MED.1016/C.R.69/16/Edu-2 of Medical Education and Drugs Dept., Government of Maharashtra dated 18/04/2017) **(Annexure - S)**, (As per Government of India Gazette F. No. BOA/Regulation/UG/7-10/2021, dated 16/02/2022) **(Annexure - DD)**, (As per Government of India Gazette F. No. 11-76/2021-BUSS (Unani-U.G.Reg.), dated 28/02/2022), **(Annexure - EE)** and (As per Comprehensive Guidelines for Counseling and Admission in Undergraduate (UG-BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) & Postgraduate (PG-MD/MS) courses of Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani & Homoeopathy (ASU&H) dated: 14/10/2022) **(Annexure - GG)**

4.1.4 Eligibility for Institutional Quota (For Courses Other than MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS and BUMS): Any eligible candidate, on All India basis can be admitted including Non-Resident Indians (NRI) and Overseas Citizens of India (OCI), as well as Outside Maharashtra candidate (OMS) who had appeared for the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test and declared eligible for

admission to BPTH, BOTh, BASLP, BP & O & BNYS Courses, in accordance with inter-se-merit amongst candidates who apply for institutional quota seats. These seats will be filled by respective institute by calling application at there spective institutions from all eligible candidates who are registered with State CET cell. (As per Notification No. MED.1016/ C.R.69/16/Edu-2 of Medical Education and Drugs Dept. Government of Maharashtra dated: 13/10/2020)

(Annexure - S)

- 4.2 **Domicile of Candidate:** The Candidates must be Domicile of Maharashtra (Except candidates under clause 4.1.3, 4.1.4, 4.7, 4.8, **Annexure C and E**).
- 4.3 The candidate must be born on or before 31st December 2008 to be eligible for all Health Science Courses. The Birth certificate indicating name of the candidate, Secondary School Certificate i.e. SSC or equivalent examination certificate or School Leaving Certificate endorsing the date of birth will constitute a valid proof.
- 4.4 The candidate must be medically fit and must submit a certificate of medical fitness at the time of Document Verification as per proforma. **(Annexure - H)**
- 4.5 The candidate must have passed the SSC or equivalent examination from an Institution situated in the state of Maharashtra. (Please refer 4.1.3, 4.1.4, 4.7, 4.8, Annexure "C" & Annexure "E" for exception)

Exemption: Candidate who has passed SSC or equivalent examination in 2017 or prior to that, from an institute outside the State of Maharashtra is also eligible to seek admission, provided he has passed HSC or qualifying examination from an institute in the State of Maharashtra and also possess Domicile Certificate issued by the authority, who is competent to issue such certificate in the State of Maharashtra for educational purpose gazette no. MED-1018/C.R. 405/18/Edu-2 dated 20/04/2019.

- 4.6 The candidate must have passed the qualifying examination i.e. Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC/12th Standard) or equivalent examination, from an Institution situated in the State of Maharashtra (Please refer 4.1.3, 4.1.4, 4.7, 4.8, Annexure "C" & Annexure "E" for exception) **with English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology (Botany & Zoology) at the time of document verification.**

4.6.1 Eligibility criteria of Qualifying Examination for various courses

- 4.6.1.1 **For MBBS/BDS/BAMS/BUMS/BHMS:** A candidate belonging to OPEN Category and EWS Category must have obtained not less than 50% (i.e. 150 out of 300) marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together at the HSC (or equivalent) Examination. A candidate

belonging to constitutional reservation, SEBC, constitutional reservation with PWD claim and SEBC with PWD claim must have obtained not less than 40% (i.e. 120 out of 300) marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together at the HSC (or equivalent) Examination. Person with disability (PWD) candidate in General category must secure not less than 45% marks (i.e. 135 out of 300) in Physics, Chemistry & Biology (PCB) taken together at the HSC (or equivalent) Examination or as decided by the respective Central Council from time to time.

4.6.1.2 **For BPT, BOT, BASLP, BP&O & BNYS Courses:** Clause 4.6.1.1 is not applicable. Passing grade at HSC/12th Standard or equivalent examination is however necessary.

4.6.1.3 **For admission to BP&O** candidates who have passed 12th standard examination with Physics, Chemistry, Biology and / or Mathematics are eligible.

4.6.1.4 **For admission to BASLP** candidates who have passed 12th standard examination with Physics, Biology, Chemistry and/or Mathematics and/or Computer Science are eligible.

4.7 Exception for SSC (10th) and HSC (12th) or equivalent examinations: Children of employees of the Government of Maharashtra or its Undertaking:

Children of employees of the Government of Maharashtra or its Undertaking posted on deputation or transfer to a place outside the State of Maharashtra; or transferred from outside to a place situated within the State of Maharashtra:

4.7.1 The children of such employees of Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking who have joined service since beginning at a place situated outside the State of Maharashtra but who have been transferred to a place situated within the State of Maharashtra shall be eligible for admission even though such children might have passed the S.S.C.(Std.X) and/or H.S.C. (Std.XII) or equivalent exam from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra, provided that such an employee of Government of Maharashtra or its Undertaking must have been transferred/deputed at a place of work located in the State of Maharashtra and also must have reported-for-duty i.e. joined the duty before the last date of document verification.

- 4.7.2 The candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at 4.7.1 shall be required to produce the requisite Certificate from the Office at which such an employee of Government of Maharashtra or its Undertaking has reported for duty as a proof that such employee has joined the office and/or reported for duty before the cutoff date for eligibility i.e. at the time of document verification. The certificate should contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting. A copy of transfer order should also be produced at the time of document verification.
- 4.7.3 The children of such employees of Government of Maharashtra or its Undertaking who have been transferred or deputed to a place situated outside the State of Maharashtra or who have returned to the State of Maharashtra after initial transfer/deputation shall be eligible for admission even though such children might have passed the S.S.C. (Std. X) and/or H.S.C. (Std. XII) or equivalent examinations from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra.
- 4.7.4 The candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at 4.7.3 above shall be required to produce the requisite Certificate from the Office at which such an employee of Government of Maharashtra or its Undertaking has reported for duty. The certificate should contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting. A copy of transfer order should also be produced at the time of document verification.

4.8 Exception for SSC (10th) and HSC (12th) or equivalent examinations: Children of employees of Government of India or its Undertaking:

- 4.8.1 The children of the employees of Government of India or its Undertaking shall be eligible for admission even though they might have passed the S.S.C. (Std.X) and/or H.S.C. (Std. XII) or equivalent exam from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra, provided that such an employee of Government of India or its Undertaking must have been transferred from outside State of Maharashtra at a place of work, located in the State of Maharashtra and also must have reported for duty and must be working as on the last date of Document verification at a place located in State of Maharashtra.

- 4.8.2 The candidates belonging to the aforesaid category 4.8.1 shall be required to produce the requisite Certificate from the Office at which such an employee of Government of India or its Undertaking has reported for duty as a proof of the fact that such employee has joined the office and/or reported for duty before the cutoff date for eligibility i.e. at the time of document verification. The certificate should contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting. A copy of transfer order should also be produced at the time of document verification.
- 4.8.3 The Children of the officers of the All India Services, officers of the Central Government Services or its Undertaking and Defence Personnel (including all types of defence services and/or paramilitary forces viz. CRPF, BSF etc.) having domicile certificate of the State of Maharashtra and posted outside the Maharashtra, shall be eligible for admission even though they might have passed the SSC and/ or HSC or equivalent examination from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra (**Annexures: HH & II**).
- 4.8.4 The Candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at 4.8.3 above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such officer of All India Services, Central Government Services or its Undertaking and Defence Personnel has reported for duty, as a proof of the fact that he has joined the office or reported for duty before the cut off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of preference form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation and posting order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting.
- 4.9 **NEET UG 2025 Eligibility for Admission to MBBS/BDS/BAMS/BUMS and BHMS Courses:** A candidate belonging to **OPEN Category & EWS Category** must secure not less than 50 percentile marks in Physics, Chemistry & Biology (PCB) taken together at NEETUG-2025. **A candidate belonging to constitutional reservation, SEBC, constitutional reservation with PWD claim and SEBC with PWD claim** must secure not less than 40 percentile marks in Physics, Chemistry & Biology (PCB) taken together in the NEET UG-2025. Person with disability (PWD) candidate in General category must secure not less than 45 percentile marks in Physics, Chemistry & Biology (PCB) taken together in the NEET UG-2025 or as decided by the respective central council time to time. As per Annexure – **S**, Annexure – **“DD”**, Annexure – **“EE”**, Annexure – **“FF”** and Annexure – **“GG”**.

- 4.10 **NEET UG-2025 Eligibility for Admission to BPTH / BOTH / BASLP / BP&O and BNYS Courses:** A candidate will be selected on the basis of merit in NEET UG-2025 to above stated courses.
- 4.11 **Additional Eligibility for BUMS:** Candidate should have passed SSC (or equivalent) or HSC (or equivalent) examination from the recognized board with *Urdu* or *Arabic* or *Persian Language* as one of the subjects. If a candidate has not taken this subject, such a candidate shall have to study Urdu Language along with Arabic and Mantiq WAFalsafa (*Logic and Philosophy*) as a subject during first Professional BUMS session. (As per **Annexure – “EE”**)
- 4.12 **Cut-off date for the eligibility:** The eligibility of the candidate shall be determined and/or decided for all purposes including for applicability of all these Rules and Regulations by considering the last date of physical document verification as the cut off date. It is made abundantly clear that if a candidate is found ineligible as on the last date of submission of physical document verification, in terms of these Rules and Regulations, and if such an ineligible candidate acquires the requisite eligibility after the aforesaid cutoff date (i.e., the last date of Physical Document Verification), such subsequent acquisition of eligibility will not make an ineligible candidate eligible for any purpose whatsoever, much less for the purpose of admission.
- 4.13 For eligibility to Health Science Courses under Defence (specified) reservation in Government/Corporation/Government Aided Colleges only - Refer **Annexure - C**.
- 4.14 For eligibility to Health Science Courses under Person with Disability (specified) reservation in Government / Corporation / Government Aided Colleges only - Refer **Annexure - D**.
- 4.15 For eligibility to Health Science Courses under Maharashtra Karnataka Border (MKB) area (specified) reservation in Government / Corporation / Government Aided Colleges only - Refer **Annexure - E**.
- 4.16 For Hilly Area seat claim in Government / Government Aided / Corporation, MBBS Colleges only - Refer to conditions/criteria under **Annexure - F**.
- 4.17 For eligibility to Health Science Courses under Orphan (specified) reservation - Refer **Annexure - V**.
- 4.18 All those candidates who have passed the S.S.C. (Std. X) and/or H.S.C. (Std. XII) or equivalent examination/s from an Institution/s situated outside the State of Maharashtra and not Domicile of Maharashtra are **NOT ELIGIBLE** for admission to Health Science courses except, those exempted under Rule 4.1.3, 4.1.4, 4.7, 4.8, Defence & MKB and Institutional quota in private unaided college.
- 4.19 Admission to Health Science Courses is subject to the grant of eligibility by Maharashtra University of Health Science, Nashik.

6. REVALUATION OF HSC OR EQUIVALENT EXAMINATION MARKS

If the marks of a candidate at HSC (or equivalent) examination have been revised on revaluation, the eligibility of the candidate may be altered. The candidate will be permitted to avail the benefit of revised marks upto the last date of physical document verification, subject to his/her representation to that effect to the Competent Authority and production of necessary proof to the satisfaction of the latter.

7. ONLINE REGISTRATION, ADMINISTRATIVE FEES, UPLOADING DOCUMENTS & PREPARATION OF PROVISIONAL MERIT LIST

The Competent Authority shall issue Notice regarding schedule of online registration and submission of online Application from eligible candidates for the preparation of provisional state merit list for admission to undergraduate courses for all seats available with The Competent Authority in State of Maharashtra. Candidate who has appeared for NEET-UG 2025, and desirous for admission to state quota seats of Maharashtra state, should submit online application form for Round 1 and / or Round 3, which will be made available on

website "www.mahacet.org". Candidate can register fresh for Round 3 even if he/she has not registered for Round 1. The candidates will be required to submit a single prescribed online application form (ANNEXURE "A" – Specimen Copy of online application). Candidates submitting this application form will only be considered for subsequent admission process of NEET-UG 2025. The online Application Form will be combined for Government / Corporation / Government Aided and Unaided Private / Minority Institutions and all the seats available under Competent Authority.

7.4 ONLINE DOCUMENT UPLOADING PROCESS & THE LIST OF DOCUMENTS FOR UPLOADING:

- 7.4.1 Online document uploading will be on the same website and on his/her user name and password.
- 7.4.2 Candidate has to upload all the relevant documents on this site, either along with online application or later but before document verification process.

7.5 DOCUMENT VERIFICATION: - The Candidate will have to report at the allotted centre/college with her/his Original Documents for physical document verification. The candidate should report personally (**proxy not allowed**) to the respective allotted Centre/College, for the physical Document Verification.

8. STATE MERIT LIST

The Competent Authority will prepare and publish the State Merit List on website of State CET Cell as per schedule.

9. DISTRIBUTION OF SEATS

9.1 Selection to various health science courses at colleges in State of Maharashtra shall be subject to permission/approval/affiliation from the: (1) Govt. of India; (2) Respective Central Council (NMC/DCI/NCISM/NCH etc.); (3) Govt. of Maharashtra and (4) Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik. The "intake capacity" at a particular college shall be the 'minimum number of seats' permitted by the above said authorities.

Intake capacity of all health sciences institutions / courses and their seat distribution shall be available on website **www.mahacet.org** at a later date.

9.2 DISTRIBUTION OF SEATS- UNDER GOI NOMINEES AND ALL INDIA QUOTA.

9.2.1 NOMINEES OF GOVERNMENT OF INDIA: In Government / Corporation / Government aided colleges.

A specified number of seats i.e. at the Government Medical Colleges (16 seats), Government Dental Colleges (3 seats) and Government Ayurved Colleges (5 seats) in the Maharashtra State have been kept at the

disposal of the Government of India. Seats for nominees of Government of India will be filled up by **The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India, Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi.**

- 9.2.2 **All India quota In Government / Corporation Medical & Dental colleges as well as in the Government, Government aided and Private BAMS, BUMS & BHMS Colleges:** 15% seats of the intake capacity for MBBS & BDS courses at Government & Corporation Medical and Dental Colleges and 15% seats of intake capacity for BAMS, BUMS and BHMS courses at Government, Government Aided and Private colleges will be filled through all India NEET UG 2025 merit. The seats from Government / Corporation Medical & Dental colleges will be filled by medical counseling committee (MCC) and seats from Government, Government aided and Private BAMS, BUMS & BHMS Colleges will be filled as per the directions of the Ayush Admissions Central Counseling Committee (AACCC).

All India Quota (AIQ) seats from Government / Corporation Medical & Dental colleges will not be reverted back to the respective states.

All India quota vacant seats of Ayush courses in Government, Government Aided, Unaided Private & Minority colleges if reverted back from AACCC then it shall be filled by online cap round process.

- 9.2.3 **ICCR Nominated Foreign Candidates for BAMS Course under AYUSH Scholarship Scheme:** As per Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare Dept., letter No. L-20025/4/2012-IC (AYUSH), dt. 10-4-2012 and Govt. of Maharashtra letter No. PGA-1012/ CR-275 /Edu-2, dt. 18-10-2012, total 10 seats are kept reserved for admission to BAMS course for Foreign National candidate sponsored by Govt. of India.

9.3 DISTRIBUTION OF SEATS TO BE ALLOTTED BY THE COMPETENT

AUTHORITY: In Government / Corporation / Government Aided / Private Unaided / Minority colleges, after excluding the seats as provided in Para 9.2.1, 9.2.2 and 9.2.3; the remaining seats will be at the disposal of the Competent Authority & available for candidates for Selection in the following manner:

- 9.3.1 All the seats for MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS, BUMS, BNYS, BPTH, BOTH, BASLP and BP&O courses will be filled by the candidates from the State Merit List.
- 9.3.2 85% seats under State quota will be made available for all the candidates from the State and these seats shall be filled on the basis of NEET UG 2025 Merit list. There shall be constitutional, various specified and female reservations in these seats as per prevailing Rules in this behalf.
- 9.3.3 15% Institutional quota for MBBS/ BDS/ BAMS/ BHMS/ BUMS courses in Unaided Private/Minority colleges shall be filled on the All India basis which shall also include eligible NRI, OCI candidates and candidates from Other than Maharashtra State (OMS). All these seats will be filled by Competent Authority through Online CAP round(s) only. (Please refer Annexure-S, Annexure-DD, Annexure-EE & Annexure-GG)
- 9.3.4 15% Institutional quota for other than MBBS/BDS/BAMS/BHMS/BUMS courses in Private/Minority colleges shall be filled on the All India basis which shall also include eligible NRI, OCI candidates and candidates from Other than Maharashtra State (OMS). These seats will be filled by respective institute by calling application(s) at the respective institutions from all eligible candidates.

9.4 DISTRIBUTION OF CONSTITUTIONAL AND SPECIFIED (PARALLEL) RESERVATION SEATS:

There will be constitutional and specified reservation as per annexure B, C, D, E, F and V.

The candidates desirous of claiming the constitutional and / or specified reservations must have claimed the same in the online application form of NEET UG 2025 for the State of Maharashtra, failing which the claim will not be entertained subsequently.

The distribution of seats at the disposal of Competent Authority will be made by taking into consideration the constitutional reservations and the specified reservations.

9.4.1 CONSTITUTIONAL RESERVATIONS:

The candidate should have claimed the constitutional reservation in the original online application form for the State of Maharashtra. For claiming of category, request for category claim after submission application form will not be granted. During document verification process, if constitutional category claim is found to be incorrect, same will be rectified as per the document(s) available with the candidate. However, fresh claim for constitutional reservation (i.e. from open category to reservation category) will not be considered.

The Caste Certificate and the Caste / Tribe Validity Certificate: If a candidate claiming constitutional reservation in online application form does not submit Caste / Tribe Validity Certificate online or does not produce the document at the time of document verification, then he/she will be automatically considered in open category if otherwise eligible for Open Category.

Candidates belonging to EWS category must have claimed so in his/her online registration form of Maharashtra State quota seats, failing which such a claim will not be entertained subsequently.

Candidate belonging to above Categories (except EWS) should produce Caste Certificate, Caste Validity Certificate and Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (wherever applicable) at the time of document verification process.

However, EWS candidates must produce eligibility certificate issued by the appropriate Authority, Govt. of Maharashtra State (**Annexure "T"**). Please Note: Certificates produced for claiming EWS reservation should be in "**STATE GOVERNMENT FORMAT**" only (as given in **Annexure "T"**). Certificates in

CENTRAL GOVERNMENT FORMATS will NOT BE ACCEPTABLE

Candidate who fails to produce above said certificates will be considered as "**Open Category Candidate**" provided he/she fulfills the eligibility criteria of NEET-UG 2025.

The applicant requests for change in category from Open to reserve once the last date of online application form is over, will be straight away rejected. The candidates belonging to the backward class categories will be required to submit the Caste Certificate / validity at the time of document verification failing, which the category claimed, will not be granted and the candidate will be treated as a general candidate. While applying online all the category candidates must mention their category as SC, ST, DT(A), NT(B), NT(C), NT(D), SEBC, OBC (Including SBC) and EWS.

EWS Reservation: In Government / Government Aided / Corporation / Private Unaided Institutions (excluding Minority Institutions), 10% seats of the available seats under State Quota will be reserved for EWS candidates. (refer **Annexure-T**).

The Caste Validity Certificate:

- The candidates belonging to the following Backward Class categories i.e. SC, ST, DT(A), NT(B), NT(C), NT(D), SEBC and OBC (including SBC) will be required to submit the Caste Validity Certificate at the time of physical Document Verification, failing which the category claimed, will not be granted and the candidates will be treated as a general candidate.
- Candidates belonging to Backward Classes / EWS must have claimed so in his online registration form of Maharashtra State quota seats, failing which such a claim will not be entertained subsequently. Candidate belonging to above Categories (except EWS) should produce Caste Certificate, Caste Validity Certificate and Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (wherever applicable) at the time of document verification process. Candidate who fails to produce above said certificates will be considered as Open Category Candidate provided, he/she fulfills the eligibility criteria of NEET-UG 2025.
 - Candidates belonging to EWS category will be required to produce Eligibility certificate for Economically Weaker Section in prescribed format of state government only (**Annexure – “T”**) and issued for the year 2025-26 by appropriate authority, Government of Maharashtra, at the time of document verification process. Candidate who fails to produce above said certificates will be considered as Open Category Candidate provided he/she fulfills the eligibility criteria of NEET-UG 2025.

Please Note: Certificates produced for claiming EWS reservation should be in **“STATE GOVERNMENT FORMAT”** only (as given in **Annexure “T”**). Certificates in **CENTRAL GOVERNMENT FORMATS** will **NOT BE ACCEPTABLE**.

Non-Creamy Layer Certificate: A candidate belonging to DT(A), NT(B), NT(C), NT(D), SEBC and OBC (including SBC) will be required to produce **Non-Creamy Layer Certificate valid up to 31/3/2026 or later**, at the time of physical document verification and at the time of admission also, failing which claim will not be granted. It is mandatory to produce Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (NCL) at the time document verification; candidates producing NCL after the document verification will be treated as open candidates.

A Candidate belonging to ‘Creamy Layer’ amongst the categories DT-A, NT-B, NT-C, NT-D, SEBC and OBC (including SBC) must note that the provision of reservation is NOT applicable to him/her. A candidate claiming benefit of reservation under these categories will be required to produce Non-Creamy Layer Certificate as specified in the Govt. Resolutions from time to time. The certificate in prescribed Proforma stating that it is valid up to 31/3/2026 or later should be submitted at the time of physical document verification process.

A candidate belonging to backward class from Maharashtra State only, is eligible for claiming seat under reserved category. All applications for change in category from open to reserve after the declaration of provisional merit list will be straight way rejected.

9.4.2 Inter-se for vacant constitutional reserve seats: The seats remaining vacant from the categories SC, ST, DT(A), NT(B), NT(C), NT(D), SEBC & OBC (including SBC) will be filled from among the reserve candidates as per following groups:

GROUP - I

- (i) Scheduled Castes and Schedule Caste converted to Buddhism (S.C.)
- (ii) Scheduled Tribes including those living out-side specified area (S.T.)

GROUP - II

- (i) Vimukta Jati (DT(A))
- (ii) Nomadic Tribes (NT(B))

GROUP - III

- (i) Nomadic Tribes (NT(C))
- (ii) Nomadic Tribes(NT(D))
- (iii) Other Backward Classes (OBC) including SBC

If the seats still remain vacant then these seats will be filled by Inter-se merit from the above three combined common group of reserve candidates.

If the seats still remain vacant then these seats will be filled by Inter-se merit among the candidate of the common state merit list.

9.4.3 The seat(s) remaining vacant from SEBC and EWS category will be allotted to general category candidates.

9.4.4 Children of Defence personnel (DEF): (Refer Annexure - C)

The candidate should have claimed the Defence Category Claim in the original online application form. Request for Defence category claim after submission application form will not be granted.

The seats reserved for Defence category candidates will be filled on the basis of State Merit List. In the event of non-availability of candidate in any of the defence category, the vacancies that have remained unfilled will be filled by inter-se merit of the candidates from remaining two defence categories. Minimum eligibility criteria for defence quota seats shall be as per open merit candidate for selection. As Defence quota is specified reservation seat of Defence quota will be allotted first.

9.4.5 Person with Disability (PWD) Quota: The candidate should have claimed the Person with Disability (PWD) quota reservation in the original Online application form. Request for PWD category claim after submission of application form will not be granted. The parallel constitutional reservation will be applied for PWD quota seats. The eligibility under PWD quota as prescribed by respective central Council from time to time will be applicable.

As per Medical Council of India, New Delhi amendment notification No: MCI-34(41)/2018-Med/170045, dated 5th Feb 2019, CCIM Notification F.No 24-14/2018 (UG Regulation), dated 18/06/2019 and CCH Notification No.12-11/2010-CCH(Pt.II)(1), dated 02/08/2019, Five percent (5%) seats of annual sanctioned intake capacity shall be filled up by candidates with specified benchmark disabilities contained in the schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, as per **Annexure – D**. Constitutional reservation will be applied parallelly within PWD quota seats.

The specified disability categories as mentioned in the rights of persons with Disability Act 2016 are as follows.

1. Physical disability
 2. Intellectual disability
 3. Mental behavior disability
 4. Disability caused due to chronic illness
 5. Multiple disabilities
1. Candidate should mark as PWD in the online application form, failing which claim will not be granted. Candidate is required to submit the proof of his/her disability by way of a certificate issued by certificate issuing authority in the year 2025.
 2. Such a candidate will be required to undergo medical examination at any one of the under mentioned Disability Assessment Board, constituted at:

The Medical Board after ascertaining his/her disability must be satisfied that the candidate is physically fit to undergo the course despite his/her disability. The PWD certificate issued by Medical Board other than mentioned in above table will not be held valid for the purpose of admission in Health Science Course.

- Candidate is required to submit the proof of his/her disability by way of a certificate (issued in year 2025) in prescribed proforma (Annexure "D") from the authorities stated above. These PWD quota seats will be distributed in State level. Any seat remaining vacant will be reverted back to respective category. For filling unfilled PWD quota seats, no fresh preference(s) will be called from the candidates. These seats will be added to the seat matrix of the state in respective category and allotted as per the preferences (choices) already exercised by the eligible candidate(s) during online preference filing system. AS PWD quota is specified reservation, seats of PWD quota will be allotted first.

The candidate must satisfy other conditions of eligibility as prescribed in NEET UG 2025 brochure for selection to MBBS/BDS/BAMS etc. Courses as prescribed for respective course.

9.4.6 Maharashtra-Karnataka disputed border area residents (MKB) Quota:(Refer Annexure-E)

The candidate should have claimed the MKB Quota reservation in the original online application form. Request for MKB quota claim after submission application form will not be granted.

Minimum eligibility criteria shall be as per open merit candidate for selection. If the seat(s) from MKB quota remains vacant, they will be filled in from Open category as they are carved out from the same category. MKB quota is specified reservation, seat of MKB quota will be allotted first.

9.4.7 Hilly Area (HA) Reservation: The candidate should have claimed the Hilly area reservation in the original Online application form. Request for Hilly area reservation claim after submission application form will not be granted.

As per G.R. No.MED-1003/CR 641/03/Edu-2, dated 16/3/2004, 3% seats at Government / Government Aided / Corporation Medical colleges (MBBS course only) are reserved for the candidates from Hilly area. These seats will be distributed uniformly at State level. There will be constitutional reservation and female reservation. Any seat remaining vacant will be reverted back to State quota in respective category. For filling unfilled H.A. quota seats, no fresh preference(s) will be called from the candidates. These seats will be added to the seat matrix of the state quota in respective category and allotted as per the preferences (choices) already exercised by the eligible candidate(s) during online preference filing process. Hilly area quota is specified reservation; seat of Hilly area quota will be allotted first. **(Refer Annexure – F)**

9.4.8 Orphan Reservation: One percent of available seats are reserved for Orphan Category Candidates. The candidate should have claimed the Orphan Quota reservation in the original online application form. Request for Orphan Quota reservation claim after submission of application form will not be granted. Constitutional reservation will be applied parallelly within Orphan Quota seats. **(Refer Annexure – V)**

9.4.9 RESERVATION FOR FEMALE CANDIDATES:

30% seats at the disposal of the Competent Authority shall be reserved for female candidates in all the courses. This reservation shall be for all the categories like SC, ST, DT(A), NT(B), NT(C), NT(D), SEBC, OBC (Including SBC), EWS, General, HA, MKB & DEF and will be operated in parallel. Female Candidate will be first allotted female quota seats after exhausting female quota seat then female candidate will be allotted general seat as per merit. If requisite numbers of female candidates are not available, then these seats shall be offered to male candidates of that category.

9.4.10 Criteria For Distribution of Seats for Minority Institutions:

All the seats at Minority College will be filled by the respective minority candidate from within the State of Maharashtra and if particular Minority candidate is not available then the remaining seats will be filled by general candidates.

9.4.11 Institutional Quota Seats:

In private unaided institutions there shall be 15% institutional quota seats for MBBS/BDS/BAMS/BHMS/BUMS courses which shall be filled through CAP round(s) on All India basis including NRI/OCI/OMS. The institutional quota seats for courses other than MBBS/BDS/BAMS/BHMS/BUMS shall also be 15% of the intake capacity, which shall be filled by concerned institute by calling application from candidates on All India basis including NRI/OCI/OMS from the list of eligible candidates through Inter-se merit.

9.4.12 There will be 25% seats of the total intake capacity reserved for constitutional reservation category from Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions as notified under sub section (1) of section 5 of Maharashtra Act No XXX of 2006, dated 01/08/2006.

9.4.13 In all unaided private institutions, all the seats will be distributed uniformly at State level. There shall be 30% female reservation. There shall not be any other specified reservation.

9.4.14 Intake capacity of all health science institutions / courses and their seat distribution shall be made available on website “www.mahacet.org” at a later date.

9.4.15 Seats left unfilled in an academic year, shall not be carried forward to the next or subsequent academic year.

9.4.16 The validity of all India rank based on result of NEET UG 2025 shall be only applicable for current admission session i.e academic year 2025-26 for any Health Science courses and cannot be carried forward for the next session of admission for Health Science Courses.

10. ONLINE PREFERENCE FILLING PROCESS AND SELECTION PROCESS BY CAP COMPUTERISED ROUND: The details of State Quota seat matrix available for counseling and Schedule of online preference form filling process will be published in due course on the website “www.mahacet.org”.

10.1 Admission to various Health Sciences courses for academic year 2025-26, will be done online by way of filling of the online “Preference Form” on www.mahacet.org (**Annexure- W**). There will not be any offline Preference Form filling process. Eligible merit listed candidates can fill online preference / choice form for Round 1, Round 2, Round 3 and Online stray vacancy round separately.

The selection of the candidates will be made on the basis of preferences given by the candidate. Filling of Online Preferences (choices) will be available for all those candidates who appeared for online/physical document verification and are found to be eligible. List of eligible candidates will be published as provisional state merit list. Seat allocation shall be made centrally at a later date on the basis of NEET UG 2025 merit in the State of Maharashtra, and preferences exercised by the candidate. For allocation of seat(s) during Round 1, Round 2, Round 3 and Online stray vacancy round (s), preferences filled for Round 1, Round 2, Round 3 and Online stray vacancy round will be considered respectively and preferences exercised by the candidate for each group separately as mentioned in Rule No. 10.3.

- 10.2 **ONLINE PREFERENCE FILLING PROCESS:** There will be preference form filling for Round 1, Round 2, Round 3 and Online Stray Vacancy Round separately. For each round candidate can fill online preference form multiple times before clicking submit button. Once submit button is clicked, there is no provision to change the preference(s). These preference(s) filled for each round will be used for selection of respective round only. Online preferences filled for Online Stray Vacancy Round will be used for subsequent Online Stray Vacancy Round(s) (if any) of Govt/Corporation/Government aided Institutions only. For Unaided Private / Minority Institutions of courses other than MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS & BUMS, the seats remaining vacant after Online Stray Vacancy Round will be filled by respective institute through Institutional Level Round.

- 10.3 Online preference form filling process and selection process will be divided in three groups and schedule will be notified by Competent Authority in due course.

Group A: For MBBS/ BDS courses,

Group B: For BAMS/BHMS/BUMS courses

Group C: For BNYS/BPTH/BOTH/BP&O/BASLP courses

(The selection process for Group 'C' is similar to Group 'B').

There shall be four or more rounds of selection of candidates, depending on the availability of vacant seats. The selection will be on the basis of merit and the preferences submitted by the candidates for respective round. The choices of courses and colleges, once entered online for the respective round, shall be final and irrevocable. This final data shall be used in selection process of respective round, for the admission to first year Health Science Courses for the academic year 2025-2026.

10.4 **The College code** is a four-digit number with **S or N suffix**, specific for each college & course combination. Candidate should fill minimum one preference and maximum as desired. It is not compulsory to fill all Preferences. Suffix **S** indicates State quota (All seats of Government / Government Aided / Corporation Colleges & 85% each in Private Colleges / Minority Colleges), and **N** suffix indicates 15% Institutional quota in Private Colleges / Minority Colleges. The candidate should verify the fee structure of State / Institutional Quota Seats prescribed by Fee Regulating Authority, before filling online preferences. The **FEE STRUCTURE** of Private and Minority medical colleges is available on website - www.mahafrs.org.

Note 1: Candidate who have applied for Institutional quota (for MBBS/BDS/BAMS/BHMS/BUMS Course) in online application form by paying requisite fee (Rs. 5000/- as per clause 7.1 of this brochure) can only fill preference for institutional seats with suffix '**N**'.

Note 2: Candidate who is NRI or ward of NRI must claim NRI Status in online application form and can give preferences with suffix '**N**' only. However, such candidates are not permitted for state quota seats hence suffix '**S**' for state quota seat will not be available for them.

Note 3: Candidates who are Not NRI or ward of NRI but other wise eligible for 85% state quota can also give preferences for Institutional quota seats in preference form with suffix '**N**', provided such a candidate apply for Institutional quota seat in online application form by paying requisite fee (Rs 5000/- as per clause 7.1 of this brochure). However, such candidate who wants to claim State quota as well as Institutional quota will have to pay Rs. 1000/- for State quota and additional Rs. 5000/- for Institutional quota (as per clause 7.1 of this brochure), such a Non NRI candidates will have to pay fees fixed for Institutional quota.

Note 4: Candidates who are OMS (Other Than Maharashtra State) can apply for Institutional quota seats only in online application form by paying requisite fee (Rs. 5000/- as per clause 7.1 of this brochure) and can only fill preference for institutional seats with suffix '**N**'.

- 10.5 Candidate should fill his most preferred subject and college code as preference no. 1 followed by his next choice as preference no. 2 and so on in each group separately. While filling the course and college codes, four-digit number with specific suffix should be entered in five boxes of NEET-UG 2025 Online preference form.
- 10.6 Candidate must be very careful while filling the online preference form. Candidate can fill minimum one preference or any desired number of preferences for NEET-UG 2025.
- 10.7 If a candidate does not give preference for a code for particular course and particular college (Government / Corporation / Private); then it means that he / she is not interested / desiring to take that Undergraduate Health Science seat. Candidate should note that there will be no change / addition / deletion in his / her list of preferences at later date / stage for respective round.
- 10.8 The candidates may kindly note while filling the preference form that NEET UG 2025 merit list will be operated from NEET UG 2025 Rank number 1 onwards in each round of selection for each group separately.
 - 10.8.1 Based on preferences given, the seat will be allotted on merit and the allotment will be displayed on the website of State CET CELL "www.mahacet.org".
 - 10.8.2 **Logic of allotment of seat for NEET UG 2025:**
 - i. General category seat will be allotted to any candidate as per merit.
 - ii. The reserve category candidate will be allotted general category or reserve category seat as per rule of Ear-marking.
 - iii. For specified quota (PWD, DEF, HILLY AREA, WOMEN, ORPHAN) the seat in the respective specified quota will filled first. The general seat will be allotted to such candidate after exhausting specified quota seat.

11. Selection process: Candidates as per allotment should report along with all original certificates and a set of attested photocopies of each document as per NEET UG 2025 brochure, at allotted college as per the schedule. The Dean/Principal should verify all the original documents before finalizing the admission. Candidate will have to compulsorily join the college and course so allotted, within prescribed period as per schedule by completing the requisite formalities. i.e., submission of all original documents and a set of attested photocopies of each document as per the list given in NEET-UG 2025 Information Brochure and payment of requisite fees in respective institution.

**11.1 Selection Scheme: For Group A (MBBS/BDS Courses)
(Refer Table No. 2 – Scheme of admission for State Quota seats NEET-UG 2025)**

11.1.1 For selection to MBBS/BDS course, candidates who have cleared NEET-UG 2025 are eligible. All such candidates will have to register during the stipulated period as per the Notice for NEET-UG 2025 admission process for the State Quota seats available with Commissioner State CET Cell. Candidate can register before Round 1 and Round 3.

11.1.2 There shall be four or more rounds of selection of candidates depending on the availability of vacant seats during subsequent round(s). The selection will be on the basis of merit and the preferences submitted by the candidate. Candidate will fill fresh choices for Round 1, Round 2, Round 3 and online stray vacancy round separately. The choices filled for each round will be valid for that round only. Choices filled for respective round(s) will not be carried forward for any subsequent round(s) except choice(s) filled for Online stray vacancy round, which will be carried forward for subsequent online Stray Vacancy round(s) if any. While filling the online preference(s), candidates may kindly note that NEET-UG 2025 merit list will be operated from NEET-UG 2025 rank number one onwards in each round of selection. The online data of preferences of all candidates will be centrally processed at a later date for the selection of candidates for MBBS/BDS Courses.

11.1.3 The list of candidates selected for MBBS/BDS Courses shall be displayed at the website i.e. **www.mahacet.org** as per schedule. List of selected candidates will also be sent to all concerned colleges. The candidate will have to report at the allotted college with his/her original documents for physical verification and admission. The candidate should report personally (**proxy not allowed**) to the respective allotted college, they should pay requisite fee and submit all original document at respective allotted college.

11.1.4 All the candidates to whom a seat has been allotted in the 1st round on the basis of Merit-cum-Preference will have to join the college and course so allotted, within prescribed period as per schedule by completing the requisite formalities (i.e. submission of all original document and a set of attested photocopies of each documents as per

the list given in NEET-UG 2025 Information Brochure and payment of requisite fees in respective institution) otherwise his/her selection will stand cancelled for that round.

11.1.5 Status Retention: In case if a candidate to whom a seat has been allotted in the first round and who has joined the college accordingly, is satisfied with the allotment, such a candidate must submit a Status-Retention Form (**Annexure-J**) in the given format on or before prescribed date with the Dean/Principal of the College where such a seat has been allotted to such a candidate. The Dean/Principal of every Medical / Dental College in which admissions are so made in terms of these rules, may appoint an appropriate Officer to receive such Status Retention Forms. Upon receipt of such Status Retention Forms, an acknowledgement in writing shall be issued immediately to the concerned candidate(s) by the officer appointed by the Dean/Principal of the concerned college. It is mandatory for every such candidate submitting a Status Retention Form to insist for issuance of acknowledgement thereof and to preserve such acknowledgement till the present admission process is finally concluded. In absence of such an acknowledgement, the claim of submission of Status Retention Form within the prescribed time shall not be entertained. Candidate who has submitted status retention forms will not be eligible for remaining subsequent round(s).

It is hereby made clear that the period provided for submission of Status Retention Form is crucial and vital. This period shall not be extended for any reason whatsoever. Submission of the Status Retention Form is an irrevocable and irreversible act for the candidate submitting such Status Retention Form. It is made clear that under no circumstances whatsoever, a candidate will be allowed to submit a Status Retention Form after the aforesaid last date. Under any circumstances whatsoever, a candidate who has submitted a Status Retention Form shall not be allowed to withdraw the same. All the candidates therefore, should take the note of this before submission of such a Status Retention Form.

Names of all the candidates who have submitted the Status Retention Form as above within the prescribed time and the seats occupied by

them will be removed out of consideration for the remaining admission process for academic year 2025-26. Candidate who has joined during Round1 and filled Status Retention form will be considered as Status Retention during further Rounds.

All the institutions should inform the joining of the candidates and vacancies arising due to non-joining of the candidates and cancellations/status retention at their institutions after the last date of reporting of respective rounds, immediately to Maharashtra State CET Cell through online College feedback module.

The academic year will start as per the guidelines from NMC/DCI.

11.1.6 CAP Round1 Process:

11.1.6.1 If the candidate joins his/her Round1 seat and wants to upgrade his/her allotted seat, then he/she shall NOT fill Status Retention Form and will have to fill fresh choice(s) for Round 2.

11.1.6.2 If a Candidate joins and is satisfied with the seat allotted in Round1 and is not willing for up-gradation in Round2, he/she can fill Status Retention Form. Such a candidate will not be considered for any of the further round(s) during the admission process of NEET-UG 2025. However, such a candidate can resign from the allotted seat before the prescribed/stipulated date and such a candidate will be eligible for Round 2.

11.1.6.3 If the candidate is selected in Round 1 of counseling and does not report at the allotted institute, such a candidate will be eligible for Round 2. No new registration is required. Such a candidate may participate again in Round 2 after logging in with their earlier Registration details and filling fresh preference(s). His/her selection of Round 1 stands cancelled. The seat so allotted to such a candidate who does not join, will be presumed to be a vacant seat as on the last date of joining and from the next date after the date set out as the last date for joining the college in terms of such allotment. Such a vacant seat will be allotted in Round 2 of the admission process.

11.1.7 CAP Round2 Process:

11.1.7.1 Available Seats for Round 2:

- Seats not allotted during Round 1.
- Seats vacant due to non joining / cancellation by candidate(s) allotted in Round 1.
- Seats available due to upgradation of candidate(s), who have been allotted during Round 1 and joined the seat.

11.1.7.2 Following types of Candidates are eligible for seat allotment in Round 2:

- Registered candidates who did not fill choices in Round 1.
- Registered candidates who participated in Round1 but did not get any seat allotted in Round 1.
- Registered candidates, whose seat allotted in Round 1 got cancelled during the document verification due to his/her invalid/wrong claim on reporting for admission to the selected Institute, but candidate is otherwise eligible for selection with change in the invalid/wrong claim. For such a candidate, selection during first round will not be valid and he/she will be eligible only on available seats during second round with corrected claim.
- Candidates who have reported/joined at allotted institute during the joining period of Round 1 of allotment and did not fill Status Retention Form.
- Candidate who does not join the allotted seat during Round 1.
- Candidate who has joined and resigned upto the last date of joining Round 1.

11.1.7.3 Candidate will have to fill fresh choices for Round 2. **Round 1 choices will be considered as null & void.** If a candidate is not interested to participate in Round 2, he/she should not fill preferences for Round 2 and such a candidate who has joined during Round 1, will have his/her Round 1 seat allotted status.

11.1.7.4 **The allotment of seat for Round 2 will be as per the merit and preference(s) filled by the candidates for Round 2.**

- If a candidate joined during Round 1, is upgraded in Round 2 (as per his/her preference(s) submitted during Round 2), his/her allotted seat of Round 1 will be available in Round 2 and allotted as per merit in the same round.
- If a candidate joined during Round 1 and is not upgraded in Round 2 (i.e. no seat is allotted during Round 2), will have his/her Round 1 seat allotted status
- Candidate allotted a seat during Round 2, if does not join the allotted seat, such a candidate will be eligible for Round 3 only after fresh registration as per rule no. 7.1.
- If the candidate joins his/her Round 2 seat and wants to upgrade his/her allotted seat, then he/she shall NOT fill Status Retention Form and will have to fill fresh choice(s) for Round 3.
- If a Candidate joins and is satisfied with the seat allotted in Round 2 and is not willing for up-gradation in Round 3, he/she can fill Status Retention Form.

11.1.7.5 Following types of Candidates are not eligible for seat allotment in Round 2:

- Candidates who have joined Round 1 allotted seat and filled Status Retention Form.
- Candidates who have not filled fresh preferences for Round 2.

11.1.7.6 If a candidate is selected during Round 2, he/she will have to join the college / seat allotted during second round. After joining the allotted institute in Round 2 the candidate will be eligible for upgradation in Round 3 as per merit.

11.1.7.7 If a candidate does not join the selected seat during Round 2, he/she will be eligible for further round(s) of selection only after registration again for Round 3 by paying online registration fee as per rule no. 7.1.

11.1.8 CAP Round 3 Process:

11.1.8.1 Available Seats for Round 3:

- Seats not allotted during Round 2.
- Seats vacant due to non-joining / cancellation by candidate(s) allotted in Round 1 or Round 2.

11.1.8.2 Following types of Candidates are eligible for seat allotment in Round 3:

- Registered candidates who did not fill choices in Round 1 & Round 2.
- Candidates who are joined in Round 2 but did not fill Status Retention Form.
- Registered candidates who participated in Round 1 & Round 2 but did not get any seat allotted in Round 1 & Round 2.
- Candidates who have registered in Round 3.

11.1.8.3 Candidate will have to fill fresh preferences for Round 3. **All previous preferences will be considered as null & void.** Candidate(s) selected during Round 3 will have to join the allotted college / seat within the prescribed period as per schedule. It is mandatory for the candidate to join the allotted seat in Round 3.

11.1.8.4 Candidates not eligible for Round 3:

- Candidates who have joined seat up to Round 2 and filled Status Retention Form

11.1.8.5 After the allotment of seat in Round 3 the candidate will not be eligible to participate in any further rounds of State Counseling Process. Names of such candidates will be informed to MCC.

11.1.9 Subsequent Round(s):

After Round 3, subsequent Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round(s) will be conducted if seat(s) remain vacant.

11.1.9.1 Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round Process:

Available Seats for Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round:

- Seats not allotted during Round 3.
- Seats vacant due to non-joining of candidate(s) allotted in Round 3

Eligible Candidates:

- Candidates who have registered & filled online preference form previously but not been allotted a seat till Round 3.

Candidates not eligible:

- Candidates who have joined seat in Round 1, Round 2 and/or allotted a seat in Round 3.
- Candidates who have joined seat in Round 1, Round 2 and/or allotted a seat in Round 3 of All India Quota seats.

Note –

- No new registration will be done for this Round.
- **Candidate will have to fill fresh choices for CAP Online Stray Vacancy Round. Round 3 choices will be considered as null & void.**
- Allotment of seat will be done Online by running software.
- There will be no institutional level round for any seats remaining vacant after Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round Process. (As per NMC circular dated 24/07/2023 - Annexure - KK)

11.2 Selection Scheme: Group B (For BAMS/BUMS/BHMS courses)

- 11.2.1 For selection to BAMS/BUMS/BHMS courses, candidates who have cleared NEET-UG 2025 are eligible. All such candidates will have to register during the stipulated period as per the Notice for NEET-UG 2025 admission process for the State Quota seats available with Commissioner State CET Cell. Candidate can register before Round 1 and Round 3
- 11.2.2 There shall be four or more rounds of selection of candidates depending on the availability of vacant seats during subsequent round(s). The selection will be on the basis of merit and the preferences submitted by the candidate. Candidate will fill fresh choices for Round 1, Round 2, Round 3 and Online Stray Vacancy Round separately. The choices filled for each round will be valid for that round only. Choices filled for respective round(s) will not be carried forward for any subsequent round(s) except choice(s) filled for Online stray vacancy round, which will be carried forward for subsequent online Stray Vacancy round(s) if any. While filling the online preference(s), candidates may kindly note that NEET-UG 2025 merit list will be operated from NEET-UG 2025 rank number one onwards in each round of selection. The online data of preferences of all candidates will be centrally processed at a later date for the selection of candidates for BAMS / BUMS / BHMS Courses.

- 11.2.3 The list of candidates selected for BAMS/BUMS/BHMS Courses shall be displayed at the website i.e. **www.mahacet.org** as per schedule. List of selected candidates will also be sent to all concerned colleges. The candidate will have to report at the allotted college with his/her original documents for physical verification and admission. The candidate should report personally **(proxy not allowed)** to the respective allotted college, they should pay requisite fee and submit all original document at respective allotted college.
- 11.2.4 All the candidates to whom a seat has been allotted in the 1st Round on the basis of Merit-cum-Preference will have to join the college and course so allotted, within prescribed period as per schedule by completing the requisite formalities (i.e. submission of all original document and a set of attested photocopies of each documents as per the list given in NEET-UG 2025 Information Brochure and payment of requisite fees in respective institution) otherwise his/her selection will stand cancelled for that round.
- 11.2.5 **Status Retention:** In case if a candidate to whom a seat has been allotted in the first round and who has joined the college accordingly, is satisfied with the allotment, such a candidate must submit a Status-Retention Form (**Annexure - J**) in the given format on or before prescribed date with the Dean/Principal of the College where such a seat has been allotted to such a candidate. The Dean/Principal of every Institute in which admissions are so made in terms of these rules, may appoint an appropriate Officer to receive such Status Retention Forms. Upon receipt of such Status Retention Forms, an acknowledgement in writing shall be issued immediately to the concerned candidate(s) by the officer appointed by the Dean/Principal of the concerned college. It is mandatory for every such candidate submitting a Status Retention Form to insist for issuance of acknowledgement thereof and to preserve such acknowledgement till the present admission process is finally concluded. The academic year will start as per the guidelines from concerned Central Council.

11.2.6 CAP Round 1 Process:

11.2.6.1 If the candidate joins his/her Round 1 seat and wants to upgrade his/her allotted seat, then he/she shall NOT fill Status Retention Form and will have to fill fresh choice(s) for Round 2.

11.2.6.2 If a Candidate joins and is satisfied with the seat allotted in Round 1 and is not willing for up-gradation in Round 2, he/she can fill Status Retention Form. Such a candidate will not be considered for any of the further round(s) during the admission process of NEET-UG 2025. However, such a candidate can resign from the allotted seat before the prescribed/stipulated date. Such a candidate will be eligible for Round 2 & Round 3.

11.2.6.3 If the candidate is selected in Round 1 of counseling and does not report at the allotted institute, this will be considered as 'free exit' (option available only in Round 1 & Round 2). No new registration is required. However, such a candidate may participate again in Round 2 & Round 3 after logging in with their earlier Registration details and filling fresh preference(s). His/her selection of Round 1 stands cancelled. The seat so allotted to such a candidate who does not join,

will be presumed to be a vacant seat as on the last date of joining and from the next date after the date set out as the last date for joining the college in terms of such allotment. Such a vacant seat will be allotted in Round 2 of the admission process.

11.2.7 CAP Round 2 Process:

11.2.7.1 Available Seats for Round 2:

- Seats not allotted during Round 1.
- Seats vacant due to non-joining / cancellation by candidate(s) allotted in Round 1.
- Seats available due to up-gradation of candidate(s), who have been allotted during Round 1 and joined the seat.

11.2.7.2 Following types of Candidates are eligible for seat allotment in Round 2:

- Registered candidates who did not fill choices in Round 1.
- Registered candidates who participated in Round 1 but did not get any seat allotted in the 1st Round.
- Registered candidates, whose seat allotted in 1st Round got cancelled during the document verification due to his/her invalid/wrong claim on reporting for admission to the selected Institute, but candidate is otherwise eligible for selection with change in the invalid/wrong claim. For such a candidate, selection during first round will not be valid and he/she will be eligible only on available seats during 2nd Round with corrected claim.
- Candidates who have reported/joined at allotted institute during the joining period of Round 1 of allotment and did not fill Status Retention Form.
- Candidate who does not join the allotted seat during Round 1.
- Candidate who has joined and resigned upto the last date of joining Round 1.

11.2.7.3 Candidate will have to fill fresh choices for Round 2. **Round 1 choices will be considered as null & void.** If a candidate is not interested to participate in Round 2, he/she should not fill preferences for Round 2 and such a candidate who has joined during Round 1, will have his/her Round 1 seat allotted status.

11.2.7.4 The allotment of seat for Round 2 will be as per the merit and preference(s) filled by the candidates for Round 2.

- If a candidate joined during Round 1, is upgraded in Round 2 (as per his/ her preference(s) submitted during Round2), his/her allotted seat of Round 1 will be available in Round 2 and allotted as per merit in the same round.
- If a candidate joined during Round 1 and does not get upgraded in Round 2 (i.e. no seat is allotted during Round 2), he/she will retain allotted seat of Round 1.

11.2.7.5 Following types of Candidates are not eligible for seat allotment in Round 2:

- Candidates who have joined Round 1 allotted seat and filled Status Retention Form.
- Candidates who have not filled fresh preferences.

11.2.7.6 If a candidate is selected during Round 2, he/she will have to join the college / seat allotted during second round. After joining the allotted institute in Round 2 & not filled status retention, the candidate will be eligible to participate in further round(s) of State Counseling Process.

11.2.7.7 If a candidate does not join the selected seat during Round 2, he/she will be eligible for further round(s) of selection only after registration again for Round 3 by paying online registration fee as per rule no. 7.1

11.2.8 CAP Round 3 Process:

11.2.8.1 Available Seats for Round 3:

- Seats not allotted during Round 2.
- Seats vacant due to non-joining / cancellation by candidate(s) allotted in Round 2.

11.2.8.2 Following types of Candidates are eligible for seat allotment in Round 3:

- Registered candidates who did not fill choices in Round 1 & Round 2.
- Registered candidates who participated in Round 1 & Round 2 but did not get any seat allotted in Round 1 & Round 2.
- Candidates allotted and joined seat in Round 1 / Round 2 & not filled Status Retention.
- Candidates who have registered in Round 3.

11.2.8.3 Candidate will have to fill fresh preferences for Round 3. All previous preferences will be considered as null & void.

11.2.8.4 Candidates not eligible for Round 3:

- Candidates who have joined seat in Round 1 / Round 2 of State Quota seats and filled Status Retention form.
- Candidates who have been allotted a seat in Round 3 of All India Quota seats.

If a candidate is allotted a seat during Round 3 he/she will have to join the college / seat allotted during that round and will not be eligible for subsequent round(s) of State Counseling Process.

11.2.9 Subsequent Round(s):

After Round 3, subsequent Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round(s) will be conducted if seat(s) remain vacant.

11.2.9.1 Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round Process:

Available Seats for Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round(s):

- Seats not allotted during Round 3.
- Seats vacant due to non-joining of candidate(s) allotted in Round 3

Eligible Candidates:

- Candidates who have registered & filled online preference form previously but not been allotted a seat till Round 3.

Candidates not eligible:

- Candidates who have joined seat in Round 1, Round 2 and/or allotted a seat in Round 3.
- Candidates who have joined seat in Round 1, Round 2 and/or allotted a seat in Round 3 of All India Quota seats.

Note –

- No new registration will be done for this Round.
- **Candidate will have to fill fresh choices for CAP online stray vacancy round(s). Round 3 choices will be considered as null & void.**
- Allotment of seat will be done Online by running software.
- There will be no institutional level round for any seats remaining vacant after Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round Process. (As per National Commission for Indian System of Medicine & National Commission for Homeopathy, New Delhi: Directive for Counseling & Admission in Undergraduate (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) Courses (Annexure - MM)

11.3 Selection Scheme: Group C (For BNYS / BPTH / BOTH / BASLP and BP&O courses)

- 11.3.1 For selection to BNYS / BPTH / BOTH / BASLP & BP&O courses, candidates who have cleared NEET-UG 2025 are eligible. All such candidates will have to register during the stipulated period as per the Notice for NEET-UG 2025 admission process for the State Quota seats available with Commissioner State CET Cell. Candidate can register before Round 1 and Round 3
- 11.3.2 There shall be four or more rounds of selection of candidates depending on the availability of vacant seats during subsequent round(s). The selection will be on the basis of merit and the preferences submitted by the candidate. Candidate will fill fresh choices for Round 1, Round 2, Round 3 and online stray vacancy round separately. The choices filled for each round will be valid for that round only. Choices filled for respective round(s) will not be carried forward for any subsequent round(s) except choice(s) filled for Online stray vacancy round, which will be carried forward for subsequent online Stray Vacancy round(s) if any. For Unaided Private / Minority Institutions remaining seats after online stray vacancy round will be filled by institutional level round. While filling the online preference(s), candidates may kindly note that NEET-UG 2025 merit list will be operated from NEET-UG 2025 rank number one onwards in each round of selection. The online data of preferences of all candidates will be centrally processed at a later date for the selection of candidates for BNYS / BPTH / BOTH / BASLP and BP&O Courses.
- 11.3.3 The list of candidates selected for BNYS / BPTH / BOTH / BASLP and BP&O Courses shall be displayed at the website i.e. **www.mahacet.org** as per schedule. List of selected candidates will also be sent to all concerned colleges. The candidate will have to report at the allotted college with his/her original documents for physical verification and admission. The candidate should report personally (proxy not allowed) to the respective allotted college,

they should pay requisite fee and submit all original document at respective allotted college.

- 11.3.4 All the candidates to whom a seat has been allotted in the 1st Round on the basis of Merit-cum-Preference will have to join the college and course so allotted, within prescribed period as per schedule by completing the requisite formalities (i.e. submission of all original document and a set of attested photocopies of each documents as per the list given in NEET-UG 2025 Information Brochure and payment of requisite fees in respective institution) otherwise his/her selection will stand cancelled for that round.

- 11.3.5 **Status Retention:** In case if a candidate to whom a seat has been allotted in the first round and who has joined the college accordingly, is satisfied with the allotment, such a candidate must submit a Status-Retention Form (**Annexure-J**) in the given format on or before prescribed date with the Dean/Principal of the College where such a seat has been allotted to such a candidate. The Dean/Principal of every Institute in which admissions are so made in terms of these rules, may appoint an appropriate Officer to receive such Status Retention Forms. Upon receipt of such Status Retention Forms, an acknowledgement in writing shall be issued immediately to the concerned candidate(s) by the officer appointed by the Dean/Principal of the concerned college. It is mandatory for every such candidate submitting a Status Retention Form to insist for issuance of acknowledgement thereof and to preserve such acknowledgement till the present admission process is finally concluded. In absence of such an acknowledgement, the claim of submission of Status Retention Form within the prescribed time shall not be entertained. Candidate who has submitted status retention forms will not be eligible for remaining subsequent round(s).

It is hereby made clear that the period provided for submission of Status Retention Form is crucial and vital. This period shall not be extended for any reason whatsoever. Submission of the Status Retention Form is an irrevocable and irreversible act for the candidate submitting such Status Retention Form. It is made clear

that under no circumstances whatsoever, a candidate will be allowed to submit a Status Retention Form after the aforesaid last date. Under any circumstances whatsoever, a candidate who has submitted a Status Retention Form shall not be allowed to withdraw the same. All the candidates therefore, should take the note of this before submission of such a Status Retention Form.

Names of all the candidates who have submitted the Status Retention Form as above within the prescribed time and the seats occupied by them will be removed out of consideration for the remaining admission process for academic year 2025-26. Candidate who has joined during Round 1 and filled Status Retention form will be considered as Status Retention during further Rounds.

All the institutions should inform the joining of the candidates and vacancies arising due to non-joining of the candidates and cancellations/status retention at their institutions after the last date of reporting of respective rounds, immediately to Maharashtra State CET Cell through online College feedback module.

The academic year will start as per the guidelines from concerned Central Council.

11.3.6 CAP Round 1 Process:

11.3.6.1 If the candidate joins his/her Round 1 seat and wants to upgrade his/her allotted seat, then he/she shall NOT fill Status Retention Form and will have to fill fresh choice(s) for Round 2.

11.3.6.2 If a Candidate joins and is satisfied with the seat allotted in Round 1 and is not willing for up-gradation in Round 2, he/she can fill Status Retention Form. Such a candidate will not be considered for any of the further round(s) during the admission process of NEET-UG 2025. However, such a candidate can resign from the allotted seat before the prescribed/stipulated date. Such a candidate will be eligible for Round 2 & Round 3.

11.3.6.3 If the candidate is selected in Round 1 of counseling and does not report at the allotted institute, this will be considered as 'free exit' (option available only in Round 1 & Round 2). No new registration is required. However, such a candidate may participate again in Round

2 & Round 3 after logging in with their earlier Registration details and filling fresh preference(s). His/her selection of Round 1 stands cancelled. The seat so allotted to such a candidate who does not join, will be presumed to be a vacant seat as on the last date of joining and from the next date after the date set out as the last date for joining the college in terms of such allotment. Such a vacant seat will be allotted in Round 2 of the admission process.

11.3.7 CAP Round 2 Process:

11.3.7.1 Available Seats for Round 2:

- Seats not allotted during Round 1.
- Seats vacant due to non-joining / cancellation by candidate(s) allotted in Round 1.
- Seats available due to up-gradation of candidate(s), who have been allotted during Round 1 and joined the seat.

11.3.7.2 Following types of Candidates are eligible for seat allotment in Round 2:

- Registered candidates who did not fill choices in Round 1.
- Registered candidates who participated in Round 1 but did not get any seat allotted in the 1st Round.
- Registered candidates, whose seat allotted in 1st Round got cancelled during the document verification due to his/her invalid/wrong claim on reporting for admission to the selected Institute, but candidate is otherwise eligible for selection with change in the invalid/wrong claim. For such a candidate, selection during first round will not be valid and he/she will be eligible only on available seats during 2nd Round with corrected claim.
- Candidates who have reported/joined at allotted institute during the joining period of Round 1 of allotment and did not fill Status Retention Form.
- Candidate who does not join the allotted seat during Round 1.
- Candidate who has joined and resigned upto the last date of joining Round 1.

11.3.7.3 Candidate will have to fill fresh choices for Round 2. **Round 1 choices will be considered as null & void.** If a candidate is not interested to participate in Round 2, he/she should not fill preferences

for Round 2 and such a candidate who has joined during Round 1, will retain his/her Round 1 seat.

11.3.7.4 The allotment of seat for Round 2 will be as per the merit and preference(s) filled by the candidates for Round 2.

- If a candidate joined during Round 1, is upgraded in Round 2 (as per his/ her preference(s) submitted during Round 2), his/her allotted seat of Round 1 will be available in Round 2 and allotted as per merit in the same round.
- If a candidate joined during Round 1 and does not get upgraded in Round 2 (i.e. no seat is allotted during Round 2), he/she will retain allotted seat of Round 1.
- Candidate with no seat in hand at the end of Round 2, will be eligible for Round 3.

11.3.7.5 Following types of Candidates are not eligible for seat allotment in Round 2:

- Candidates who have joined Round 1 allotted seat and filled Status Retention Form.
- Candidates who have not filled fresh preferences.

11.3.7.6 If a candidate is selected during Round 2, he/she will have to join the college / seat allotted during second round. After joining the allotted institute in Round 2 & not filled status retention, the candidate will be eligible to participate in any further round(s) of State Counseling Process.

11.3.7.7 If a candidate does not join the selected seat during Round 2, he/she will be eligible for Round 3 of selection. If such a candidate wishes to apply for Round 3, he/she will have to fill the preference for Round 3.

11.3.8 CAP Round 3 Process:

11.3.8.1 Available Seats for Round 3:

- Seats not allotted during Round 2.
- Seats vacant due to non-joining / cancellation by candidate(s) allotted in Round 2.

11.3.8.2 Following types of Candidates are eligible for seat allotment in Round 3:

- Registered candidates who did not fill choices in Round 1 & Round 2.

- Registered candidates who participated in Round 1 & Round 2 but did not get any seat allotted in Round 1 & Round 2.
- Candidates allotted and joined seat in Round 1 / Round 2 & not filled Status Retention.
- Candidates who have registered in Round 3.

11.3.8.3 Candidate will have to fill fresh preferences for Round 3. All previous preferences will be considered as null & void.

11.3.8.4 Candidates not eligible for Round 3:

- Candidates who have joined seat in Round 1 / Round 2 of State Quota seats and filled Status Retention form.

If a candidate is selected during Round 3, he/she will have to join the college / seat allotted during that round. Candidate selected during Round 3 will not be eligible for subsequent round(s) of State Counseling Process.

11.3.9 Subsequent Round(s):

11.3.9.1 After Round 3, subsequent Online Stray Vacancy Round(s) will be conducted if seat(s) remain vacant. **Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round Process:**

Available Seats for Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round(s):

- Seats not allotted during Round 3.
- Seats vacant due to non-joining of candidate(s) allotted in Round 3.

Eligible Candidates:

- Candidate who has registered & filled online preference form previously in Round 3 of State Quota Counseling but not been allotted a seat till Round 3.

Candidates not eligible:

- Candidates who have joined seat in Round 1, Round 2 and/or allotted a seat in Round 3.
- Candidates who have joined seat in Round 1, Round 2 and/or allotted a seat in Round 3 of All India Quota seats of MBBS & BDS courses.

Note –

- No new registration will be done for this Round.
- Candidate will have to fill fresh choices for CAP online stray vacancy round. **Round 3 choices will be considered as null & void.**
- Allotment of seat will be done Online by running software.
- For Unaided Private institutions, seats remaining vacant after Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round(s) will be filled by **Institutional level Stray Vacancy Round.**

11.3.9.2 Institutional Stray Vacancy Round Process (for Unaided Private /

Minority institutions): For Unaided Private institutions, seats remaining vacant after Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round(s) for BNYS/BPTH/BOTH/ BASLP and BP&O courses will be filled by the respective institute through Institutional Level Stray Vacancy Round(s). For 15% Institutional Quota of Courses other than MBBS, BDS, BAMS, BHMS & BUMS, all seats are filled by the respective Institute.

- a. Institutional Stray Round is only for Private Unaided/Minority Institutes for 15% Institutional Quota seats and 85% State Quota seats remaining vacant after Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round.
- b. Dean or the Principal of the Institutions shall carry out the admission of these vacant seats on the basis of inter-se merit from the list of NEET-UG 2025 eligible candidates as per the directions and schedule issued by the Competent Authority, State CET Cell, during the academic year 2025-26.
- c. All those candidates joined during Round 1, Round 2, Round 3 & Online CAP Stray Vacancy Round in Govt. / Corpn. / Govt. aided / Private Unaided / Minority medical colleges and having "ADMITTED STATUS" as on prescribed date are NOT ELIGIBLE to participate in Institutional Level Stray Vacancy Round.
- d. The list of eligible candidates for Institutional Stray Vacancy Round (i.e. those who are having "NOT ADMITTED STATUS" as on prescribed date) will be published on the website: www.mahacet.org.
- e. It will be responsibility of the institute to verify and ascertain eligibility of the candidate as per respective Central Council rules before admitting the candidate even if his/her name appears in list of ELIGIBLE candidates.
- f. For Institutional Stray Vacancy Round, eligible and interested candidates should approach to the Dean/Principal of the respective college(s) within prescribed time and submit application for vacant seats in person or any person. Such type of applications should not be submitted in the State CET Cell in person or via email. Such type of applications submitted in State CET Cell will not be considered valid for any institutional level stray vacancy admission process.
- g. Any vacancy arising due to shifting of candidates from Private Institute to Government / Corporation Institute in Online Stray Vacancy Round(s) can be filled by institution. Such vacancy should be immediately informed to the Competent Authority.
- h. Any Candidate if Shifted from Institutional quota seats to State quota seats of Govt./ Corporation/ Govt. Aided / Unaided Private / Minority Medical College due to betterment or any reason by Order of Competent Authority, such Candidate, if desires should be immediately relieved without any penalty.
- i. The admission process should be completed before Cut-off date declared by Central Council and Competent Authority from time to time.
- j. All the admissions are subject to approval of Admissions Regulating Authority after Cut-off date. The College should upload the information about admitted candidate in College Feedback Module of State CET Cell.
- k. Any issue regarding filling of vacant seats not dealt herein above will be dealt with, when arising fully and finally by the Competent Authority.

- 16 Constitutional Reserved Category Candidates - "Ear-Marking":** Reserve category candidate entitled to admission on the basis of merit in an open category seat will have the option of taking admission either against his / her respective category seat or on an open category seat. If he / she opts for the reserved category he / she will be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as reserve category candidate. One seat in the college where he / she was eligible for admission against open seat shall be earmarked for a candidate belonging to the respective reserved category. - 19 Selection shown on the official website will only be considered as valid, selection letter given to candidate by unknown person/agency or available on unauthentic website will not be treated as valid. Candidates should not believe in such false/fake selection letter.**
- 20 DISQUALIFICATION FOR ADMISSION**
- The candidate who was allotted a seat in any course under MUHS Nashik in previous year(s) and who vacates / abandons it after availing the said seat, has completed such a period of course which would result into lapse of the said seat,

- Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik shall take the decision regarding eligibility and granting of the term of selected candidates. The selection of a candidate by the Competent Authority at a later date does not place any onus to accord approval for grant of term.

12. PAYMENT OF FEES:

12.1 The fee for the course should be paid at the respective college by Demand Draft from any Nationalised / Scheduled commercial Bank in favour of Dean/Principal of College, as applicable.

12.2 REFUND OF FEES BY THE COLLEGE AFTER CHANGE OF COLLEGE / COURSE OR CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION:

The candidate who has been admitted and desires to cancel admission he/she should submit an application. The refund of fees to candidate admitted in the college shall be made after deduction as under:

1. Before cutoff date as declared by the respective council - Rs.1500/- (Rs. One thousand five hundred only) to be deducted and rest of the fees to be refunded.
2. On or after cut-off date as declared by respective council no refund of fees for Health Science Courses.
3. The Dean/Principal of the college shall be responsible for making refund of the fees, on the basis of cancellation letter from the candidate. If the candidate expires or becomes invalid within 90 days from the date of admission, no deduction shall be made.

13. CANCELLATION:

The selected candidate must join the college at which he/she is selected, on or before the date prescribed by the Competent Authority, failing which his/her admission stands cancelled.

The selected candidate who has joined the college and desire to cancel the admission should cancel it, at the respective college. The college should accept the cancellation and inform the Competent Authority along with copy of the cancellation letter immediately. Last date to cancel the admission of Medical / Dental and Ayush Course on or before the prescribed date to be declared in due course. If a candidate cancels his/her admission after this date, he/she has to pay penalty as per rule 16. Any application for cancellation of admission sent to competent authority will not considered.

Note: Candidate who has filled status retention form can also cancel the admission before prescribed date.

14. FINAL SELECTION:

- 14.1 The selection made by the Competent Authority as per this procedure is final, and will be binding on the candidate.
- 14.2 Request for mutual transfer is not permissible. Such requests will not be entertained.

15. COMPULSORY SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY SERVICE:

- 15.1 As per Government Resolution (G.R. No. MED 1007/C.R.490/07/Edu-2 dated 8th Feb 2008, G.R. No. MED 1021/C.R.128/21/Edu-2, dated 13th June 2022 (**Annexure – Q**), and any other G.R. issued in this regard from time to time), candidates joined against the seats of Government / Municipal Corporation colleges for admission to MBBS / BDS Courses either through GOI nominee, All India quota and State quota through NEET UG 2022 & onwards will be required to sign a social responsibility service to compulsorily serve the Government of Maharashtra or local self government or Defence services for a period of one year, after the completion of internship.

Additionally, he/she will be required to sign an undertaking to the effect that he/she will not leave India within a period of five years from the date of obtaining the degree, otherwise he/she will have to pay Non-Refundable **Rs. 10,00,000/- (Rs. Ten lacs only)** as penalty.

- 15.2 **Social Responsibility Service for Private Unaided MBBS Courses:** As per Government Resolution (G.R. No. MED 1016/C.R.345/16/Edu-2 Dated: 05/01/2018 and G.R. No. MED 1021/C.R.128/21/Edu-2, dated 13th June 2022) (**Annexure – Q**), the candidate who has taken admission to MBBS course in Govt. aided / Unaided Private institute through NEET UG 2022 & onwards and is availing reimbursement / Scholarship from various departments like Tribal Welfare Department, Social Justice And Special Assistance Department, Other Backward Bahunjan Welfare Department and Medical Education & Drug Department will be required to sign a social responsibility service to compulsorily serve the Government of Maharashtra for a period of one year, after the completion of internship.

The Candidate who are not availing reimbursement of fees / Scholarship, the said social responsibility service is not applicable.

The allotment of social responsibility service will be implemented by Directorate of Medical Education Research, Mumbai and Directorate of Health Services, Government of Maharashtra.

16. PENALTY:

16.1 PENALTY FOR LAPSE OF SEAT (MBBS/BDS COURSES): Any candidate responsible for lapse of MBBS/BDS seat at **Government/Government Aided/Corporation** Medical/Dental College will have to pay a Non-Refundable penalty of Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupee Ten Lacs Only). This penalty is applicable to all those candidates who do not join during last round or cancel a seat after last round of admission. This penalty is also applicable to any candidate resigning a seat after cut off date for MBBS/BDS courses or also fails to complete the course, irrespective of admission quota of the candidate.

16.2 Penalty for Lapse of seat at Government/Government Aided/Private unaided College (Ayush Course): Any candidate who resigns a seat after cut off date from Government/Government Aided/Private unaided College (Ayush Course) will have to pay Rs. 3,00,000/- (Rs. Three lakhs only) as penalty.

16.3 Penalty for Lapse of seat at Government/Government Aided/Private unaided College (BNYS, BPTH, BPTH, BASLP & BP & O Courses): Any candidate who resigns a seat after cut off date from Government/Government Aided/Private unaided College (Allied Health Sciences courses) will have to pay Rs. 2,00,000/- (Rs. Two lakhs only) as penalty which will include 1st year tuition fees. If the candidate has paid the tuition fees to the institute, he/she will have to pay the difference amount only. If the candidate has not paid the tuition fees, he/she will have to pay Rs. 2,00,000/- (Rs. Two lakhs only).

17. CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE:

- 17.1 Failure of the candidate in making full and correct statements in the application form and/or suppression of any information would lead to disqualification of the candidate, even at later date. Such a candidate will be debarred from the entire selection process.
- 17.2 It is responsibility of every candidate to submit proper documents. Any attempt to submit documents which are not genuine will lead to cancellation of the admission of the candidate, forfeiture of the fees, deposits and expulsion of the candidate from the college by the Competent Authority or by his authorised official. The name of such candidate/s shall be deleted from the State Merit List and he/she will not be eligible for further rounds of the selection process and will be debarred from the selection process. If deemed fit even criminal proceeding may be initiated by the Competent Authority against such candidates / their parents.

If any candidate / authorised representative or person accompanying is found obstructing the counseling and / or admission process, or trying to influence in unlawful manner/ creating nuisance, the candidate shall be liable for disqualification from the process of selection and appropriate legal action will be taken. The decision taken by the Competent Authority in this respect shall be final and binding.

- 17.3 The student while studying in the Health Sciences Courses, if found indulging in antinational activities, unlawful activities or ragging in any form, contrary to the provisions of relevant Acts and Law enforced by Government, will be liable to be expelled from the college by the Dean/Principal of the College.
- 17.4 Pursuant to orders in W.P. (Civil) No. 656 of 1999, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, has directed the Department of Human resources Development and Education, Govt. of India, to take all necessary steps to curb the menace of ragging and take severe action against the students involved in such activities.
- 17.5 As per the provisions of Maharashtra Act XXXIII known as **"Maharashtra Prohibition of ragging Act of 1999"**, students indulging in ragging can be **punished under the Act resulting in suspension, expulsion from the college and imprisonment.**

- 17.6 Any issue not dealt here in above will be dealt with when arising, fully and finally by the competent Authority. Any amendment made by Government of India / Government of Maharashtra / Hon'ble courts from time to time will be implemented.

18. LEGAL JURISDICTION

All disputes pertaining to the selection state quota seats, shall fall within the jurisdiction of Courts, at Mumbai only. The Competent Authority shall be the legal person in whose name the Government of Maharashtra may sue or may be sued.

20. EXEMPTIONS AS PER GOVERNMENT RULES:

- A. The Backward class applicants selected in Open Merit category are eligible for freeship and scholarship as per Government orders. Students belonging to the communities mentioned at Section V except the other backward communities on caste basis are considered for exemption from payment of fees in accordance with the G.R. & SWD No. DC/1059-E, dated 21st January 1962, dated 19th November 1962. If, however, any of these students are granted scholarship under the scheme of post matric-scholarship to scheduled caste and scheduled caste converts to Buddhism, scheduled Tribes, Denotified, Nomadic and Semi Nomadic Tribes and Lower Income Group students, educational concession in their favour are covered by regulation there under prepared by the Government of India.

The Educational concession extended to the Backward Class student under the G. R. cited above will be an extension of concession like tuition fees and University examination fees to such students, even if they fail once in their annual examination and for one reason or the other, they are not in receipt of Government of India Scholarship. These concessions will be extended to them without insisting on caste or income certificate from the Executive Magistrate or the Taluka Magistrate or the Sub-Divisional Magistrate as the case may be. They are required to produce only the declaration of caste and income in the prescribed form Circulated vide Directorate of Social Welfare's No. SIJ 1966-67, dated 21st July, 1966.

- 3) Caste certificate issuing authority: Caste certificate stating that the caste is recognized under a particular backward class category in Maharashtra state is issued by Sub-

Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrate/Metropolitan Magistrate in Maharashtra state.

4) **The Caste/Tribe validity Certificate issuing Authorities are as follows:**

- a) For Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Caste converts to Buddhism, Vimukta Jati, Nomadic Tribes NT1(B), NT2(C), NT3(D), Other Backward Class and SEBC, Caste Validity Certificate is issued by **Divisional Caste Certificate Scrutiny Committee of respective Divisional Social Welfare Office** (Konkan, Pune, Nashik, Aurangabad, Amravati and Nagpur).

No.MCI-34(41)/2019-Med./112862.— In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 33 of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956), the Board of Governors in super-session of Medical Council of India with the previous sanction of the Central Government, hereby makes the following Regulations to further amend the "Graduate Medical Education Regulation, 1997", namely:—

1. (i) These Regulations may be called the "Graduate Medical Education Regulations, (Amendment), 2019".

(ii) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. In the "Regulations on Graduate Medical Education, 1997", in Appendix "H" - Guidelines regarding admission of students with "Specified Disabilities" under the Rights of persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 with respect to admission in MBBS—shall be substituted with Appendix "H-1".

- Note: 1. The "Certificate of Disability" shall be issued in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017 notified in the Gazette of India by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment [Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (*Divyangjan*)] on 15th June 2017.
2. The extent of "specified disability" in a person shall be assessed in accordance with the "Guidelines for the purpose of assessing the extent of specified disability in a person included under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016)" notified in the Gazette of India by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment [Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (*Divyangjan*)] on 4th January 2018.
3. The minimum degree of disability should be 40% (Benchmark Disability) in order to be eligible for availing reservation for persons with specified disability.
4. The term 'Persons with Disabilities' (PwD) is to be used instead of the term 'Physically Handicapped' (PH).

प्रवेशाकरीता विशिष्ट प्रवर्गाकरीता प्रवेश इच्छुक उमेदवारांना अतिरिक्त गुण देण्यासंदर्भात दिनांक १८.०६.२०१६ रोजीच्या शासननिर्णयाद्वारे निर्गमित करण्यात आलेले आदेश संदर्भाधीन शासननिर्णय दिनांक ०४.०२.२०१७ अन्वये रद्द करण्यात आले आहेत. शैक्षणिक वर्ष २०१७-१८ पासून देशभरातील सर्व वैद्यकीय व दंत अभ्यासक्रमांचे प्रवेश राष्ट्रीय स्तरावरील "नीट" (NEET) या सामाईक प्रवेश परीक्षेच्या आधारे करण्यासंदर्भात केंद्रशासनाने भारतीय आयुर्विज्ञान परिषद अधिनियम, १९५६ मध्ये सुधारणा केली आहे. शैक्षणिक वर्ष २०१७-१८ पासून वैद्यकीय व दंत पदवी अभ्यासक्रमांसह राज्यातील इतर सर्व आरोग्य विज्ञानाचे पदवी अभ्यासक्रमांचे प्रवेश राष्ट्रीय स्तरावरील NEET "नीट" या सामाईक प्रवेश परीक्षेच्या आधारे करण्यासंदर्भात संदर्भाधीन शासननिर्णय दिनांक ०१.१२.२०१६ अन्वये मान्यता देण्यात आली आहे. त्यानुषंगाने, संदर्भाधीन शासननिर्णय दिनांक ३१.०५.२०१६ अधिक्रमित करून शासकीय / शासन अनुदानित / महानगरपालिका या महाविद्यालयांतील आरोग्य विज्ञानाच्या पदवी अभ्यासक्रमांच्या प्रथम वर्षाच्या प्रवेशासंदर्भात निर्णय घेण्याची बाब शासनाच्या विचाराधीन होती. त्यानुषंगाने पुढीलप्रमाणे निर्णय घेण्यात येत आहे.

३. *Person of Indian Origin (PIO) / Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)* तसेच, परदेशी नागरिक हे आरोग्य विज्ञानाच्या पदवी अभ्यासक्रमांच्या राज्याच्या कोट्यातून शैक्षणिक वर्ष २०१७-१८ पासून प्रवेशास पात्र ठरणार नाहीत.

४. राष्ट्रीय पातळीवरील सामाईक प्रवेश परिक्षा "NEET" (National Eligibility cum Entrance Test) या परिक्षेमध्ये प्राप्त केलेली पात्रता/गुणवत्ता यानुसारच उमेदवारांना प्रवेश देण्यात येतील.

५. विविध आरोग्य विज्ञान अभ्यासक्रमांच्या प्रवेशासाठी संबंधित समुचित प्राधिकरणांनी उदा. भारतीय आयुर्विज्ञान परिषद, भारतीय दंत परिषद, केंद्रीय भारतीय चिकित्सा परिषद, भारतीय परिचर्या परिषद इत्यादी प्रमाणे व ज्या अभ्यासक्रमांस केंद्रीय परिषद अस्तित्वात नाही अशा अभ्यासक्रमांस महाराष्ट्र आरोग्य विज्ञान विद्यापीठ, नाशिक यांनी विहित केलेले पात्रतेबाबतच्या निकषांची पूर्तता करणे आवश्यक आहे.

६. जागा वाटप : शासकीय/ महानगरपालिका व शासन अनुदानित व्यावसायिक संस्था मधील आरोग्य विज्ञान पदवी अभ्यासक्रमांचे प्रवेशासाठी जागा वाटप परिशिष्ट (अ) नुसार राहिल.

७. सांविधानिक/ घटनात्मक आरक्षण : सोबत परिशिष्ट ब नुसार राहिल.

८. विशेषीकृत आरक्षण (Specified Reservation): सोबतच्या परिशिष्ट क, ड, ई व एफ नुसार अनुक्रमे संरक्षण दलातील कर्मचाऱ्यांच्या मुलांसाठी, शारिरीकदृष्ट्या विकलांग उमेदवारांसाठी, महाराष्ट्र-कर्नाटक सीमा भागातील उमेदवारांसाठी आणि डोंगरी भागातील उमेदवारांसाठी विहित आरक्षण लागू राहिल.

९. बंधपत्र/ हमीपत्र :

WP (C) Nos.267, 292, 270, 227and 258 of 2017 and SLP (C)
 Nos.31037-31038, 31427 and 30336 of 2016

Issue notice.

As the respondents have been represented by the respective
 counsel, no further notice need be issued.

Having heard learned counsel for the parties, as an interim
 measure, the following directions are issued :

1. Common Counselling for admission to All India Quota seats in
 Government Medical Colleges shall be conducted by the DGHS.

The counselling conducted by DGHS will also include Deemed Universities as they have an All India character. The Deemed Universities mentioned above shall also include Deemed Universities run by religious and linguistic minorities.

2. Common Counselling for State Quota seats in Government as well as Private Medical Colleges including colleges/institutions run by religious and linguistic minorities affiliated to State Universities shall be conducted by the State Government or the authority designated by the State Government. The notification issued by the State Government intimating the students about the Common Counselling must specify that at the time of counselling the students belonging to minority community will be required to furnish the necessary proof regarding their minority status and submit in writing about their willingness to take admission in the concerned minority college/institution.
3. As per the judgment of this Hon'ble Court in the case of Ashish Ranjan vs. Union of India & Ors. [(2016) 11 SCC 225], there shall be only two rounds of common counselling each conducted by the DGHS/State Government or authority designated by the State Government for All India Quota (including Deemed University) and State Quota seats respectively.
4. After the second round of counselling for All India Quota seats, the students who take admission in All India Quota seats should not be allowed/permitted to vacate the seats. This would ensure that very few seats are reverted to the State Quota and also All India Quota seats are filled by students from the all India merit list only. The students who take admission and secure admission in Deemed Universities pursuant to the second round of counselling conducted by the DGHS shall not be eligible to participate in any other counselling.
5. The notification to be issued by the DGHS and the State

Government notifying Common Counselling should also provide the fee structure of Deemed Universities and Private Medical Colleges. The DGHS/ State Government should also obtain the consent of the students regarding their willingness to pay the fees provided in the notification and take admission in the Deemed Universities and Private Medical Colleges.

6. The students who secure admission in MBBS course pursuant to the Common Counselling conducted by the State Government, at the time of common counselling itself, should be made to deposit with the admission/counselling committee the Demand Draft towards the fees payable to the institution College/ University. The admission/counselling committee shall forthwith forward the Demand Draft to the respective Institution/Colleges/University. The necessity for including the above-mentioned requirement has arisen as it has been time and again noticed that when students report to the college after the counselling they are refused admission by the colleges on some pretext or the other and it is shown by the college as if the student never reported to the college for admission. If the Demand Draft is deposited by the admission/counselling committee then there would be no scope for colleges to refuse admission to any student.
7. In order to ascertain the number of seats that still remain vacant after the counselling the State Government or the authority designated by the State Government shall conduct manual counselling for allotment of students. After the completion counselling, the State Government shall determine the number of seats that are still vacant and thereafter shall forward a list of students in order of merit, equaling to ten times the number of vacant seats to the medical college so that in case of any stray vacancy arising in any college the said seat may be filled up from the said list.
8. In the applications submitted by the students belonging to the

minority community they should confirm their minority status as well as the fact that they fulfill other conditions which may be prescribed by the minority institutions. Accordingly, the DGHS as well as the State Government shall prepare a separate list of minority students seeking admissions in the respective minority institutions in order of merit. The competent authorities of the College present during counselling shall check/verify the minority status of the candidate. This arrangement is only meant for the State Quota.

9. During the common counselling conducted by the State Government, the representatives of the medical colleges particularly representative of minority institutions should be a part of the admission/counselling committee as the case may be.
10. Common counselling conducted by the DGHS/State Government will not in any manner affect the rights of minority institutions to admit students of their respective minority community. The minority quota seats, if any, in institutions run by minorities will be filled up by minority students only. Therefore, the rights of minority institutions are fully protected.

Needless to say this arrangement will not apply to the States of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Jammun & Kashmir. As far as the other States are concerned, needless to say, this arrangement shall apply to all the colleges unless this Court has passed any different or separate order.

Let the matter be listed on 13.9.2017.

२. राज्यस्तरावर घेण्यात येणाऱ्या संबंधित व्यावसायिक अभ्यासक्रमांची प्रवेश प्रक्रिया ही महाराष्ट्र विनाअनुदानित खाजगी व्यावसायिक शैक्षणिक संस्था (प्रवेश व शुल्क यांचे विनियमन) अधिनियम, २०१५ मधील कलम १० अन्वये आयुक्त, राज्य सामायिक प्रवेश परीक्षा कक्ष यांचेमार्फत करणे क्रमप्राप्त आहे. तथापि, सदर अधिनियमात फक्त खाजगी विनाअनुदानित व अल्पसंख्यांक संस्थेतील व्यावसायिक अभ्यासक्रमांच्या प्रवेशाच्या नियमनाची तरतूद करण्यात आली असल्याने सदर संस्थेव्यतिरिक्त शासकीय/ शासन अनुदानित आणि महापालिकेच्या महाविद्यालयांतील व्यावसायिक अभ्यासक्रमांच्या प्रवेशासाठी एक खिडकी पद्धतीने एकच प्रवेश प्रक्रिया अंमलात आणण्याचे शासनाच्या विचाराधीन होते.

MAHARASHTRA UNAIDED PRIVATE PROFESSIONAL EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS (REGULATION OF ADMISSIONS AND FEES) ACT, 2015.

No. MED.1016/CR 69/16/Edu.-2.— In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015), the Government of Maharashtra hereby makes the following rules to regulate the admissions to the First year of the Full Time Professional Medical and Dental Undergraduate Courses, in the Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions in the State of Maharashtra, namely :—

1. Short title and commencement.— (1) These rules may be called the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Undergraduate Medical and Dental Courses) Rules, 2016.

(2) They shall come into force with effect from the date they are published in the Gazette.

2. Definitions.—(1) In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a) "Act" means the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015) ;

(b) "Admission Reporting Institution" means an institution where the Candidate shall report for confirmation for admission by submission of documents and payment of fees ;

(c) "Application Form" means the prescribed form to be filled up online or offline by the candidate for admission to the Courses as defined in clause (e) ;

(d) "CAP Seats" means the seats filled in through the Centralized process of admission carried out by the Competent Authority ;

(e) "Courses" means the Undergraduate Medical Courses or Undergraduate Dental Courses, as the case may be, conducted in the State as per the approval of the MCI and DCI and affiliated to MUHS ;

(f) "Document Verification Centre" means the city or town declared by the competent authority where the document verification is to be conducted ;

(g) "DCI" means the Dental Council of India constituted under the Dentists Act, 1948 (16 of 1948) ;

(h) "Eligible Candidates" means the candidates who are eligible for different professional courses as notified by the Government, from time to time, under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act ;

(i) "HSC" means the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Standard XII) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education as per the provisions of the Maharashtra Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Boards Act, 1965 (Mah XLI of 1965) or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board ;

(j) "Institutional Quota" means seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Institution level as declared by the Government or appropriate authority from time to time ;

(k) "inter-se-merit" means the order of merit in respect of various classes or category of Candidates ;

(l) "Minority Quota" means seats earmarked for the Minority Community students from within the State of Maharashtra, belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs ;

(m) "MUHS" means the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences established under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998 (Mah. X of 1999) ;

(n) "MCI" means the Medical Council of India constituted under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956) ;

(o) "National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test" or "NEET" means the examination conducted by Central Board of Secondary Education, Delhi for admission to under graduate Medical and Dental Courses.

(p) "Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)" means a candidate or a person registered as an Overseas Citizen of India as declared by the Central Government under section 7A of the Citizenship Act 1955, and includes Persons of Indian Origin (PIO).

Explanation.—For the purposes of this clause, all the existing Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) card-holders registered under Notification of the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs No. F.No. 26011/04/98- F. I, dated 19th August 2002 and shall now be deemed to be Overseas Citizens of India, (OCI) card holders by virtue of Notification of Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, No. 25024/9/2014-F.I, dated 9th January 2015.

(q) "Qualifying Examination" means the Higher Secondary Certificate (12th Standard) or equivalent examination, from an institution situated in the State of Maharashtra with English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology (Botany and Zoology) at the time of admission ;

(r) "Region" means the area in respective Statutory Development Board for Vidarbha, Marathwada and Rest of Maharashtra ;

(s) "SSC" means the Secondary School Certificate (Standard X) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education as per the

provisions of the Maharashtra Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Boards Act, 1965 (Mah. XLI of 1965) or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board ;

(2) Words and expressions used but not defined in these rules, shall have the same meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

3. *Invitation of Application Form.*—The Competent Authority shall invite online or offline Application Form in the form prescribed by it, from the candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process (CAP) for seeking admission to the Courses for which the 'NEET' is required for the respective academic year.

4. *Declaration of Medium, Pattern, Syllabus, Schedule, etc.*—Medium, Pattern, Syllabus, Schedule shall be as per the Information Bulletin of the NEET. CAP rounds for respective academic year shall be declared by the Competent Authority.

5. *Candidature Type.*—

(1) *Maharashtra State Candidature.*—

Type	Eligibility Criteria
(A)	(i) The candidate must be an Indian National. (ii) Except for the year 2016, Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) or Overseas Citizens of India (OCI), Non Resident Indians (NRD) shall not be eligible. (iii) Except for the year 2016, the candidate should be Domicile of the State of Maharashtra. (iv) The candidate must have completed 17 years of age on or before 31st December of the year of admission for the course. The Birth certificate indicating name of the candidate, Secondary School Certificate examination i.e. SSC or equivalent examination certificate or School Leaving Certificate endorsing the date of birth shall constitute a valid proof of age. (The eligibility of age shall be as prescribed by MCI & DCI from time to time) (v) The candidate must be medically fit. (vi) The candidate must have passed the SSC or equivalent examination from an Institution situated in the State of Maharashtra. However, except for the year 2016, candidate who has passed SSC or equivalent examination from an institute situated outside Maharashtra State and HSC or equivalent examination from an institute situated within Maharashtra State is eligible for seeking admission to the courses, provided that he or she is Domicile of Maharashtra. (vii) The candidate must have passed the qualifying examination.
(B)	Exception for clause (A) (vi) for SSC or clause (A) (vii) for HSC or equivalent examinations for children of employees of the Government of Maharashtra or its Undertakings :— (i) The Children of such employees of the Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking who have joined service since beginning at a place situated outside the State of Maharashtra but who have been transferred to a place situated within the State of Maharashtra shall be eligible for admission even though such children might have passed the SSC or HSC or equivalent examination from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra; provided that, such employee of the Government of Maharashtra or its Undertaking must have been posted or transferred or deputed at a place of work located in the State of Maharashtra and also must have reported for duty i.e. joined the duty before the last date of submission of preference form.

Type	Eligibility Criteria
	(ii) The Candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at (i) above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such employee of Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking has reported for duty, as a proof that such employee has joined the office and/or reported for duty before the cut-off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of Preference Form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer or posting order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting. A copy of transfer or posting order should also be produced at the time of filling the preference form. (iii) The Children of such employees of Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking who have been transferred or deputed to a place situated outside the State of Maharashtra or who have returned to the State of Maharashtra after initial transfer or deputation shall be eligible for admission even though such children might have passed the SSC or HSC or equivalent examinations from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra. (iv) The candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at (iii) above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such employee of Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking has reported for duty, as a proof that such employee has joined the office and/or reported for duty before the cut-off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of Preference Form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer or posting order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting. A copy of transfer or posting order should also be produced at the time of filling the preference form. (C) Exception for clause (A) (vi) for SSC or for clause (A) (vii) for HSC or equivalent examinations for Children of employees of the Government of India or its undertaking,— (i) The Children of the employees of Government of India or its Undertaking shall be eligible for admission even though they might have passed the SSC and/or HSC or equivalent examination from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra; provided that, such an employee of Government of India or its undertaking must have been transferred from out of Maharashtra state and posted at a place of work, located in the State of Maharashtra and also must have reported for duty, i.e. joined the duty before the last date of submission of preference form. (ii) The Candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at (i) above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such an employee of Government of India or its undertaking has reported for duty, as a proof of the fact that such employee has joined the office or reported for duty before the cut-off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of preference form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer and posting order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting. A copy of transfer and posting order should also be produced at the time of filling the preference form.
	(2) <i>Minority Candidature.</i>—The Maharashtra domiciled Candidate belonging to a particular linguistic or religious minority community from within the State fulfilling eligibility criteria as per sub-rule (1) of rule 5 shall be eligible under this category.

(3) *NRI Candidature.*—The candidate who fulfils the conditions as defined in clause (n) of section 2 of the Act shall be eligible under this category.

6. Eligibility.—(a) Eligibility for Admission to undergraduate Medical and Dental Courses :—

(i) The eligibility for admission to the first year of MBBS and BDS course shall be such as notified by the Government under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act.

(ii) A candidate belonging to open category must secure not less than 50% percentile in NEET. A candidate belonging to constitutional reservation must secure not less than 40% percentile in NEET.

(b) *Cut-off date for eligibility:* The eligibility of the candidate shall be determined or decided for all purposes including for applicability of all these Rules and Regulations by considering the last date of submission of preference form as the cut-off date. It is made abundantly clear that if a candidate is found ineligible as on the last date of submission of preference form, in terms of these Rules and Regulations, and if such ineligible candidate acquires the requisite eligibility after the aforesaid cut-off date, i.e. after the last date of submission of preference form, such subsequent acquisition of eligibility will not make an ineligible candidate eligible for any purpose whatsoever, much less for the purpose of admission.

7. Sanctioned Intake Seats for various Courses.—The Sanctioned Intake for First Year of undergraduate Medical and Dental Course shall be as per the approval given by the Authority which is competent for giving approval to respective courses and affiliation given by the MUHS.

8. Allocation of seats.—The percentage of allocation of seats for various types of candidates through NEET for First Year of the Courses shall be as per the MCI and DCI regulations, and in accordance with the policy of the Government as specified in the Schedule,—

(1) *Maharashtra State Candidature Seats.*—The Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature as specified in sub-rule (1) of rule 5, shall be eligible for these seats.

(2) *Minority Candidature Seats.*—The Candidates having Candidature mentioned in sub-rule (2) of rule 5 shall be eligible for these seats as specified in the Schedule. These seats shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 6 of the Act.

(3) *Institutional Quota Seats* - The Institution can admit Eligible Candidates against 15 percent of the Sanctioned Intake, as per the Schedule, subject to following conditions, namely :—

(i) the candidates having candidature mentioned in sub-rules (1), (2) and (3) of rule 5 shall be eligible for these seats, as may be applicable;

(ii) the NRI Candidates shall be admitted under the Institution quota seats, subject to the approval by Admission Regulating Authority;

(iii) if the seats reserved for the NRI remains vacant, those vacant seats may be filled in by the Institution, from the *Eligible Maharashtra State Candidature* as given in sub-rules (1) and (2) of rule 5 on the basis of *inter-se-merit* of NEET.

9. Distribution of Seats.—The Distribution of seats shall be allotted by the Competent Authority.

(i) *Distribution of Seats in State level 30 percent Quota.*— Out of the seats at the disposal of the Competent Authority, 30 percent of such seats shall be first made available for candidates from the State and these seats shall be filled on the basis of NEET merit list. There shall be constitutional and female reservations in these seats as per the prevailing rules in this behalf.

(ii) *Distribution of seats in Regional level 70 percent Quota.*—After the exclusion of State level 30 percent quota seats referred in (i) above, the remaining 70 percent seats shall

be filled from amongst the Candidates who have passed HSC from the colleges situated in the respective region, subject to the constitutional and female reservation as per the prevailing rules in this behalf.

(iii) *Criteria for 70 percent Regional Quota seats for candidates who have passed qualifying examination from Maharashtra State.*—Region of the candidates for selection under 70 percent regional quota seat will be the region from where he or she has passed HSC or equivalent examination.

(iv) *Criteria for 70 percent Regional Quota for candidates who have passed qualifying examination from Institution situated outside Maharashtra State.*—For candidates who have passed qualifying examination from outside the State of Maharashtra :

Sr. No.	Quota / Type of candidate	Region for 70 percent regional quota
1	State Government employee— Eligible under rule 5(1) (B) (Transferred out of Maharashtra)	Parents region of posting before transfer/deputation
2	State Government employee— Eligible under rule 5(1) (B) (Transferred back to Maharashtra)	Parents region of posting
3	Central Government employee— Eligible under rule 5(1) (C)	Parents region of posting

(v) Selection to Medical and Dental courses at the Private Unaided institutions through CAP shall be subject to permission or approval or affiliation from, (1) Government of India; (2) MCI or DCI; (3) Government of Maharashtra; and (4) MUHS. The “intake capacity” at a particular college shall be the ‘minimum number of seats’ permitted by the above said authorities;

(vi) As per Maharashtra Private Professional Educational Institutions (Reservation of seats for admission for SC, ST, Denotified Tribes -Vimukta Jatis, NT and OBC) Act, 2006 (Mah. XXX of 2006) dated 1st August 2006, 25 percent seats of the total intake capacity of Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions shall be allotted to the constitutional reservation category candidates;

(vii) There shall be 80 percent State and 70 percent Regional Quota from the seats available at the disposal of Competent Authority. There shall be 30 percent female reservation under both.

10. Preparation of Merit List.—The Competent Authority shall conduct the examination, evaluate the answer sheets and declare the result;

(i) *Preparation of Merit List for Selection to Medical and Dental Courses.*—Merit List for selection to the Medical and Dental courses shall be prepared on the basis of marks obtained by the candidate at the NEET in the descending order of Merit of NEET.

(ii) *Method for calculating NRI merit.*—The merit list for NRI Candidates stated at sub-rule (3) of rule 5 shall be prepared on the basis of the percentage of marks at NEET, in descending order of merit of the NEET.

11. Centralised Admission Process (CAP).— (i) The Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall admit Candidates through the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) as referred in sub-section (3) of section 3 of the Act. The stages of CAP shall be as mentioned below, namely :—

(a) display or publication of college wise, subject wise and category wise distribution of seats on website;

(b) display or publication of Time Schedule and Venue for preference form filling process on website;

(c) display or publication of Brochure of Preference Form filling and counselling process for admission to Courses;

(d) verification of documents and endorsement of eligibility of the successful candidates for the admission process at the document verification centers i.e. Mumbai, Pune, Aurangabad and Nagpur followed by filling up of Preference Form by the eligible candidates;

(e) display or publication of allotment of seats for Round-I of CAP by way of computerised process and joining of the candidates at respective institution as per the allotment within stipulated time;

(f) display or publication of subsequent computerised round(s) if seats remain vacant after completion of CAP Round-I;

(ii) Candidate shall be given a chance to retain a seat that has been allotted, by way of status retention form at the end of each CAP round. If a Candidate accepts the offered seat and he do not want to participate in any further rounds of seat allocation, such candidate shall not be considered in subsequent rounds of admission.

12. CAP allotment stages and process of allotment.—Allotment of seats under CAP shall be made in the following manner:—

(1) *Maharashtra State Candidature.*—The stages of computerised allotments are as follows:—

Stage I : For all the Candidates ;

(a) All the Candidates belonging to various categories shall be considered for allotment of seats as per their *inter-se-merit*.

(b) The Minority category candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seats by virtue of their *inter-se merit* and in Minority Quota seats by virtue of merit in their respective minority community to which the institution belongs.

(c) Backward Class Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *inter-se-merit* or in their respective Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.

(d) SBC Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *inter-se-merit* or in OBC Category seats, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.

Stage II : For respective groups of Backward Class Category Candidates ;

inter-se-merit amongst the reserved categories shall be operated at the end of each round if necessary against the unfilled reserved category seats as per merit and choice of the reserved category candidates. The seats remaining vacant from various category shall be filled in during *inter-se-merit* admission process as follows:—

(a) The remaining vacant seats shall be filled from among the candidates of their respective group of that particular Region where the vacancies exist, by *inter-se Regional merit*. The groups are as follows:—

Group I—

- (i) Scheduled Castes and Schedule Caste converted to Buddhism (S.C.)
- (ii) Scheduled Tribes (S.T.)

Group II—

- (i) Vimukta Jati (DT) (A)
- (ii) Nomadic Tribes [NT (B)]

Group III—

(i) Nomadic Tribes [NT (C)]

(ii) Nomadic Tribes [NT (D)]

(iii) Other Backward Classes (OBC) including SBC.

(b) If the seats still remain vacant, then the seats shall be filled from,—

(i) amongst the candidates of all categories mentioned above of that particular Region where the vacancies exist, by *inter-se* Regional merit. If the seats still remain vacant then the seats shall be filled,

(ii) amongst the candidates of the common merit list of the concerned Region. If the seats still remain vacant then the seats will be filled,

(iii) amongst the candidates of the common merit list of the *inter-se* state merit.

(c) the candidate should have claimed the constitutional reservation in the original application form. The candidates belonging to the backward class categories will be required to submit the Caste Certificate at the time of submitting the preference form, failing which the category claimed, shall not be granted and the candidate will be treated as general candidate.

(d) The candidates belonging to SC, ST, VJ/DT(A), NT-B, NT-C, NT-D, SBC, OBC categories shall be required to submit the Caste Validity Certificate or proof of application made for obtaining caste validity certificate at the time of submitting the preference form, failing which the category claimed, shall not be granted and the candidate shall be treated as a general candidate. However in case the certificate is not issued by the authorities till the date of submission of preference form, and the candidate is in possession of proof of application for validity of caste he or she shall be allowed to fill the preference form, provided he or she submits the proof of such application made. All such candidates will have to submit an undertaking as per the Proforma provided during counselling. Admission secured by an applicant with pending claim shall stand cancelled if the said claim is invalidated by the scrutiny committee.

(e) *Non-Creamy Layer Certificate*.— A candidate belonging to VJ/DT(A), NT-B, NT-C, NT-D & OBC (including SBC) shall be required to produce non-creamy layer certificate valid upto 31st March of the following year of the NEET examination, at the time of filling the preference form and also at the time of admission, failing which the category claim shall not be granted. It is mandatory to produce Non-Creamy Layer Certificate at the time of filling the preference form.

(f) 30 percent seats at the disposal of the Competent Authority shall be reserved for female candidates in all the courses. The female reservation shall be provided in 30 percent State seats and 70 percent regional seats of concerned category. If requisite number of female candidates are not available then these seats shall be offered to male candidates of respective category.

*Stage III : For all Backward Class Category Candidates—*If the seat reserved for group of Backward Class Category Candidate remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate of *inter-se-merit* of all Backward Class Category candidates taken together.*Stage IV : If the seat reserved for Backward Class Category Candidate remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate of general inter-se-merit.*(2) *Minority Candidature*.— The stages of computerised allotments are as follows :—(a) The Minority Category candidate shall be considered for allotment in Open category seats by virtue of their *inter-se-merit* and in Minority Quota seats by virtue of merit in their respective minority community to which the institution belongs.

(b) For minority seats, *inter-se-merit* shall be operated at the end of each round if necessary, against the unfilled minority category seats as per merit.

(c) Amongst the total seats at Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution, which are declared as "Minority Institutions" by the State Government, the seats distribution shall be as mentioned in Schedule.

13. Selection process through CAP round.— The Unaided Private Professional Education Institution shall admit candidates through the centralised admission process as below :—

(a) The selection of the candidates shall be made on the basis of preferences given by the candidates. Only a limited number of meritorious candidates shall be called for Counselling and asked to fill the preference form. The Counselling sessions are not meant for instant seat allocation. During these sessions, candidates are helped in exercising their preferences for various courses and the institutions. Seat allocation shall be made centrally at a later date on the basis of NEET merit list, eligibility and preferences exercised by the candidates.

(b) The preference form shall be available at the office of the document verification Center as notified by Competent Authority. The duly filled preference form should be submitted at the same office. The candidate should submit only one preference form. Submission of more than one form shall lead to disqualification.

(c) There shall be one or more rounds of selection of candidates depending on the availability of vacant seats. The selection will be on the basis of merit and the preferences submitted by the candidates in their preference form. For second or subsequent round no separate preference form will be filled by the candidate. The choices of courses and colleges, once entered in the record/data, after verification by the candidate, shall be final and irrevocable. This final data shall be used in entire selection process for the admission to first year Courses for the same academic year only.

(d) NEET merit list shall be operated from state merit list *Number-One* onwards in each round of selection. The candidate getting selected in previous round shall be considered for betterment in the subsequent round. The betterment herein means the higher preference exercised by the candidate. The Shift in such betterment shall be compulsory and mandatory except for those who have filled 'Status Retention Form'. Such a candidate who has filled Status Retention form will not be considered for any subsequent rounds of selection process for the same academic year. The last date for filling Status Retention Form will be notified along with the selection list of each CAP round.

(e) After concluding the first round, for the further rounds, candidates who have been allotted seats in the earlier rounds and joined the course, as also the candidates who have not been allotted any seat, shall be eligible. In the subsequent rounds, betterment chances will be given to the candidates who have already been allotted seats.

(f) It is hereby made abundantly clear that shifting on account of a better choice given by a candidate in any round, shall be effected only and only if such a candidate in the subsequent rounds is found entitled for 'change of course' or a 'change of college'. Mere possibility of a 'change in category' on account of availability of seat in the same college and/or same course in the further rounds shall not amount to "betterment" as such and therefore, no shifting shall be effected in such an eventuality. Such a 'change in category' shall include *inter-alia* change from reserved category to open category or *vice-versa*. The shift in such betterment shall be compulsory and mandatory, except those who have filled Status Retention Form.

(g) Based on preferences given, the seat shall be allotted on merit and the allotment shall be displayed on website.

(h) Candidates as per allotment should report alongwith all original certificates and a set of attested photocopies of all requisite documents at allotted college within the prescribed time. The Dean/Principal shall verify all the original documents before finalizing the admission.

(i) While filling the seats for any college or institution, 80 percent state quota seats shall be filled first followed by 70 percent regional quota seats.

(j) Earmarking for reserved category candidates - Reserved category candidate entitled to admission on the basis of merit in an open category seat will have the option of taking admission either against his respective category seat or on an open category seat. If he opts for the reserved category he will be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as reserved category candidate. In such case the particular seat in the college where he was eligible for admission against open seat shall be earmarked for a candidate belonging to the respective reserved category. Such earmarked seat will be made available immediately to the successive reserved category candidate from the same category merit during the counselling.

(k) A candidate who is selected but does not join the college or cancels the admission after joining, is not eligible for further selection process.

(l) Seats that have arisen or fallen vacant after the first round shall be made available at the second round of selection on the basis of preference form already submitted. No new preference form will be required to be filled in for any subsequent rounds. The vacancy position shall be made available on website before commencement of the next round.

(m) The *inter-se* round shall be conducted for remaining vacant seats from the category as per rule 12 (1), if necessary at the end of each round.

(n) The cut-off date for the course shall be as prescribed by the MCI or DCI from time to time.

14. Disqualification for Admission.— The selected candidates who cancel their admission after the cut-off date of respective course, shall not be eligible for admission for subsequent two years.

15. Payment of Fees.— The fee for the course shall be paid at the respective college by Demand Draft from any Nationalised or Scheduled Commercial Bank in favour of Dean or Principal of College, as applicable.

(a) Refund of Fees by the College After Change of College or Course or Cancellation of Admission: The candidate who has been admitted and desires to cancel the admissions shall submit application to the respective college or institute to cancel admission. The refund of fees to such candidate admitted in the college shall be made after deduction as under:

(i) Before cut-off date as declared by MCI or DCI - Rs. 1500 (Rs. One thousand five hundred only) to be deducted and rest of the fees to be refunded;

(ii) On or after cut-off date as declared by MCI or DCI -No refund of fees;

(iii) The Dean or Principal of the college shall be responsible for making refund of the fees, after receiving cancellation letter from the candidate. If the candidate expires or becomes invalid within 90 days from the date of admission, no deduction shall be made.

16. Institution Level Round.— If the seats remain vacant after all CAP Rounds, the said seats shall be filled in by the institution through Institution Level Round with the prior approval of the Competent Authority. The institute shall invite applications from desirous candidates

who are declared eligible in the NEET. The admission shall be granted by the institution strictly on the basis of *inter-se-merit* of the NEET, as per the instructions from the Competent Authority.

17. Cancellation.— The selected candidate must join the college at which he or she is selected, on or before the date prescribed by the Competent Authority, failing which his admission shall stand cancelled. The selected candidate who has joined the college and desire to cancel the admission should cancel it, at the respective college. The college shall accept the cancellation letter and inform the Competent Authority alongwith copy of the cancellation letter immediately.

18. Approval of Merit List and Admitted Candidates List.— (1) After completion of Admission process, every Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall submit the Admission-approval proposal to the Directorate of Medical Education and Research, and the Admission Regulating Authority in accordance with the sub-section (5) of section 9 of the Act.

(2) The admission-approval proposal shall include the list of all candidates admitted under Reservation, marks at qualifying examinations etc, as well as the required documents including list of candidates who have applied and list of admitted candidates at institution level.

19. Conduct and Discipline.— (a) Failure of the candidate in making full and correct statements in the application form or suppression of any information would lead to disqualification of the candidate, even at later date. Such a candidate shall be debarred from the entire selection process.

(b) It is responsibility of every candidate to submit proper documents. Any attempt to submit documents which are not genuine will lead to cancellation of the admission of the candidate, forfeiture of the fees, deposits and expulsion of the candidate from the college by the Competent Authority or by his authorised official. The name of such candidate/s shall be deleted from the State Merit List and he or she shall not be eligible for further rounds of the selection process and shall be debarred from the selection process.

(c) The student while studying in the medical or dental Courses, if found indulging in antinational activities, unlawful activities or ragging in any form, contrary to the provisions of Acts and Law enforced by the Government, shall be liable to be expelled from the college by the Dean or Principal of the College.

(d) Pursuant to orders in Writ Petition (Civil) No. 656 of 1999, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, has directed the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India, to take all necessary steps to curb the menace of ragging and take severe action against the students involved in such activities.

(e) As per the provisions of the "Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999", (Mah. XXXIII of 1999) students indulging in ragging shall be liable to be punished under the Act.

(f) In case of dispute arising relating to the issues dealt herein above shall be dealt with, by the competent Authority.

MAHARASHTRA UNAIDED PRIVATE PROFESSIONAL EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS (REGULATION OF ADMISSIONS AND FEES) ACT, 2015.

MED-1016/CR 69/16/Edu-2.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015), the Government of Maharashtra hereby makes the following rules to regulate the admissions to the First year of the Full Time Professional Ayurved, Unani, Homoeopathy, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Prosthetic and Orthotics and BSc. Nursing undergraduate courses in the Unaided Private professional Educational Institutions in the State of Maharashtra, namely;

1. *Short title and commencement.*—(1) These rules may be called the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Undergraduate Ayurved, Unani, Homoeopathy, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Prosthetic and Orthotics and BSc. Nursing Courses) Rules, 2016.

(2) They shall come into force with effect from the date they are published in the gazette.

2. *Definitions.*—(1) In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,-

(a) "Act" means the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. Act XXVIII of 2015);

(b) "Admission Reporting Institution" means a institution where the Candidate shall report for confirmation for admission by submission of documents and payment of fees;

(c) "Application Form" means the prescribed form to be filled up online or offline by the candidate for admission to the Courses as defined in clause (f);

(d) "CAP Seats" means the seats filled in through the centralized process of admission carried out by the Competent Authority;

(e) "CET" means the Common Entrance Test (CET) conducted for admission to the Courses under this rule;

(f) "Courses" means the Undergraduate courses in Ayurved, Unani, Homoeopathy, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Prosthetic and Orthotics and Bsc. Nursing, as the case may be, conducted in the State as per the approval of the respective Central Council ;

(g) "Council" means respective Central Council for the courses.

(h) "Document Verification Centre" means the city or town declared by the Competent Authority where the document verification is to be conducted.

(i) "Eligible Candidates" means the candidates who are eligible for different professional courses as notified by the Government, from time to time under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act;

(j) "Region" means the area in respective Statutory Development Board for Vidarbha, Marathwada and Rest of Maharashtra,;

(k) "HSC" means the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Standard XII) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education as per provisions of the Maharashtra Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Boards Act, 1965 (Mah. XLI of 1965) or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;

(l) "Institutional Quota" means seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Institution level as declared by the Government or appropriate authority from time to time;

(m) "inter-se-merit" means the order of merit in respect of various classes/category of Candidates;

(n) "Minority Quota" means seats earmarked for the Minority Community students from within the State of Maharashtra, belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs;

(o) "MUHS" means the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences established under sub-section (i) of section 3 of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998 (Mah. X of 1999);

(p) "Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)" means a candidate or person registered as an Overseas Citizen of India as declared by the Central Government under section 7A of the Citizenship Act 1955 and includes Persons of Indian Origin (PIO).

Explanation.—For the purposes of this clause, all the existing Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) cardholders registered under notification of the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs No. F.No. 26011/04/98- F. I. dated 19th August 2002 and shall now be deemed to be Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) card holders by virtue of Notification of Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, No. 25024/9/2014-F.I. dated 9th January 2015 ;

(q) "Qualifying Examination" means the Higher Secondary Certificate (12th Standard) or equivalent examination, from an institution situated in the State of Maharashtra with English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology (Botany and Zoology) at the time of examination.

(r) "SSC" means the Secondary School Certificate (Standard X) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education as per the provisions of the Maharashtra Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Boards Act, 1965 (Mah. XLI of 1965) or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;

(2) Words and expressions used but not defined in these rules, shall have the same meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

3. *Invitation of Application Form.*— The Competent Authority shall invite Online or Offline Application Form, in the form prescribed by it, from the candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process (CAP) for seeking admission to the Courses for which the CET is required for the respective academic year.

4. *Declaration of medium, pattern, syllabus, schedule, etc. for CET.*—

(1) Subject to the regulation of the respective council, if any, the Competent Authority shall, for the purposes of conducting the CET, declare the following —

(a) Medium of CET;

(b) Pattern of CET;

(c) Mode of CET;

(d) Schedule of CET;

(e) Issue of Hall Ticket;

(f) Declaration of Result, etc.

(g) the detailed schedule regarding the CAP rounds, admission on the basis of Institutional Quota, admission by Minority Educational Institution, and other matters relating to admission; and

(h) any other matter which is, or may be, necessary for the purposes of conducting the CET.

(2) The Syllabus relating to the CET shall be declared by the Competent Authority with prior approval of the Government of Maharashtra.

5. *Candidature Type :*

(1) *Maharashtra State Candidature -*

(A)	(i) The candidate must be an Indian National.

However, except for the year 2016, candidate who has passed SSC or equivalent examination from an institute situated outside Maharashtra State and HSC or equivalent examination from an institute situated within Maharashtra State is eligible for seeking admission to the courses, provided that he or she is Domicile of Maharashtra.
(vii)	The candidate must have passed the qualifying examination.
(B)	Exception for clause (A) (vi) for SSC or clause (A) (vii) for HSC or equivalent examinations for children of employees of the Government of Maharashtra or its Undertakings :—
i.	The children of such employees of the Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking who have joined service since beginning at a place situated outside the State of Maharashtra but who have been transferred to a place situated within the State of Maharashtra shall be eligible for admission even though such children might have passed the SSC or HSC or equivalent examination from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra; provided that, such employee of the Government of Maharashtra or its Undertaking must have been posted or transferred or deputed at a place of work located in the State of Maharashtra and also must have reported for duty i.e. joined the duty before the last date of submission of preference form.
ii.	The candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at (i) above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such employee of Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking has reported for duty, as a proof that such employee has joined the office and/or reported for duty before the cut-off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of Preference Form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer or posting order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting. A copy of transfer or posting order should also be produced at the time of filling the preference form.
iii.	The children of such employees of Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking who have been transferred or deputed to a place situated outside the State of Maharashtra or who have returned to the State of Maharashtra after initial transfer or deputation shall be eligible for admission even though such children might have passed the SSC or HSC or equivalent examinations from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra.
iv.	The candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at (iii) above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such employee of Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking has reported for duty, as a proof that such employee has joined the office and/or reported for duty before the cut-off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of Preference Form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer or posting order number and date, date of joining

	and present status of posting. A copy of transfer or posting order should also be produced at the time of filling the preference form.
(C)	Exception for clause (A) (vi) for SSC or for clause (A) (vii) for HSC or equivalent examinations for Children of employees of the Government of India or its undertaking :— (i) The children of the employees of Government of India or its Undertaking shall be eligible for admission even though they might have passed the SSC and/or HSC or equivalent examination from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra; provided that, such an employee of Government of India or its undertaking must have been transferred from out of Maharashtra state and posted at a place of work, located in the State of Maharashtra and also must have reported for duty, i.e. joined the duty before the last date of submission of preference form. (ii) The candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at (i) above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such an employee of Government of India or its undertaking has reported for duty, as a proof of the fact that such employee has joined the office or reported for duty before the cut-off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of preference form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer and posting order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting. A copy of transfer and posting order should also be produced at the time of filling the preference form.

(2) *Minority Candidature.*—The Maharashtra domiciled Candidate belonging to a particular linguistic or religious minority community from within the State fulfilling eligibility criteria as per sub-rule (1) of rule 5 shall be eligible under this category.

(3) *NRI Candidature.*—The candidate who fulfils the conditions as defined in clause (n) of section 2 of the Act shall be eligible under this category.

6. *Eligibility.*—

(a) *Eligibility Marks for Admission to BAMS or BHMS or BUMS or BPTb or BOTH or BASLP or BP&O and B.Sc. Nursing.*—The eligibility for admission to the first year of the course shall be such as notified by the Government under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act. Candidates shall be selected to above stated courses on basis of merit in CET.

(b) *Additional eligibility For BUMS.*—The candidate should have passed SSC or equivalent examination from the recognized board with Urdu or Arabic or Persian Language as one of the subject, OR as prescribed by respective council from time to time.

(c) *Cut-off date for eligibility.*—The eligibility of the candidate shall be determined or decided for all purposes including for applicability of all these Rules and Regulations by considering the last date of submission of preference form as the cut-off date. It is made abundantly clear that if a candidate is found ineligible as on the last date of submission of preference form, in terms of these Rules and Regulations, and if such ineligible candidate acquires the requisite eligibility after the aforesaid cut-off date i.e. after the last date of submission of preference form, such subsequent acquisition of eligibility will not make an ineligible candidate eligible for any purpose whatsoever, much less for the purpose of admission.

7. *Sanctioned Intake Seats for various Courses.*—The Sanctioned Intake for First Year of undergraduate Medical and Dental Course shall be as per the approval given by the Authority which is competent for giving approval to respective courses and affiliation given by the MUHS.

8. *Allocation of Seats.*—The percentage of allocation of seats for various types of candidates through CET for First Year of the Courses shall be as per the respective Central Council regulations, and in accordance with the policy of the Government as specified in the Schedule.

(1) *Maharashtra State Candidature Seats.*—The Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature as specified in sub-rule (1) of rule 5, shall be eligible for these seats.

(2) *Minority Candidature Seats.*—The Candidates having Candidature mentioned in sub-rule (2) of rule 5 shall be eligible for these seats as specified in the Schedule. These seats shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 6 of the Act.

(3) *Institutional Quota Seats.*—The Institution can admit Eligible Candidates against 15 percent of the Sanctioned Intake, as per the Schedule, subject to following conditions, namely:—

(i) the candidates having candidature mentioned in sub-rules (1), (2) and (3) of rule 5 shall be eligible for these seats, as may be applicable;

(ii) the NRI Candidates shall be admitted under the Institution quota seats, subject to the approval by Admission Regulating Authority;

(iii) if the seats reserved for the NRI remains vacant, those vacant seats may be filled in by the Institution, from the Eligible Maharashtra State Candidature as given in sub-rules (1) and (2) of rule 5 on the basis of *inter-se-merit* of CET.

9. *Distribution of Seats.* The distribution of seats shall be allotted by the Competent Authority;

(i) *Distribution of Seats in State level 30 percent Quota.*— Out of the seats at the disposal of the Competent Authority, 30 percent of such seats shall be first made available for candidates from the State and these seats shall be filled on the basis state merit list of CET. There shall be constitutional and female reservations in these seats as per prevailing rules;

(ii) *Distribution of seats in Regional level 70 percent Quota.*— After the exclusion of State level 30 percent quota seats, referred in (i) above, the remaining 70 percent seats from the colleges situated in the respective region shall be filled from amongst the Candidates who have passed HSC, subject to the constitutional and female reservation as per prevailing rules.

(iii) *Criteria for 70 percent Regional Quota seats for candidates who have passed qualifying examination from Maharashtra State.*— Region of the candidates for selection under 70 percent regional quota seat will be the region from where he or she has passed HSC or equivalent examination;

(iv) *Criteria for 70 percent Regional Quota for candidates who have passed qualifying examination from Institution situated outside Maharashtra State.*— For candidates who have passed qualifying examination from Outside the State of Maharashtra:

(v) Selection to Medical and Dental courses at the Private Unaided institutions through CAP shall be subject to permission or approval or affiliation from, (1) Government of India; (2) Respective Central Counsel; (3) Government of Maharashtra; and (4) MUHS. The "intake capacity" at a particular college shall be the 'minimum number of seats' permitted by the above said authorities;

(vi) As per Maharashtra Private Professional Educational Institutions (Reservation of seats for admission for SC, ST, Denotified Tribes -Vinukta Jatis, NT and OBC) Act, 2006 (Mah. XXX of 2006) dated 1st August 2006, 25 percent seats of the total intake capacity of Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions shall be allotted to the constitutional reservation category candidates;

(vii) There shall be 30 percent State and 70 percent Regional Quota for Ayurved and Homoeopathy undergraduate courses, from the seats available at the disposal of Competent Authority. There shall be 30 percent female reservation under both.

(viii) All the seats for BUMS, BPTH, BOT, BASLP, BP&O and B.Sc. (Nursing) courses will shall be filled by the candidates from the State Level Merit List only. There will not be 70 percent regional quota for these courses;

10. *Preparation of Merit List.*—The Competent Authority shall conduct the examination, evaluate the answer sheets and declare the result;

(i) *Preparation of Merit List for Selection to the Courses.*—Merit list for selection to course shall be prepared on the basis of Marks obtained by the candidate at the CET. The state merit list will be in descending order of merit of CET. The merit list shall indicate state merit list number, regional merit list number, category merit list number.

(ii) *Tie-breakers.*—In case of equal marks at the CET, the following procedure shall be adopted for deciding *inter-se-merit*,

First level.—A candidate with higher marks in Biology at the CET Examination shall be preferred, if the tie still persists then:

Second level.—A candidate with higher marks in Chemistry at the CET Examination shall be preferred, if the tie still persists then:

Third level.—A candidate with higher percentage of aggregate marks at the SSC or equivalent examination shall be preferred, if the tie still persists, then:

Fourth Level.—An older candidate shall be preferred over a younger candidate.

(iii) *Method for calculating NRI merit* - The merit list for NRI Candidates stated at sub-rule (3) of rule 5 shall be prepared on the basis of the percentage of marks of Qualifying examination.

11. *Centralised Admission Process (CAP).*—

(i) The Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall admit Candidates through the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) as referred in sub-section (3) of section 3 of the Act. The stages of CAP shall be as mentioned below, namely:-

(a) display or publication of college wise, subject wise and category wise distribution of seats on website;

(b) display or publication of Time Schedule and Venue for preference form filling process on website;

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(c) display or publication of Brochure of Preference Form filling and counselling process for admission to Courses;

(d) verification of documents and endorsement of eligibility of the successful candidates for the admission process at the document verification centers i.e. Mumbai, Pune, Aurangabad and Nagpur followed by filling up of Preference Form by the eligible candidates;

(e) display or publication of allotment of seats for Round-I of CAP by way of computerised process and joining of the candidates at respective institution as per the allotment within stipulated time;

(f) display or publication of subsequent computerised round(s) if seats remain vacant after completion of CAP Round-I;

(ii) Candidate shall be given a chance to retain a seat that has been allotted, by way of status retention form at the end of each CAP round. If a Candidate accepts the offered seat and he do not want to participate in any further rounds of seat allocation, such candidate shall not be considered in subsequent rounds of admission.

12. CAP allotment stages and process of allotment —

Allotment of seats under CAP shall be made in the following manner—

(1) Maharashtra State Candidature ; The stages of computerised allotments are as follows :—

Stage : I : For all the Candidates,—

(a) All the Candidates belonging to various categories shall be considered for allotment of seats as per their *inter-se merit*.

(b) The Minority category candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seats by virtue of their *inter-se merit* and in Minority Quota seats by virtue of merit in their respective minority community to which the institution belongs.

(c) Backward Class Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *Inter-se merit* or in their respective Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.

(d) SBC Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *inter-se merit* or in OBC Category seats, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.

Stage : II : For respective groups of Backward Class Category Candidates,—

inter-se-merit amongst the reserved categories shall be operated at the end of each round if necessary against the unfilled reserved category seats as per merit and choice of the reserved category candidates. The seats remaining vacant from various category shall be filled in during *inter-se-merit* admission process as follows :—

(a) The remaining vacant seats shall be filled from among the candidates of their respective group of that particular Region where the vacancies exist, by *inter-se* Regional merit. The groups are as follows :—

Group I

(i) Scheduled Castes and Schedule Caste converted to Buddhism (S.C.)

(ii) Scheduled Tribes (S.T.)

Group II

- (i) Vimukta Jati (DT) (A)
- (ii) Nomadic Tribes [NT (B)]

Group III

- (i) Nomadic Tribes [NT (C)]
- (ii) Nomadic Tribes [NT (D)]
- (iii) Other Backward Classes (OBC) including SBC.

(b) If the seats still remain vacant, then the seats shall be filled from,—

(i) amongst the candidates of all categories mentioned above of that particular Region where the vacancies exist, by *inter-se* Regional merit. If the seats still remain vacant then the seats shall be filled,

(ii) amongst the candidates of the common merit list of the concerned Region. If the seats still remain vacant then the seats will be filled,

(iii) amongst the candidates of the common merit list of the *inter-se* state merit.

(c) the candidate should have claimed the constitutional reservation in the original application form. The candidates belonging to the backward class categories will be required to submit the Caste Certificate at the time of submitting the preference form, failing which the category claimed, shall not be granted and the candidate will be treated as general candidate.

(d) The candidates belonging to SC, ST, VJ/DT(A), NT-B, NT-C, NT-D, SBC, OBC categories shall be required to submit the Caste Validity Certificate or proof of application made for obtaining caste validity certificate at the time of submitting the preference form, failing which the category claimed, shall not be granted and the candidate shall be treated as a general candidate. However in case the certificate is not issued by the authorities till the date of submission of preference form, and the candidate is in possession of proof of application for validity of caste he or she shall be allowed to fill the preference form, provided he or she submits the proof of such application made. All such candidates will have to submit an undertaking as per the Proforma provided during counselling. Admission secured by an applicant with pending claim shall stand cancelled if the said claim is invalidated by the scrutiny committee.

(e) Non-Creamy Layer Certificate : A candidate belonging to VJ/DT(A), NT-B, NT-C, NT-D & OBC (including SBC) shall be required to produce Non-Creamy Layer Certificate valid upto 31st March of the following year of the CET examination, at the time of filling the preference form and also at the time of admission, failing which the category claim shall not be granted. It is mandatory to produce Non-Creamy Layer Certificate at the time of filling the preference form.

(f) 30 percent seats at the disposal of the Competent Authority shall be reserved for female candidates in all the courses. The female reservation shall be provided in 30 percent State seats and 70 percent regional seats of concerned category. If requisite number of female candidates are not available then these seats shall be offered to male candidates of respective category.

Stage III : For all Backward Class Category Candidates,—

If the seat reserved for group of Backward Class Category Candidate remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate of *inter-se-merit* of all Backward Class Category candidates taken together.

Stage : IV: If the seat reserved for Backward Class Category Candidate remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate of General *inter-se-merit*.

(2) *Minority Candidature.*—The stages of computerised allotments are as follows :—

(a) The Minority Category candidate shall be considered for allotment in Open category seats by virtue of their *inter-se merit* and in Minority Quota seats by virtue of merit in their respective minority community to which the institution belongs.

(b) For minority seats, *inter-se-merit* shall be operated at the end of each round if necessary, against the unfilled minority category seats as per merit.

(c) Amongst the total seats at Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution, which are declared as "Minority Institutions" by the State Government, the seats distribution shall be as mentioned in schedule.

13. *Selection process through CAP round.*—The Unaided Private Professional Education Institution shall admit candidates through the centralised admission process is below :—

(a) The selection of the candidates shall be made on the basis of preferences given by the candidates. Only a limited number of meritorious candidates shall be called for Counselling and asked to fill the preference form. The Counselling Sessions are not meant for instant seat allocation at these offices. During these sessions candidates are helped in exercising their preferences for various courses, and the institutions. Seat allocation shall be made centrally at a later date on the basis of CET merit list, eligibility and preferences exercised by the candidates.

(b) The preference form shall be available at the office of the Document Verification Center as notified by Competent Authority. The duly filled preference form should be submitted at the same office. The candidate shall submit only one preference form. Submission of more than one form shall lead to disqualification.

(c) There shall be one or more rounds of selection of candidates depending on the availability of vacant seats. The selection shall be on the basis of merit and the preferences submitted by the candidates in their preference form. For second or subsequent round no separate preference form shall be filled by the candidate. The choices of courses and colleges, once entered in the record or data, after verification by the candidate, shall be final and irrevocable. This final data shall be used in entire selection process for the admission to first year Courses for the same academic year only.

(d) The CET merit list shall be operated from State Merit List *Number-One* onwards in each round of selection. The candidate getting selected in previous round shall considered for betterment in the subsequent round. The betterment herein means the higher preference exercised by the candidate. The shift in such betterment shall be compulsory and mandatory except for those who have filled 'Status Retention Form.' Such a candidate who has filled Status Retention Form shall not be considered for any subsequent rounds of selection process for the same academic year. The last date for filling Status Retention Form will be notified along with the selection list of each CAP round.

(e) After concluding the first round, for the further rounds candidates who have been allotted seats in the earlier rounds and joined the course, as also the candidates who have not been allotted any seat, shall be eligible. In the subsequent rounds, betterment chances shall be given to the candidates who have already been allotted seats.

(f) It is hereby made abundantly clear that shifting on account of a better choice given by a candidate in any round, shall be effected only and only if such a candidate in the subsequent rounds is found entitled for 'change of course' or a 'change of college'. Mere possibility of a 'change in category' on account of availability of seat in the same college and/or same course in the further rounds shall not amount to betterment as such and therefore, no shifting shall be effected in such an eventuality. Such a 'change in category' shall include *inter-alia* change from reserved category to open category or vice-versa. The shift in such betterment shall be compulsory and mandatory, except those who have filled Status Retention Form.

(g) Based on preferences given, the seat will be allotted on merit and the allotment will be displayed on website.

(h) Candidates as per allotment should report alongwith all original certificates and a set of attested photocopies of all requisite document at allotted college within the prescribe time. The Dean/Principal should verify all the original documents before finalizing the admission.

(i) While filling the seats for any college or institution, 30 per cent. State quota seats shall be filled first followed by 70 per cent. regional quota seats .

(j) *Earmarking for reserved category candidates* .— Reserved category candidate entitled to admission on the basis of merit in an open category seat will have the option of taking admission either against his respective category seat or on an open category seat. If he opts for the reserved category he will be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as reserved category candidate. In such case the particular seat in the college where he was eligible for admission against open seat shall be earmarked for a candidate belonging to the respective reserved category. Such earmarked seat will be made available immediately to the successive reserved category candidate from the same category merit during the counselling.

(k) A candidate who is selected but does not join the college or cancels the admission after joining, is not eligible for further selection process.

(l) Seats that have arisen or fallen vacant after the first round shall be made available at the second round of selection on the basis of preference form already submitted. No new preference form shall be required to be filled in for any subsequent rounds. The vacancy position shall be made available on website before commencement of the next round.

(m) The *inter-se* round shall be conducted for remaining vacant seats from the category as per rule 12 (1), if necessary at the end of each round.

(n) The cut-off date for Course will be as prescribed by the respective Central Council from time to time.

14. *Disqualification for Admission*.—The selected candidates, who cancel their admission after the cut-off-date of respective course, shall not be eligible to appear at CET examination for subsequent two years.

15. The fee for the course shall be paid at the respective college by Demand Draft from any Nationalised or Scheduled Commercial Bank in favour of Dean or Principal of College, as applicable.

(a) *Refund of Fees by the College after change of College or Course or Cancellation of admission*.—The candidate who has been admitted and desires to cancel the admissions shall

submit application to the respective college or institute to cancel admission. The refund of fees to such candidate admitted in the college shall be made after deduction as under :—

(i) Before cut-off date as declared by MCI or DCI - Rs.1500 (Rs. One thousand five hundred only) to be deducted and rest of the fees to be refunded;

(ii) On or after cut-off date as declared by respective Central Council -No refund of fees;

(iii) The Dean or Principal of the college shall be responsible for making refund of the fees, after receiving cancellation letter from the candidate. If the candidate expires or becomes invalid within 90 days from the date of admission, no deduction shall be made.

16. *Institution Level Round.*—If the seats remain vacant after all CAP Rounds, the said seats shall be filled in by the institution through Institution Level Round with the prior approval of the Competent Authority. The institute shall invite applications from desirous candidates who are declared eligible in the CET. The admission shall be granted by the institution strictly on the basis of *inter-se-merit* of the CET as per the instructions from the Competent Authority.

17. *Cancellation.*—The selected candidate must join the college at which he or she is selected, on or before the date prescribed by the Competent Authority, failing which his or her admission shall stands cancelled. The selected candidate who has joined the college and wants to cancel the admission should cancel it, at the respective college. The college shall accept the cancellation letter and inform the Competent Authority alongwith copy of the cancellation letter immediately.

18. *Approval of Merit List and Admitted Candidates List.*—

(1) After completion of Admission process every Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall submit the Admission- approval proposal to the Directorate of Medical Education and Research or the Directorate of Ayush, as the case may be and the Admission Regulating Authority in accordance with the sub-section (5) of section 9 of the Act.

(2) The admission-approval proposal shall include the list of all candidates admitted under Reservation, marks at qualifying examinations etc., as well as the required documents including list of candidates who have applied and list of admitted candidates at institution level.

19. *Conduct and Discipline:*

(a) Failure of the candidate in making full and correct statements in the application form or suppression of any information would lead to disqualification of the candidate, even at later date. Such a candidate shall be debarred from the entire selection process.

(b) It is responsibility of every candidate to submit proper documents. Any attempt to submit documents which are not genuine will lead to cancellation of the admission of the candidate, forfeiture of the fees, deposits and expulsion of the candidate from the college by the Competent Authority or by his authorised official. The name of such candidate/s shall be deleted from the State Merit List and he or she shall not be eligible for further rounds of the selection process and shall be debarred from the selection process.

(c) The student while studying in the Health Sciences Courses, if found indulging in antinational activities, unlawful activities or ragging in any form, contrary to the provisions of Acts and Law enforced by the Government, shall be liable to be expelled from the college by the Dean or Principal of the College.

(d) Pursuant to orders in Writ Petition (Civil) No. 656 of 1999, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, has directed the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India, to take all necessary steps to curb the menace of ragging and take severe action against the students involved in such activities.

(e) As per the provisions of the Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act of 1999 (Mah. XXXIII of 1999), students indulging in ragging shall be liable to be punished under the Act.

(f) In case of dispute arising relating to the issues dealt herein above shall be dealt with, by the Competent Authority.

2. In rule 5 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Undergraduate Medical and Dental Courses) Rules, 2016, in sub-rule (I),

(i) for entry (A), the following entry shall be substituted, namely :—

"(A) (i) The candidate must be an Indian National.

(ii) The Candidate should be Domicile of the State of Maharashtra and should possess Domicile Certificate issued by the authority in the State of Maharashtra who is competent to issue such certificate for education purpose. However, candidates, other than the candidates mentioned in clause (vii) (b) hereunder, need not fulfill this eligibility criterion for the Academic Year 2016-17 provided all other eligibility conditions, as set out herein, are fulfilled by the candidates.

(iii) Subject to the eligibility of age prescribed by the Medical Council of India and by Dental Council of India, the candidate must have completed 17 years of age on or

before 31st December of the year of admission for the course. The Birth Certificate indicating name of the candidate, Secondary School Certificate examination i.e. SSC or equivalent examination certificate awarded by a recognized Board or School Leaving Certificate endorsing the date of birth shall constitute a valid proof of age.

(iv) The candidate must be medically fit and should possess a Medical Certificate issued by registered and recognized Medical Practitioner.

(b) In case of a candidate who has passed SSC or equivalent examination from an institute outside the State of Maharashtra is also eligible provided he has passed HSC or qualifying examination from an institute in the State of Maharashtra and also possess Domicile Certificate issued by the authority, who is competent to issue such certificate in the State of Maharashtra for educational purpose."

(ii) in entry (B), for the brackets, letters and words "(A) (vi) for SSC or clause (A) (vii)" the brackets, letters and words "(A) (v) for SSC or clause (A) (vi)" shall be substituted;

(iii) in entry (C), for the brackets, letters and words "(A) (vi) for SSC or clause (A) (vii)" the brackets, letters and words "(A) (v) for SSC or clause (A) (vi)" shall be substituted.

1. These rules may be called the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Undergraduate Medical and Dental Courses) (Amendment) Rules, 2019.

2. In rule 5 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Undergraduate Medical and Dental Courses) Rules, 2016, in sub-rule (1) in entry (A), after sub-entry (vii) the following sub-entry shall be added, namely :—

2. For rule 9 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Undergraduate Medical and Dental Courses) Rules, 2016 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules"), the following Rule shall be substituted, namely :—

"9. Distribution of Seats.—The Distribution of seats shall be allotted by the Competent Authority.

(i) All the seats at the disposal of Competent Authority shall be made available for all the candidates from the State and these seats shall be filled in on the basis of NEET merit list. There shall be constitutional and female reservation in these seats as per the prevailing rules in this behalf;

(ii) Selection to Medical and Dental courses at the Private Unaided institutions through CAP shall be subject to permission or approval or affiliation from (1) Government of India; (2) MCI or DCI; (3) Government of Maharashtra; and (4) MUHS. The "intake capacity" at a particular college shall be the 'minimum number of seats' permitted by the above said authorities;

(iii) As per Maharashtra Private Professional Educational Institutions (Reservation of seats for admission for SC, ST, Denotified Tribes -Vimukta Jatis, NT and OBC) Act, 2006 (Mah. XXX of 2006), 25 percent seats of the total intake capacity of Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions shall be allotted to the Constitutional reservation category candidates;".

3. In rule 12 of the principal Rules, in sub-rule (1), for clause (f), the following clause shall be substituted, namely :—

"(f) 30 percent seats at the disposal of the Competent Authority shall be reserved for female candidates in all the courses. If requisite numbers of female candidates are not available, then these seats shall be offered to male candidates of respective category."

4. In rule 13 of the principal Rules, clause (i) shall be deleted.

६) एसईबीसी प्रवर्गासाठी संदर्भ क्र. ३ ते ५ अन्वये देण्यात आलेले आदेश रद्द समजण्यात यावे.

७) एस.ई.बी.सी. उमेदवारांना संदर्भ क्र.६ अन्वये देण्यात आलेले लाभ कायम ठेवण्यात येत असून एस.ई.बी.सी. उमेदवार ईडब्ल्यूएस लाभासाठी पात्र असल्यास त्यांना विहित प्रमाणपत्राच्या आधारे ईडब्ल्यूएस आरक्षणाचा लाभ घेता येईल.

८) संदर्भ क्र.६ अन्वये एसईबीसी उमेदवारांना आर्थिकदृष्ट्या दुर्बल घटकांचा देण्यात आलेला लाभ खालीलप्रमाणे अनुज्ञेय राहिल:-

No.MCI-34(41)/2018-Med./109835.— In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 33 of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956), the Medical Council of India with the previous sanction of the Central Government,

hereby makes the following Regulations to further amend the "Regulations on Graduate Medical Education, 1997", namely: -

- (i) These Regulations may be called the "Regulations on Graduate Medical Education (Amendment), 2018."
(ii) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- In the "Regulations on Graduate Medical Education, 1997", following clause shall be added after 5A(3):-
5A(4) - In order to prevent seat blocking in common counseling for admission to MBBS course and permissibility to exercise fresh choice during counseling, forfeiture of fee shall be in accordance with the Matrix contained in "Appendix - F".
- In the "Regulations on Graduate Medical Education, 1997", in Appendix 'F' the following "Note" shall be added below the Time Schedule for completion of the admission process for first MBBS course for the academic year 2018-19 and onwards: -

Note:

- All India Quota Seats (15%) remaining vacant after last date for joining, i.e. 22nd July of the present Admission year will be deemed to be converted into State quota.
- Institute/college/courses permitted after 31st May will not be considered for admission/ allotment of seats for current academic year.
- In any circumstances, last date for admission/joining will not be extended after 31st August.
- For the purpose of ensuring faithful obedience to the above time-schedule, Saturday, Sunday or Holidays (except National Holiday on account of Independence Day, 15th August) shall be treated as working days.
- The following Matrix shall be applicable with regard to permissibility to students to exercise fresh choice during counseling:-

२. आरक्षणाचे स्वरूप

- १) अनाथ आरक्षणाची अंमलबजावणी दिव्यांग आरक्षणाच्या धर्तीवर करण्यात येईल.
- २) सदर आरक्षण तसेच शैक्षणिक संस्था वसतिगृहे व व्यावसायिक शिक्षण प्रवेशासाठी आणि शासकीय पदभरतीसाठी लागू राहील.
- ३) अनाथांसाठी आरक्षित पदे ही पदभरतीसाठी उपलब्ध एकूण पदसंख्येच्या तसेच शैक्षणिक प्रवेशासाठी उपलब्ध एकूण जागांच्या १% इतकी असतील.

 २. अनाथ आरक्षण प्रवर्गासाठी उपलब्ध जागा विषम संख्येत असल्यास आधी जागांची समप्रमाणात विभागणी करावी व उरलेले अधिकचे १ पद हे पहिल्या पदभरतीमध्ये संस्थात्मक प्रवर्गासाठी उपलब्ध करून द्यावे, व त्यापुढील पदभरतीमध्येसुद्धा विषम जागा उपलब्ध असतील तर उपरोक्तप्रमाणे जागांची सम-समान विभागणी केल्यावर उरलेले अधिकचे १ पद हे त्या पदभरतीमध्ये संस्थावाह्य

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प्रवर्गासाठी उपलब्ध करून देण्यात यावे, अशा प्रकारे अधिकचे पद आळीपाळीने संस्थात्मक व संस्थावाह्य प्रवर्गासाठी उपलब्ध करून देण्यात यावे.

 - त्या पुढील भरतीप्रक्रियेमध्ये पुन्हा तीन पदे उपलब्ध झाल्यास एक पद संस्थात्मक व दोन पदे संस्थावाह्य उमेदवारांना उपलब्ध होतील.

३. अटी व शर्ती

- ४) अनाथ आरक्षणाचा लाभ घेऊन शासन सेवेत रुजू होणाऱ्या उमेदवाराला अनाथ प्रमाणपत्र पडताळणीच्या अधीन राहून तात्पुरत्या स्वरूपात नियुक्ती देण्यात येईल. नियुक्ती पश्चात ६ महिन्यांच्या कालावधीत आयुक्त, महिला व बाल विकास, पुणे यांचेकडून अनाथ प्रमाणपत्राची पडताळणी करून घेण्याची जबाबदारी संबंधित नियुक्ती प्राधिकारी/ विभाग प्रमुख यांची राहिल.
- ५) अनाथ आरक्षण लागू करताना शासन निर्णयातील तरतुदीचे काटेकोरपणे पालन करण्याची जबाबदारी संबंधित प्राधिकरणाची राहिल.

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- ४) बालगृहात/अनाथालयात दाखल करण्यात येणाऱ्या काही अनाथ बालकांच्या शैक्षणिक प्रवेशावेळी त्यांची जात अंदाजे नमूद करण्यात येते. अशा अनाथांच्या जात प्रमाणपत्राची वैधता होऊ शकत नसल्यास सदर उमेदवाराचा समावेश पदभरतीनंतर खुल्या प्रवर्गात करण्यात यावा.
 - ५) सदर शासन निर्णय अंमलात येण्यापूर्वी ज्या पात्र अनाथांना महिला व बाल विकास विभागामार्फत अनाथ प्रमाणपत्र निर्गमित करण्यात आलेले आहे त्यातील "अ" व "ब" प्रवर्गाचे अनाथ प्रमाणपत्रप्राप्त अनाथांना या शासन निर्णयानुसार "संस्थात्मक" प्रवर्गातील अनाथ समजण्यात येईल. व पूर्वीच्या "क" प्रवर्गाचे प्रमाणपत्र निर्गमित करण्यात आलेल्या अनाथांना या शासन निर्णयानुसार "संस्थाबाह्य" प्रवर्गातील अनाथ समजण्यात येईल. त्यांना सुधारीत प्रमाणपत्रे देण्याने निर्गमित करण्याची आवश्यकता नाही. हा शासन निर्णय लागू झाल्याच्या दिनांकापासून नव्याने विहीत नमुन्यानुसार प्रमाणपत्रे वितरीत करण्यात यावीत.

 - २) संबंधित संस्थेच्या अधीक्षकांनी त्या अर्जावरून संबंधित अर्जदाराने ज्या-ज्या संस्थेत वास्तव्य केले आहे अशा सर्व संबंधित संस्थेच्या अधीक्षकांकडून आवश्यकतेनुसार त्याची माहिती स्वतः उपलब्ध करून घ्यावी. तसेच अर्जदाराच्या आई-वडीलांचा शोध घेवून, त्यापैकी कोणीही हयात नसल्याबाबतची संबंधित यंत्रणेकडून खात्री करून घ्यावी.
 - ३) संस्थेच्या अधीक्षकांनी अर्जदाराच्या आई-वडीलांचा शोध घेवून, त्यापैकी कोणीही हयात नसल्याबाबतची संबंधित यंत्रणेकडून खात्री केली असल्याचे तसेच संबंधित अर्जदाराची माहिती व उपलब्ध कागदपत्रांच्या आधारे निकषानुसार तो अनाथ असल्याचे नमूद करून जिल्हा महिला बाल विकास अधिकारी यांना प्रस्ताव सादर करावा.
 - ४) जिल्हा महिला व बाल विकास अधिकारी यांनी संस्थेच्या अधीक्षकांकडून प्राप्त प्रस्तावाची छाननी पुढील दस्तावेज/पुरावे विचारात घेऊन करावी - संस्थेचे अधीक्षक यांनी सादर केलेली माहिती, जन्म-मृत्यू नोंद रजिस्टर, ग्रामसेवक/मुख्याधिकारी/वार्ड अधिकारी किंवा इतर सक्षम अधिकारी यांचेकडून निर्गमित मृत्यू दाखला, आवश्यकतेनुसार शासकीय जिल्हा रुग्णालयाकडून प्राप्त वयाचा पुरावा, शाळा सोडल्याचा दाखला, प्रवेश निर्गम रजिस्टरची प्रत, गृह चौकशी अहवाल, बाल कल्याण समिती/बाल न्याय मंडळाचे संबंधिताबाबतचे आधीचे आदेश इत्यादी.
 - ५) या छाननीनंतर जिल्हा महिला बाल विकास अधिकारी यांनी संबंधित अर्जदारास अनाथ घोषित करण्यासाठीचा प्रस्ताव स्वयंस्पष्ट अभिप्रायासह संबंधित जिल्ह्याच्या बाल कल्याण समितीस सादर करावा.

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- ६) बाल कल्याण समितीने जिल्हा महिला व बाल विकास अधिकारी यांचेकडून प्रस्ताव प्राप्त झाल्यानंतर अर्जाची पुन्हा छाननी करावी. आवश्यकता असेल तर अर्जाच्या छाननीसाठी अर्जदाराची मुलाखत किंवा पोलीस / महसूल विभागाच्या यंत्रणेचे सहाय्य घ्यावे.
 - ७) बालगृहात/अनाथालयात दाखल करण्यात येणाऱ्या काही अनाथ बालकांची जन्म तारीख/वय अंदाजे नमूद करण्यात येते. सक्षम प्राधिका-याच्या प्रमाणपत्राशिवाय अन्य कोणताही दस्तावेज वयाचा पुरावा म्हणून ग्राह्य धरू नये. ज्या बालकांच्या जन्म तारखेचा कोणताही पुरावा उपलब्ध नसेल अशा बालकांच्या वयाची चाचणी शासकीय जिल्हा रुग्णालयातून करून घेवून त्याचे वय निश्चित करून घ्यावे.
 - ८) प्रस्तावाची छाननी पूर्ण झाल्यावर अर्जदारास अनाथ प्रमाणपत्र निर्गमित करण्याची शिफारस करून किंवा अनाथ प्रमाणपत्रासाठीचा अर्ज नाकारण्यात आल्यास त्याबाबतची कारणे नमूद करून प्रस्ताव जिल्हा महिला व बाल विकास अधिकारी यांच्याकडे परत पाठवावा.
 - ९) जिल्हा महिला व बाल विकास अधिकारी यांनी बाल कल्याण समितीकडून प्राप्त प्रस्ताव शिफारशीसह संबंधित विभागीय उपायुक्त (महिला व बाल विकास) यांच्याकडे कार्यवाहीसाठी पाठवावा.

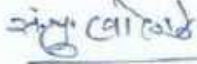

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of article 213 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Maharashtra is hereby pleased to promulgate the following Ordinance, namely :—

Short title and commencement. **1.** (1) This Ordinance may be called the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) (Amendment) Ordinance, 2025.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

Amendment of section 2 of Mah. XXVIII of 2015. **2.** In section 2 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015, for clause (n), the following clause shall be substituted, namely :—

Mah. XXVIII of 2015.

“(n) “Non-Resident Indian (NRI)” means, a person who is “not ordinary resident” as defined under sub-section (6) of section 6 of the Income Tax Act, 43 of 1961. 1961 and has been issued a Non-Resident Indian certificate accordingly by an Indian Mission or Post abroad and includes his child or ward as defined 8 of 1890. in the Guardians and Wards Act, 1890 ;”.

STATEMENT

The Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015), provides for regulation of admissions and fees by Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions in the State of Maharashtra and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

2. The Act, *inter-alia*, provides for allocation of the seats for admission to professional educational courses under the Non-Resident Indian (NRI) quota. The term "Non-Resident Indian (NRI)" is defined in clause (n) of section 2 of the said Act.

3. It is observed that, the genuine NRI candidates are often deprived of the opportunity to seek admission in professional educational courses under the Non-Resident Indian (NRI) quota in the State of Maharashtra. Therefore, it is considered expedient to amend the definition of the term "Non-Resident Indian (NRI)" in the said Act, with a view to bring the same in consonance with the law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of P. A. Inamdar, wherein it has been observed that—

"It was also pointed out that people of Indian origin, who have migrated to other countries, have a desire to bring back their children to their own country as they not only get education but also get reunited with Indian cultural ethos by virtue of being here. They also wish the money which they would be spending elsewhere on education of their children should rather reach their own motherland. A limited reservation of such seats, not exceeding 15%, in our opinion, may be available to NRIs depending on the discretion of the management subject to two conditions. First, such seats should be utilized *bona fide* by the NRIs only and for their children or wards. Secondly, within this quota, the merit should not be given a complete go-by."

4. The process for admission to various professional educational courses in the State of Maharashtra for the academic year 2025-2026 will start in the immediate future. It is, therefore, considered expedient to amend the said Act, immediately.

5. As both Houses of the State Legislature are not in session and the Governor of Maharashtra is satisfied that circumstances exist which render it necessary for him to take immediate action further to amend the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015, for the purposes aforesaid, this Ordinance is promulgated.

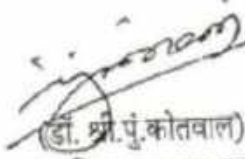

S.O. 1050(E).— In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 7B of the Citizenship Act, 1955 (57 of 1955) and in supersession of the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Home Affairs published in the Official Gazette *vide* number S.O. 542(E), dated the 11th April, 2005 and the notifications of the Government of India in the *erstwhile* Ministry of Overseas Indian Affairs published in the Official Gazette *vide* numbers S.O. 12(E), dated the 5th January, 2007 and S.O. 36(E), dated the 5th January, 2009, except as respect things done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the Central Government hereby specifies the following rights to which an Overseas Citizen of India Cardholder (hereinafter referred to as the OCI cardholder) shall be entitled, with effect from the date of publication of this notification in the Official Gazette, namely:—

- (1) grant of multiple entry lifelong visa for visiting India for any purpose:
Provided that for undertaking the following activities, the OCI cardholder shall be required to obtain a special permission or a Special Permit, as the case may be, from the competent authority or the Foreigners Regional Registration Officer or the Indian Mission concerned, namely:—
 - (i) to undertake research;
 - (ii) to undertake any Missionary or Tabligh or Mountaineering or Journalistic activities;
 - (iii) to undertake internship in any foreign Diplomatic Missions or foreign Government organisations in India or to take up employment in any foreign Diplomatic Missions in India;
 - (iv) to visit any place which falls within the Protected or Restricted or prohibited areas as notified by the Central Government or competent authority;
- (2) exemption from registration with the Foreigners Regional Registration Officer or Foreigners Registration Officer for any length of stay in India:
Provided that the OCI cardholders who are normally resident in India shall intimate the jurisdictional Foreigners Regional Registration Officer or the Foreigners Registration Officer by email whenever there is a change in permanent residential address and in their occupation;
- (3) parity with Indian nationals in the matter of:—
 - (i) tariffs in air fares in domestic sectors in India; and
 - (ii) entry fees to be charged for visiting national parks, wildlife sanctuaries, the national monuments, historical sites and museums in India;
- (4) parity with Non-Resident Indians in the matter of:—
 - (i) inter-country adoption of Indian children subject to the compliance of the procedure as laid down by the competent authority for such adoption;

- (ii) appearing for the all India entrance tests such as National Eligibility cum Entrance Test, Joint Entrance Examination (Mains), Joint Entrance Examination (Advanced) or such other tests to make them eligible for admission only against any Non-Resident Indian seat or any supernumerary seat;
Provided that the OCI cardholder shall not be eligible for admission against any seat reserved exclusively for Indian citizens;
- (iii) purchase or sale of immovable properties other than agricultural land or farm house or plantation property; and
- (iv) pursuing the following professions in India as per the provisions contained in the applicable relevant statutes or Acts as the case may be, namely:-
- (a) doctors, dentists, nurses and pharmacists;
 - (b) advocates;
 - (c) architects;
 - (d) chartered accountants;
- (5) in respect of all other economic, financial and educational fields not specified in this notification or the rights and privileges not covered by the notifications made by the Reserve Bank of India under the Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999 (42 of 1999), the OCI cardholder shall have the same rights and privileges as a foreigner.

Explanation.—For the purposes of this notification,—

- (1) The OCI Cardholder (including a PIO cardholder) is a foreign national holding passport of a foreign country and is not a citizen of India.
- (2) "Non-Resident Indian" shall have the same meaning as assigned to it in the Foreign Exchange Management (Acquisition and Transfer of Immovable Property in India) Regulations, 2018 made by the Reserve Bank of India under the Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999 (42 of 1999) and who fulfils the "Non-Resident Indian" status as per the Income Tax Act, 1961 (43 of 1961).

No. BOA/Regulation/UG/7-10/2021.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 55 of the **National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 (14 of 2020)**, and in supersession of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Regulation, 1986 except as respects thing done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the Commission hereby makes the following regulations, namely:-

- 1 Short title and commencement.**—(1) These regulations may be called **National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022**.
- (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- 2 Definitions.**— (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,-
 - (i) "Act" means the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine, Act, 2020 (14 of 2020);
 - (ii) "Annexure" means an annexure appended to these regulations;
 - (iii) "Appendix" means an appendix appended to these regulations.
- (2) The words and expressions used herein and not defined but defined in the Act shall have the same meanings as respectively assigned to them in the Act.
- 3 Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine And Surgery programme.**— The Bachelor of Ayurveda education namely, the Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery (B.A.M.S.) shall produce Graduates, having profound knowledge of Ashtanga Ayurveda along with the contemporary advances in the field of Ayurveda supplemented with knowledge of scientific and technological advances in modern science and technology along with extensive practical training, as an efficient physicians and surgeons for the health care services.
- 4 Ashtanga Ayurveda.**— (a) Ashtanga Ayurveda means eight clinical specialties of ayurveda viz., Kayachikitsa (General/Internal Medicine), Shalya Tantra (Surgery), Shalakya Tantra (Ophthalmology, Oto-Rhino-Laryngology and Oro-Dentistry), Kaumarabhritya (Obstetrics and Paediatrics), Agada Tantra (Clinical Toxicology), Bhuta Vidya (Clinical Microbiology, Clinical Psychology and Psychiatry), Rasayana (Preventive, Promotive, Rejuvenative Medicine and Gerontology) and Vajikarana (Reproductive Medicine and Epigenetics).
 - (b) All the eight specialties referred to in clause (a) were developed to deal all sort of clinical problems of respective specialty i.e., in general their etiopathogenesis including clinical anatomy, physiology; causative factors in terms of physical, psychological, external (injury, microbes, natural calamities etc.), dietic factors, faulty lifestyles, genetic causes (congenital, hereditary) etc.; clinical manifestation, examination/analysis of biological fluids / secretions/ excretions; various diagnostic tools including scopy (naadiyantra), diagnostic criteria, prognostication, principles of management in terms preventive, promotive, curative, palliative and rehabilitative management including surgical, pharmaco-therapeutics as well as pharmaceuticals of related drugs and formulations, relevant therapeutic procedures including physiotherapy techniques such as bandhana, vesthana etc., their methods of administration, complications and management, diet and lifestyle regimen; methods of assessment of improvement/cure, causes of recurrence etc. in relation to that particular clinical condition.
 - (c) The specialties referred to in clause (a) also deals with instruments/equipment that are required for administration of various therapeutic procedures/surgeries and other procedures, their methods of usage and maintenance. Hospital architecture, landscaping, air-conditioning and human resource management, qualities of nursing staff including ideal patient qualities.

- (d) Student selection process for medical education, methods of study of medical science, teaching methods including training of clinical skills on models, code of conduct for students, medical practitioners as well as teachers, student assessment methods, award of degrees, oath administration, medical registration etc.

5 Eligibility criteria for admission.- (1) The eligibility to seek admission in Bachelor of Ayurveda education shall be as under:-

- (a) The candidate shall have passed 10+2 or its equivalent examination from any recognised Board with Physics, Chemistry, Biology and have obtained minimum of fifty per cent. marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology in the case of general category and forty per cent. marks in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes:

Provided that in respect of persons with disability candidate specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum qualifying marks in the said examinations shall be forty-five per cent. in the case of General category and forty per cent. in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

- (b) No candidate shall be admitted to B.A.M.S Degree programme unless the candidate attained the age of seventeen years on or before the 31st December of the year of admission in the first year of the programme and not more than twenty-five years on the 31st December of the year of admission in the first year of the programme:

Provided that, the upper age-limit may be relaxed by five years in the case of Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes and disabled candidates.

(2) National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test.-(i) There shall be a uniform entrance examination for all medical institutions at the under-graduate level, namely the National Eligibility-cum- Entrance Test (NEET) for admission to under-graduate programme in each academic year and shall be conducted by an authority designated by the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine.

- (ii) In order to consider for admission to under-graduate programme for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in the National Eligibility-cum- Entrance Test for under-graduate programme held for the said academic year:

Provided that in respect of:-

- (i) candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile;
- (ii) candidates with specified disabilities under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile in the case of general category and 40th percentile in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes:

Provided further that where sufficient number of candidates in the respective category fail to secure minimum marks in the National Eligibility - cum - Entrance Test held for any academic year for admission to undergraduate programme, the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine in consultation with the Central Government may at its discretion lower the minimum marks required for admission to undergraduate programme for candidates belonging to respective category and marks so lowered by the Central Government shall be applicable for that academic year only.

- (3) An All-India common merit list as well as State-wise merit list of the eligible candidates shall be prepared on the basis of the marks obtained in the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test and the

candidates, within the respective category shall be considered for admission to under-graduate programme from the said merit lists only.

- (4) The seat matrix for admission in the Government, Government-aided Institution and Private Institution shall be fifteen per cent. for All-India Quota and eighty-five per cent. for the State and Union territory quota:

Provided that,-

- (i) the All-India Quota for the purpose of admission in all the deemed university both Government and private shall be hundred per cent.;
- (ii) the university and institute which are already having more than fifteen per cent. All-India Quota seats shall continue to maintain that quota;
- (iii) five per cent. of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government and Government-aided Institution shall be filled up by candidate with specified disability in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) and based on the merit list of National Eligibility -cum-Entrance Test.

Explanation.- For the purpose of this clause, the specified disability contained in the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) specified in *Appendix "A"* and the eligibility of candidate to pursue a programme in Indian Systems of Medicine with specified disability shall be in accordance with the guidelines specified in *Appendix "B"* and if the seats reserved for the persons with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates, the seats shall be included in the annual sanctioned seats for the respective category.

- (5) (i) The designated authority for counseling of State and Union territory quota for admissions to undergraduate programme in all Ayurveda Educational Institutions in the States and Union territories including institutions established by the State Government, University, Trust, Society, Minority Institution, Corporation or Company shall be the respective State or Union Territory in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations of the concerned State or Union territory, as the case may be.
- (ii) The counseling for all admission to Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery Programme for hundred percent seats of all Deemed Universities both Government and Private shall be conducted by the authority designated by the Central Government in this behalf.
- (6) The counselling for admission to Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery Programme for seat under All-India Quota as well as for all Ayurveda Educational Institutions established by the Central Government shall be conducted by the authority designated by the Central Government in this behalf.
- (7) (i) All seats irrespective of category (Central quota, State Quota or management etc.) except foreign nationals are to be admitted through counselling (Central, State or UT) only. Direct admission by any means other than above specified shall not be approved.
- (ii) The institutions shall have to submit the list of students admitted in the format specified by NCISM on or before 6 pm on the cut off date for admissions specified by NCISM time to time for verification.
- (iii) Universities shall approve the admission of those candidates (except foreign nationals) who have been allotted through counselling (Central, State or UT as the case may be)
- (8) No candidate who has failed to obtain the minimum eligibility marks under this regulation shall be admitted to under-graduate programme in the said academic year.
- (9) No authority or institution shall admit any candidate to the under-graduate programme in contravention of the criteria or procedure laid down in these regulations in respect of admission and any admission made in contravention of the said criteria or procedure shall be cancelled by the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine forthwith.

- (10) The authority or institution which grants admission to any student in contravention of the criteria or procedure laid down in these regulations shall be liable accordingly, under the relevant provisions of the Act.
- (11) For foreign national candidate, any other equivalent qualification approved by the Central Government may be allowed and sub-regulation (2) of regulation 5 shall not be applicable.
- 6 Duration of B.A.M.S. programme.-** The duration of the B.A.M.S. Programme shall be five years and six months as per the following table, namely:-

- 7 Degree to be awarded.-** The candidate shall be awarded Ayurvedacharya (Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery-B.A.M.S) Degree after passing all the examinations and completion of the laid down programme of study extending over the laid down period and the compulsory rotatory internship extending over twelve months and the nomenclature of degree shall be Ayurvedacharya (Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery -B.A.M.S).
- 8 Medium of instruction.-** The medium of instruction for the programme shall be Sanskrit or Hindi or any recognised regional language or English:
Provided that in case, if any institute is admitting students from different states or international students, the medium of instruction shall be English.
- 9 Pattern of study.-** (1) The B.A.M.S. Programme shall consist of **Main Programme and Electives** and the pattern of study shall be followed in the following manner, namely:-
- (A) (i) (a) After admission, the student shall be inducted to the B.A.M.S. Programme through an Induction Programme not less than fifteen working days based on the Transitional Curriculum which intends to introduce newly admitted student to Ayurveda system of medicine and to make him well aware of the B.A.M.S. Programme he is going to study for next four and a half years.
- (b) During the induction programme, the student of Ayurveda shall learn basic of Sanskrit for Ayurveda and basic life support and first aid along with other subject as laid down in the syllabus.
- (c) There shall be fifteen days induction programme which shall be not less than ninety hours and every day may consist of six hours.
- (ii) Total working days for each professional session shall be not less than three hundred and twenty days.
- (iii) (a) Total working days for the First Professional session shall be not less than three hundred and five days except for fifteen days for the induction programme.
- (b) total teaching hours for First Professional session shall not be less than 1920
- (iv) Total teaching hours for Second Professional session shall be not less than 2240 and the proportion of teaching hours in Lecture to Non-lecture shall be 1:2.

- (11) For foreign national candidates any other equivalent qualification approved by the Central Government may be allowed and sub-regulation (2) of regulation 4 shall not be applicable.
- 5 **Duration of B.U.M.S. programme.**- (i) Pre-Tib programme: The duration of Pre-Tib programme shall be one year.

- 6 **Degree to be awarded.**- The candidate shall be awarded Kamile Tib o Jarahat (Bachelor of Unani Medicine and Surgery - B.U.M.S.) Degree after passing all the examinations and completion of the laid down programme of study extending over the laid down period and the compulsory rotatory internship extending over twelve months and the nomenclature of Degree shall be Kamile Tib o Jarahat (Bachelor of Unani Medicine and Surgery - B.U.M.S.).
- 7 **Medium of instruction.**- The medium of instruction for the programme shall be Urdu or Hindi or any recognised regional language or English:
- Provided that, in case, if any institute is admitting student from different states or international students, the medium of instruction shall be English.
- 8 **Pattern of study.**- (1) The B.U.M.S programme shall consist of Main Programme and Electives and the pattern of study shall be followed in the following manner, namely:-
- (A) (i) (a) After admission the student shall be inducted to the B.U.M.S programme through an Induction

Programme not less than fifteen working days based on the Transitional Curriculum which intends to introduce newly admitted student to Unani system of Medicine and to make him well aware of the B.U.M.S. programme he is going to study for next four and half years.

(b) During the induction programme, the student of Unani shall learn basics of Urdu or Persian or Arabic for Unani, basic life support and first aid along with other subject as laid down in the syllabus.

(c) There shall be fifteen days induction programme which shall be not less than ninety hours and every day may consist of six hours.

(ii) Total working days for each professional session shall be not less than three hundred and twenty days.

(iii) (a) Total working days for the First Professional session shall be not less than three hundred and five days except for fifteen days for the induction programme.

(b) total teaching hours for First Professional session shall be not less than 1920, and proportion of teaching hours in Lecture to Non-lecture shall be 1:2.

(iv) (a) Total teaching hours for Second Professional session shall be not less than 2240 and the proportion of teaching hours in Lectures to Non-lectures shall be 1:2.

(b) During the Second Professional Session at least one hour of clinical classes per day during morning hours at Hospital Outpatient Department (OPD) or Inpatient Department (IPD) or Laboratory or Pharmacy or Dispensary shall be conducted to make the students have acquaintance with the related activities.

(v) Total teaching hours for Third (Final) Professional session shall be not less than 2240 and during the Third (Final) Professional Session, three hours of clinical classes at Hospital during morning hours shall be conducted and the proportion of teaching hours in Lecture to Non-Lecture hours shall be 1:2.

(vi) Working hours may be increased by the University or institution as per requirement to complete the stipulated period of teaching and requisite activities.

Explanation - For the purposes of this regulation the expression "Lectures" means Didactic teaching i.e., classroom teaching and the expression "Non-lectures" includes Practical / Clinical and Demonstrative teaching and the Demonstrative teaching includes Small group teaching / Tutorials / Seminars / Symposiums / Assignments / Role play / Pharmacy training / Laboratory training / Dissection / Field visits / Skill lab training / Integrated learning / Problem based learning / Case based learning / Early clinical exposure / Evidence based learning etc. as per the requirement of the subject and in Non-lectures, the Clinical / Practical part shall be 70 per cent. and Demonstrative teaching shall be 30 per cent.

(vii) There shall be minimum of one hour each for library and physical education per week and one hour of recreation (expression of talent and extra-curricular activities) per month has to be allotted in the regular time table of all batches.

(B) The First Professional session shall ordinarily start in the month of October and the following subjects shall be taught as per the syllabus laid down by the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine from time to time, namely:-

CENTRAL COUNCIL OF HOMOEOPATHY**NOTIFICATION**

New Delhi, the 19th June, 2019

No. 12-13/2006-CCH(Pt.VI).— In exercise of the powers conferred by clauses (i), (j) and (k) of sub-section (1) of section 33 read with sub-section (1) of section 20 of the Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 (59 of 1973), the Central Council of Homoeopathy, with the previous sanction of the Central Government, hereby makes the following regulations further to amend the Homoeopathy (Degree Course) Regulations, 1983, namely:—

1. (1) These regulations may be called the Homoeopathy (Degree Course) Amendment Regulations, 2019.
- (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- (3) These regulations shall apply to students who shall be admitted for B.H.M.S. course from the commencement of the academic session (2019-2020).

2. In the Homoeopathy (Degree Course) Regulations, 1983 (hereinafter referred to as the said regulations), the regulation 4A, shall be substituted, namely:—

“4A. Criteria for Selection of students - (i) There shall be a uniform entrance examination to all medical institutions at the under-graduate level, namely, the ‘National Eligibility Entrance Test’ (NEET) for admission to under-graduate course in each academic year and shall be conducted by an authority designated by the Central Government.

(ii) In order to be eligible for admission to under-graduate course for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in the ‘National Eligibility Entrance Test’ for under-graduate course held for the said academic year:

Provided that in respect of-

(a) candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile.

(b) candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile for general category and 40th percentile for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

Explanation.—The percentile shall be determined on the basis of highest marks secured in the all India common merit list in the ‘National Eligibility Entrance Test’ for under-graduate courses:

Provided further that when sufficient number of candidates in the respective categories fail to secure minimum marks in the ‘National Eligibility Entrance Test’, as specified above, held for any academic year for admission to under-graduate courses, the Central Government in consultation with Central Council may at its discretion lower the minimum marks required for admission to under-graduate course for candidates belonging to respective categories and marks so lowered by the Central Government shall be applicable for that academic year only.

(c) five percent of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government or Government-aided higher educational institutions shall be filled up by candidates with benchmark disabilities in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), based on the merit list of ‘National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test’.

Explanation.— For this purpose the “Specified Disability” contained in the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), is annexed in Annexure ‘C’ and the eligibility of candidates to pursue a course in homoeopathic medicine with specified disability shall be in accordance with Annexure ‘D’ and if the seats reserved for the persons with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates, the seats shall be included in the annual sanctioned seats for the respective Category.

(iii) An all India common merit list as well as State-wise merit list of the eligible candidates shall be prepared on the basis of the marks obtained in the ‘National Eligibility Entrance Test’ and the candidates, within the respective categories, shall be admitted to under-graduate course from the said merit lists only.

(iv) The seat matrix for admission in the Government, Government-aided Institutions and Private Institutions shall be fifteen percent for the all India quota and eighty-five percent for the States and Union territories quota.

Provided that the seat matrix for admission in any Deemed Universities shall be hundred percent for the all India quota and those Universities and Institutes which are already having more than fifteen percent all India quota seats shall continue to maintain that quota.

(v) The designated authority for counseling of eighty-five percent State and Union territory quota for admissions to under-graduate course in all Homoeopathic educational institutions in the States and Union territories including institutions established by the State Government, University, Trust, Society, Minority Institution, Corporation or Company shall be the respective State or Union territory in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations of the concerned State or Union territory Government, as the case may be.

(vi) The counseling for all admissions to under-graduate course for seats under the all India quota as well as for all Homoeopathy educational institutions established by the Central Government and any Deemed Universities shall be conducted by the authority designated by the Central Government.

(vii) No candidate who has failed to obtain the minimum eligibility marks as specified above shall be admitted to under-graduate course in the said academic year.

(viii) No authority or institution shall admit any candidate to the under-graduate course in contravention of the criteria or procedure as laid down by these regulations in respect of admissions and any candidate admitted in contravention of the said criteria or procedure shall be discharged by the Central Council forthwith.

(ix) The authority or institution which grants admission to any student in contravention of the aforesaid criteria or procedure shall be liable to face action in terms of the provisions of the Act.

(x) For foreign national candidates any other equivalent qualification to be approved by the Central Government may be allowed, and entrance examination for admission to under-graduate course namely the 'National Eligibility Entrance Test' (NEET) shall not be applicable for foreign national candidates.

(xi) A candidate shall be eligible for the competitive examination if he has passed any of the qualifying examinations specified under regulation 4:

Provided that a candidate who has appeared in the qualifying examination and the result of which has not been declared, he may be provisionally permitted to take up the competitive examination and in case of selection for admission to the B.H.M.S. Course, he shall not be admitted to that course until he fulfills the eligibility criteria under regulation 4.

3. In the said regulation, Annexure "C" and Annexure "D" shall be inserted after Annexure "B".

Annexure "C"

(Refer Regulation 4A)

A SCHEDULE is annexed regarding, "SPECIFIED DISABILITY" clause (2c) of section 2 of the Act, that states as under,

I. Physical disability

A. Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—

(a) "leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—

- (i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity;
- (ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
- (iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;

(b) "cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;

(c) "dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;

(d) "muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;

(e) "acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

B. Visual impairment—

(a) "blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction—

- (i) total absence of sight; or
- (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
- (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.

(b) "low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:—

- (i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200(Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
- (ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

C. Hearing impairment -

(a) "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

(b) "hard of hearing" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

D. "speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

2. Intellectual disability, a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behavior which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

(a) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;

(b) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

3. Mental behavior - "mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterized by sub normality of intelligence.

4. Disability caused due to -

(a) chronic neurological conditions, such as—

(i) "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which themyelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;

(ii) "parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

(b) Blood disorder—

(i) "haemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterized by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;

(ii) "thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.

(iii) "sickle cell disease" means a hemolytic disorder characterized by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage;"hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of hemoglobin.

5. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

6. Any other category as may be notified by the Central Government.

Note : Any amendment to the Schedule to the RPWD Act, 2016, shall consequently stand amended in the above schedule.

Annexure "D"

(Refer Regulation 4A)

Guidelines regarding admission of students with "Specified Disabilities" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 with respect to admission in B.H.M.S.

Note 1. The "Certificate of Disability" shall be issued in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017 notified in the Gazette of India by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment [Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (*Divyangjan*)] on the 15th June, 2017.

2. The extent of "specified disability" in a person shall be assessed in accordance with the "Guidelines for the purpose of assessing the extent of specified disability in a person included under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016)" notified in the Gazette of India by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment [Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (*Divyangjan*)] on the 4th January, 2018.

3. The minimum degree of disability should be 40% (Benchmark Disability) in order to be eligible for availing reservation for persons with specified disability.

4. The term 'Persons with Disabilities' (PwD) is to be used instead of the term 'Physically Handicapped' (PH)

COURSES OF AYURVEDA, SIDDHA, UNANI & HOMOEOPATHY (ASU&H)
FOR THE ACADEMIC SESSION 2022-2023**

A. GUIDELINES FOR COUNSELLING AUTHORITIES:

Common Guidelines for Central/State/UT Counselling and Admissions

Eligibility Criteria to Participate in the Counseling. -

1. Colleges/Institutes who have got due permission from the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM)/ Medical Assessment and Rating Board, National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH)/ Government of India, New Delhi, for admission in UG /PG courses for the academic session 2022-2023 shall only be included in the counseling process.

Seat Matrix (AIQ & State/UT Quota).-

2. The seat matrix for admission in the Government, Government-aided institutions and Private Institutions shall be fifteen per cent (15%) for All-India Quota and eighty-five per cent (85%) for State/Union Territory Quota as specified in the respective MSE regulations 2022 of Ayurveda, Siddha & Unani/ NCH Act, 2020 and relevant regulations of Homoeopathy in force at the time of admission.

Provided that-

- (i) the AIQ for the purpose of admission in all the deemed universities, both Government and Private, shall be hundred per cent;
 - (ii) the University and institute, which are already having more than fifteen per cent. All-India Quota seats shall continue to maintain that quota;
 - (iii) five per cent. of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government and Government-aided institutions shall be filled up by candidate with specified disability in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) and based on the merit list of NEET(UG)-2022.
3. In case of 85% of State/UT quota, the seat matrix for Government Quota, Management Quota, NRI quota etc., shall be as per respective State and UT policy; however, **all admissions in all quotas shall be through counseling conducted by State/UT counseling authority.**

Reservation. -

4. Category-wise reservation of seats shall be as per Central or State or UT Reservation Policy, as the case may be.
5. Reservation for allotment of 15% AIQ-UG & PG seats in Private ASU&H Institutes:- all AIQ-UG & PG seats of Private ASU & H Institutes are open in nature. However, as mentioned in relevant regulations, the relaxation in qualifying criteria may be provided category-wise.

Counseling and Admissions.-

6. All sanctioned/permitted seats by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (MARBISM) / NCISM/ Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy (MARBH) / NCH /Government of India, irrespective of categories/reservations, are to be filled only through online counseling, i.e., Central / State /UT counseling as the case may be.
7. Ayush Admissions Central Counseling Committee (AACCC), Ministry of Ayush will conduct "AIQ-UG&PG Online Counseling" for admission in Govt. / Govt. Aided Colleges/Institutes, Central/Deemed Universities and National Institutes of ASU&H streams.
8. Further, the State/UT Counseling authorities shall conduct counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG&PG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/ Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities).
9. State/UT Counseling Authorities have to conduct counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG&PG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities) in adherence with guidelines /schedule provided by the AACCC, Ministry of Ayush to avoid the overlapping of the Schedule of AACCC-UG/PG counseling and State/UT-UG/PG counseling.
10. Seat allotment in any category shall be as per inter-se-merit.
11. **No candidate** who has failed to obtain the minimum eligibility marks in NEET (UG) – 2022 and AIAPGET – 2022 shall be admitted to Undergraduate and Postgraduate courses, respectively, for the academic year 2022-23.
12. Qualification Criterion: (As per the ASU&H-UG & PG Regulations)

a) For admission to ASU&H-UG Courses:

Passing marks for eligibility in admission to ASU&H-UG courses should be as per the ASU&H-UG regulations and should be followed strictly. The details qualifications for different categories are as follows:

- i. Candidate must have obtained a minimum of 50% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology at the aforesaid qualifying examination in the case of general category and 40% Marks in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, and Other Backward Classes.
- ii. In respect of persons with disability as specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum qualifying marks in the said qualifying examination are as follows: a) In Physics, Chemistry and Biology shall be 45% in the case of general category. (For PwD candidates only) b) 40% in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes. (for PwD candidates only).
- iii. No candidate shall be admitted to BAMS, BSMS, BUMS & BHMS Degree Courses unless he/she has attained the **age of seventeen years on or before the 31st December of the year** of his/her admission in the

first year of the course. Further, there is no upper age limit for admission to ASU&H-UG courses.

- iv. In order to be eligible for admission to an undergraduate course for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in the 'National Eligibility Entrance Test for undergraduate course' held for the said academic year: Provided that in respect of-

(A) candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at the 40th percentile;

(B) candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile in the case of the General category and 40th percentile in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

b) For admission to ASU&H-PG Courses:

- i. Candidates must possess of BAMS/ BUMS/ BSMS/ BHMS / Graded BHMS degree(after Diploma Course in Homoeopathy of not less than four year's duration) or Provisional BAMS/ BUMS/ BSMS/ BHMS Pass Certificate recognized as per the provisions of the IMCC 1970/HCC 1973/ NCISM 2020 Act /NCH 2020 Act and possess permanent or provisional registration certificate of BAMS/ BUMS/ BSMS/ BHMS/Graded BHMS degree qualification issued by the CCIM/ NCISM/ CCH/ /NCH/ State Board /Universities/ Deemed Universities and must have completed a satisfactorily one-year compulsory rotating internship by 31st December 2022 as per the NCISM/NCH notification. (for the academic year 2022-23 only)

- ii. In order to be eligible for admission to postgraduate courses for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in the All India AYUSH Post Graduate Entrance Test, 2022 (AIAPGET-2022): Provided that in respect of-

(a) candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile;

(b) candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile for the General Category and 40th percentile for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

- iii. No upper age limit is specified for admission to ASU&H-PG Courses.

13. No Authority or Institution shall admit any candidate to the Undergraduate/Postgraduate courses in contravention of the criteria or procedure in respect of admissions, and any admissions made in contravention shall be cancelled by the NCISM/NCH.

14. Any admissions made beyond/ over and above the intake capacity sanctioned/ permitted by MARBISM /NCISM /MARBH /NCH /GOI for the said academic session shall not be approved.
15. There shall not be any offline admission or admission without counseling (Central/State/UT), and any admissions in contravention of this shall not be approved.
16. Admission made in violation of the Central Government / NCISM / NCH directives will be treated as invalid, and action will be initiated under NCISM Act, 2020 / NCH Act, 2020.
17. Institutes will be held responsible in case students face hardship due to admission irregularities (offline admissions, admission without counseling and admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity). In such case, students shall be discharged from the course and institution, and the institute will be penalised as per the provision laid down under the sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28; sub-section (3) of section 10 of NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act 2020, and the persons responsible will be prosecuted as per the section of IPC concerned.
18. Admissions shall not be approved, by any means, after the cut-off date and time for admission as specified by NCISM/NCH.
19. No authority has the power to extend or modify the cut-off date of admission specified by NCISM/NCH, and such admissions shall not be approved.
20. No authority has the power to modify the intake capacity for admission into UG/PG courses in ASU&H colleges sanctioned by MARBISM/MARBH /NCISM/NCH/GOI.
21. State/UT Counseling Authorities may direct ASU&H colleges/institutes to ensure the eligibility of the candidate as laid down in respective NCISM (MSE-UG) Regulations 2022/relevant PG-ASU regulations for Ayurveda, Siddha & Unani for admissions in ASU-UG/PG courses and Homoeopathy (Degree course) BHMS Regulation 1983 (as amended up to 2019)/Homoeopathy (Post Graduate Degree Course) M.D (Hom.) Amendment Regulation, 2018, for admissions in Homoeopathy-UG/PG courses by proper scrutiny of the relevant certificates and documents at the time of admission.
22. AACCC, M/o Ayush will circulate the list of ineligible candidates for State/UT counseling during the 2nd, 3rd/Mop-up, Stray Vacancy Round of AACCC-UG/PG counseling to prevent them from participating in the State/UT counseling. State/UT Counseling Authorities are requested to ensure that such candidates have not been allotted any seat through any round of State/UT counseling for admission in ASU&H-UG/PG courses.
23. State/UT Counseling Authorities may direct ASU&H colleges/institutes to ensure that the candidates, allotted seats through Central/State/UT counseling, submit the original Compulsory Rotating Internship completion certificate at the time of reporting to the allotted institutes. The cut-off date for completion of the internship towards determination of eligibility for appearing in AIAPGET-2022 shall be 31st December 2022 for A.Y.2022-23 only.
24. State/UT Counseling Authorities may direct ASU&H colleges/institutes to ensure the authenticity and correctness of the details of admitted students before

completing the admission procedures. No modifications/ corrections after the cut-off date and time of admission as specified by NCISM/NCH shall be entertained.

25. Central/State/UT Counseling authorities have to submit a list of allotted students (i.e. college-wise consolidated list of allotted students through all rounds of counseling) to NCISM/NCH within 15 working days from the cut-off date of admission in the format prescribed by NCISM/NCH.
26. All State/UT Counseling Authorities are requested to see the website of AACCC, M/o Ayush (www.aaccc.gov.in), from time to time for AACCC-UG/PG counseling scheme& FAQs, Schedule and any updates/notices uploaded regarding All India Quota-ASU&H-UG&PG counseling for the A.Y 2022-23.

Determination of fees and other charges in case of ASU&H colleges/institutes under NCISM/NCH.-

27. The fee for 50 percentage (50%) of total sanctioned/permitted seats in Private ASU&H medical colleges/institutes and deemed universities which are governed under the NCISM Act, 2020/NCH Act, 2020, is to be determined by Fee fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of the respective State/UT/Deemed University as per the guidelines for "Determination of fee and all other charges" prescribed by NCISM (BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16-09-2022/NCH Act, 2020), and it has to be implemented from 2022-2023 academic session onwards.

Guidelines for State/UT counselling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG&PG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/ Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities)

28. The State/UT Counseling authorities shall conduct counseling for 15% of AIQ-UG&PG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities).
29. State/UT Counseling Authorities have to conduct counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG&PG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/ Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities) in adherence with guidelines/schedule provided by the AACCC, Ministry of Ayush to avoid the overlapping of the Schedule of AACCC-UG/PG counseling and State or UT-UG/PG counseling.
30. State/UT counseling authorities shall conduct 2 Rounds of counseling for admission in 15% All India Quota (AIQ) UG / PG seats of Private ASU&H Institutes/ Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities). The AIQ seats that remain vacant after the second round of counseling may be converted to the State/UT Government quota seats, and the same shall be filled up in further rounds as per State Government norms/ rules.
31. State/UT counseling authorities should give wider publicity among NEET (UG)-2022/AIAPGET-2022 qualified ASU&H-UG&PG aspirants regarding the registration process of counselling & provide sufficient time for registration before each round of counseling for admission in AIQ-UG & PG seats of Private ASU&H Institutes.
32. State/UT may decide an all-inclusive application Cost/Non-refundable Registration Fee for counseling for admission in ASU&H-UG&PG seats for all

- category students. However, the maximum ceiling limit for this fee will be Rs 2000/-.
33. State/UT may decide on refundable security money, which will be refunded to candidates after joining the allotted college or if the candidate did not get any seat during counseling. However, the maximum ceiling limit for this fee will be Rs. 50,000/- for UG & PG seats.
 34. The Security money will be forfeited if a candidate does not join the allotted seat of Round-2 or surrender/withdraw the seat allotted in Round-2 based on the candidate's request. Further, the Security money will also be forfeited if the allotted seat of Round-2 is cancelled due to any unforeseen reason from the candidate's end. For example, the candidate gives wrong information at the time of registration on the basis of which a seat may be allotted and later cancelled by the Admission Authorities at the time of reporting or fails to produce the required documents at the time of admission (within the stipulated time).
 35. Make a provision to Round-2 admitted candidates of All India Quota Private (UG and PG) counselling so that they can withdraw/surrender their admitted seat with forfeiture of security money only during a specific time period provided by State/UT authority (State/UT authorities can decide this time period to withdraw/surrender the admitted seat of Round-2 as per their counseling schedule). After the said period, candidates will not be allowed to withdraw/surrender their admitted seat of Round-2. If they do so, they will be ineligible for any further AYUSH counselling conducted by Central/State/UT.
 36. No domicile certificate is required for allotment of AIQ-UG & PG seats of Private ASU & H Institutes.
 37. Reservation for allotment of 15% AIQ-UG & PG seats in Private ASU&H Institutes:- all AIQ-UG & PG seats of Private ASU & H Institutes are open in nature. However, as mentioned in relevant regulations, the relaxation in qualifying criteria may be provided category-wise.
 38. For PwD candidates, the PwD certificate should be as per the guidelines issued by Central Government and notified by the NCISM/NCH. (available on counseling website (www.aacec.gov.in) under Counseling Scheme & FAQs.

B. GUIDELINES FOR UNIVERSITIES:

1. In case of admission in Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani and Homoeopathy courses, University shall approve the admissions made by any college/institute with proper permission from the MARBISM/MARBH/NCISM/NCH Government of India for the academic session 2022-2023.
2. University shall approve the admissions only after the admitted students' details are verified by the Board of Ayurveda and the Board of Unani, Siddha and Sowa-Rigpa, as the case may be.
3. University shall not approve offline admissions/ admissions without counselling (Central/State/UT) made by any colleges/institutions.
4. AACCC, M/o Ayush conducts three rounds of online counselling for ASU&H-UG&PG seats under Deemed Universities. The seats that remain vacant after 3rd Round of AACCC-UG/PG counselling will be reverted to the respective Deemed Universities to conduct Stray Vacancy Round at their level, for which the AACCC, M/o Ayush will provide the list of registered eligible candidates and is to be exercised strictly in order of merit. Only candidates registered in the AACCC-UG/PG counseling are eligible for the Stray Vacancy Round, conducted by Deemed Universities.

C. GUIDELINES FOR COLLEGES/ INSTITUTES:

Eligibility Criteria to Participate in the counseling. -

Colleges/Institutes who have got due permission from the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM)/ Medical Assessment and Rating Board, National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH)/Government of India, New Delhi, for admission in UG /PG courses for the academic session 2022-2023 shall only be included in the counseling process.

Seat Matrix (AIQ & State/UT Quota).-

2. The seat matrix for admission in the Government, Government-aided institutions and Private Institutions shall be fifteen per cent (15%) for All-India Quota and eighty-five per cent (85%) for State/Union Territory Quota as specified in the respective MSE regulations 2022 of Ayurveda, Siddha & Unani and /NCH Act, 2020 and relevant regulations of Homoeopathy in force at the time of admission.

Provided that-

- (i) the AIQ for the purpose of admission in all the deemed universities, both Government and Private, shall be hundred per cent;
 - (ii) the University and institute, which are already having more than fifteen per cent, All-India Quota seats shall continue to maintain that quota;
 - (iii) five per cent. of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government and Government-aided institutions shall be filled up by candidate with specified disability in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) and based on the merit list of NEET(UG)-2022.
3. In case of 85% of State/UT quota, the seat matrix for Government Quota, Management Quota, NRI quota etc., shall be as per respective State and UT policy, however, **all admissions in all quotas shall be through counseling conducted by State/UT counseling authority.**

Reservation.-

4. Category-wise reservation of seats shall be as per Central or State or UT Reservation Policy, as the case may be.
5. Reservation for allotment of 15% AIQ-UG & PG seats in Private ASU&H Institutes:- all AIQ-UG & PG seats of Private ASU & H Institutes are open in nature. However, as mentioned in relevant regulations, the relaxation in qualifying criteria may be provided category-wise

Counseling and Admission.-

1. All sanctioned/permitted seats by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (MARBISM) / NCISM / Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy (MARBH) / NCH /Government of India,

irrespective of categories/reservations, are to be filled only through online counseling, i.e., Central/State/UT counseling as the case may be.

2. Ayush Admissions Central Counseling Committee (AACCC), Ministry of Ayush will conduct "AIQ-UG/PG Online Counseling" for admission in Govt./Govt. Aided Colleges/Institutes, Central/Deemed Universities and National Institutes of ASU&H streams
3. Further, the State/UT Counseling authorities shall conduct counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG&PG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/ Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities).
4. State/UT Counseling Authorities have to conduct counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG&PG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/ Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities) in adherence with guidelines/schedule provided by the AACCC, Ministry of Ayush to avoid the overlapping of the Schedule of AACCC-UG/PG counseling and State or UT-UG/PG counseling.
5. Seat allotment in any category shall be as per inter-se-merit.

9. There shall not be any offline admission or admission without counseling (Central/State/UT) or admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity and any admissions in contravention of this shall not be approved.
10. Admission made in violation of the Central Government / NCISM / NCH directives will be treated as invalid, and action will be initiated under NCISM Act, 2020 / NCH Act, 2020.
11. Institutes will be held responsible in case students face hardship due to admission irregularities (offline admissions, admission without counseling and admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity). In such case, students shall be discharged from the course and institution, and the institute will be penalised as per the provision laid down under the sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28; sub-section (3) of section 10 of NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act, and the persons responsible will be prosecuted as per the section of IPC concerned.
12. Admissions shall not be approved, by any means, after the cut-off date and time for admission as specified by NCISM/NCH.
13. No authority has the power to extend or modify the cut-off date of admission specified by NCISM/NCH, and such admissions shall not be approved.
14. No authority has the power to modify the intake capacity for admission in to UG/PG courses in ASU&H colleges sanctioned by MARBISM/MARBH /NCISM/NCH/GOI.

15. ASU&H colleges/institutes should ensure the eligibility of the candidate as laid down in respective NCISM (MSE-UG) Regulations 2022/relevant PG-ASU regulations for Ayurveda, Siddha & Unani for admissions in ASU-UG/PG courses and Homoeopathy (Degree course) BHMS Regulation 1983 (as amended up to 2019)/Homoeopathy (Post Graduate Degree Course) M.D (Hom.) Amendment Regulation, 2018, for admissions in Homoeopathy-UG/PG courses by proper scrutiny of the relevant certificates and documents at the time of admission.
16. ASU&H colleges/institutes should ensure that the candidates, allotted seats through Central/State/UT counseling, submit the original Compulsory Rotating Internship completion certificate at the time of reporting to the allotted institutes. The cut-off date for completion of the internship towards determination of eligibility for appearing in AIAPGET-2022 shall be 31st December 2022 for A.Y.2022-23 only.
17. ASU&H colleges/institutes should ensure the authenticity and correctness of the details of admitted students before completing admission procedures. No modifications/ corrections after the cut-off date and time of admission as specified by NCISM/NCH shall be entertained.
18. The list of admitted students with all details shall be uploaded and submitted to NCISM/NCH in the format prescribed by NCISM/NCH on or before 6 pm on the cut-off date for admission as specified by NCISM/NCH.
19. It is requested that all participating institutes must visit AACCC-UG/PG portal (www.aaccc.gov.in) from time to time for the AACCC-UG/PG counseling scheme& FAQs, Schedule and any updates/notices regarding UG/PG counseling 2022-23.
20. The colleges should follow the AACCC-UG/PG counseling schedule uploaded on the AACCC portal. It is further instructed to facilitate the admission/reporting of students who have allotted seats during 1st/2nd/3rd, or Mop-up Round and Stray Vacancy Round of AACCC-UG/PG counseling, even on holidays, if necessary.

Determination of fees and other charges in case of ASU&H colleges/institutes under NCISM/NCH.-

1. The fee for 50 per cent (50%) of total sanctioned/permitted seats in Private ASU&H medical colleges/institutes and deemed universities which are governed under the NCISM Act, 2020/NCH Act, 2020, is to be determined by Fee fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of the respective State/UT/Deemed University as per the guidelines for "Determination of fee and all other charges" prescribed by NCISM (BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16-09-2022/ NCH Act, 2020), and it has to be implemented from 2022-2023 academic session onwards.

Tuition fee.-

2. The tuition fee as laid down and fixed by respective governing or fee fixation committees as applicable shall be charged in each academic session for four and half years only. No tuition fee shall be charged for an extended duration of study in case of failing in examinations or by any other reasons, and there shall not be any fee for internship doing in the same institute.

MAHARASHTRA UNAIDED PRIVATE PROFESSIONAL EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS (REGULATION OF ADMISSION AND FEES) ACT, 2015.

No. MED-1024/C.R.-77/24/EDU-2.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015), the Government of Maharashtra hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Undergraduate Medical and Dental Course) Rules, 2016, namely :—

1. These rules may be called the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Undergraduate Medical and Dental Courses) (Amendment) Rules, 2024.

2. In rule 5 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Professional Undergraduate Medical and Dental Courses) Rules, 2016 in sub-rule (1), in entry (C), after sub-entry (ii), the following sub-entries shall be added, namely :—

(iii) The Children of the officers of the All India Services, officers of the Central Government Services and Defence Personnel (including all types of defence services) having domicile certificate of the State of Maharashtra and posted outside the Maharashtra, shall be eligible for admission even though they might have passed the SSC and/ or HSC or equivalent examination from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra.

(iv) The Candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at (iii) above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such officer of All India Services, Central Government Services and Defence Personnel has reported for duty, as a proof of the fact that he has joined the office or reported for duty before the cut off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of preference form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation and posting order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting."

1. Leave granted.
2. The appellant has approached this Court for assailing orders dated 5th September, 2023 and 26th October, 2023 passed by the Division Bench of the Bombay High Court Bench at Nagpur in Writ Petition No. 5141 of 2023 and Misc. Civil Application (Review) No. 980 of 2023 in Writ Petition No. 5141 of 2023, respectively.
3. The appellant is a domicile of the State of Maharashtra and his father is employed in the Border Security Force (BSF) as a Head Constable (General Duty) [HC(GD)]. Owing to the deployment of his



father outside the State of Maharashtra, the appellant was compelled to complete his Secondary School Certificate (Standard X)(SSC) and Higher School Certificate (Standard XII)(HSC) education from a school outside the State of Maharashtra.

4. The appellant appeared in NEET-UG, 2023 craving admission in the undergraduate MBBS course against the State quota and upon being found meritorious, he was issued a provisional selection letter (CAP1) by the State Common Entrance Cell, Maharashtra on 4th August, 2023 and was allotted a seat in respondent No.6-College. The appellant completed the requisite formalities and paid an amount of Rs.13,500/-by way of admission fees. It may be noted that the appellant had applied for admission under the Other Backward Class/Non-Creamy Layer (OBC/NCL) category as being domicile of the State of Maharashtra.

5. However, without issuing notice and without providing any opportunity of being heard to the appellant, respondent No.6-College issued a letter/communication dated 9th August, 2023 cancelling the admission of the appellant.

6. The letter/communication cancelling the admission was challenged by the appellant by filing Writ Petition No. 5141 of 2023 before the Bombay High Court, Nagpur Bench raising a pertinent

ground that the appellant was entitled to the exception as provided under clause 4.8 of the NEET UG-2023 Information Brochure (hereinafter referred to as 'Information Brochure') which pertains to the 'Children of employees of Government of India or its Undertaking' and that cancellation of his admission was totally illegal and arbitrary.

7. The High Court, after considering the entirety of facts and circumstances dismissed the Writ Petition No. 5141 of 2023 vide order dated 5th September, 2023 holding that the appellant did not satisfy the requirements of clauses 4.8 and 9.4.4 of the Information Brochure. It was held that since the appellant did not select specified reservation i.e., in the category of Children of Defence personnel(DEF), while submitting the online application form, he was precluded from raising such a claim at a belated stage, as being impermissible in view of the rider contained in clause 9.4.4 of the Information Brochure.

8. Being aggrieved and dissatisfied with the order dated 5th September, 2023, the appellant filed Misc. Civil Application (Review) No. 980 of 2023 which too was rejected vide order dated 26th October, 2023. These two orders are assailed in the present appeals.

9. Mr. Kshitij Kothale, learned counsel representing the appellant urged that the High Court misconstrued the appellant's claim to be one under Children of Defence personnel(DEF) category because the appellant had sought admission under the OBC/NCL category as being domicile of the State of Maharashtra.

10. He contended that the appellant and his parents are domicile of the State of Maharashtra. The appellant fulfils the requisite criteria for being admitted in the State quota and stood in merit and was allotted a seat in the OBC/NCL category as a domicile of the State of Maharashtra and, thus, cancellation of appellant's admission by the order dated 9th August 2023 is absolutely unjust and arbitrary in addition to being in gross violation of principles of natural justice.

11. Learned counsel urged that two Division Benches of the Bombay High Court, one at Nagpur Bench in ***Archana Sudhakar Mandulkar v. Dean, Govt. Medical College, Nagpur and others***¹ and the other at Principal Seat at Bombay in ***Rajiv Purshottam Wadhwa v. State of Maharashtra(through it's Dept of Medical Education and Drugs & Others***² examined a

similar set of rules/guidelines as prevailing in the present case and while reading down the rules, provided relief to the candidates therein who were similarly circumstanced as the appellant. He placed reliance on the following excerpts(*infra*) from the judgment in the case of **Archana Sudhakar Mandulkar**(*supra*) and contended that the impugned orders are bad in the eyes of law and the appellant herein deserves the relief sought for by directing the respondents to create an additional seat and thereby protecting admission of the appellant in the ongoing session of MBBS (UG) course:-

“3. Shri Kherdekar, the learned counsel for the petitioner, contended that having regard to the object of the Rules, its background, the language used in Clause B(5) and the ratio of various Supreme Court decisions on the validity of various reservations on region/residence basis, the requirement of passing Indian School Certificate Examination “from an institution located in Maharashtra State” is not intended to be applied to the candidates covered by Rule B(3). It seems to us that the contention is well-founded. Course and the examination of the Indian School Certificate Examination is common all over India. Serviceman has no control on his posting which can be anywhere. Rule of denial of admission to a meritorious son/daughter of a serviceman who is domicile of Maharashtra only because of a fortuitous circumstance of his being not posted at the time of his ward studying in 12th Standard within the State of Maharashtra cannot have any nexus to the object of the Rule. Mere chance cannot be the valid disqualifying factor. Such a Rule will not only be arbitrary and unreasonable but will permit discrimination between two classes of servicemen of Maharashtra domicile lactually posted at material time (i) in Maharashtra and (ii) outside Maharashtra. This classification will be clearly invidious having no nexus whatsoever to the object sought to be achieved. Supreme Court has repeatedly held against denial of admissions only on the basis of residence and/or region. Canons of interpretation mandates that interpretation which

leads to unconstitutionality has to be avoided, and harmonious construction to be preferred, if possible. Thus the Rule will have to be interpreted keeping the above principles in view. The Rule is not clearly worded and does present some difficulty in construing it. It is not as if that Clause C applies universally and without exception to all admissions under the Rule. Take for example cases covered by Rule B(4)(iii) — reservation for son or daughter of Non-resident Indians of Maharashtra origin. Even 20 per cent seats out of category B(3) are reserved for Defence Personnel transferred to the Maharashtra Region. It is in this light and background that Rule B(5) has to be read. The terminology “after excluding validly reserved seats” used in Rule B(5) is significant. It means that all parts of Clause C do not universally apply to validly reserved seats under Clause B. This is not to suggest that no part of Clause C applies to any varieties of reservations mentioned in Clause B. All will depend upon a specie of reservation and its intendment. Construed in that light it seems to us that the last part of Rule C(3)(ii) reading as “from an institution located in Maharashtra State” is not intended to be applied to candidate covered by Clause B(3).”

12. *Per contra*, learned counsel representing the respondents controverted the submissions advanced by the appellant’s counsel. He submitted that the appellant could not have been considered for admission under OBC/NCL category under the State quota because he is not covered under clauses 4.5, 4.6 & 4.8 of the Information Brochure. The appellant did not stake a claim for admission in defence personnel quota and hence, he could not have been given a seat under the said category by virtue of the stipulations contained in clause 9.4.4 of the guidelines. On these grounds, he sought dismissal of the appeals.

13. We have given our thoughtful consideration to the submissions advanced at bar and have gone through the impugned orders.

14. There is no dispute that the appellant and his parents are domicile of the State of Maharashtra. The appellant's father is serving in the Border Security Force(BSF). Owing to deployment of his father outside the State of Maharashtra, the appellant passed his SSC and HSC exams from an institution outside the State of Maharashtra.

15. Clause 4.8 of the Information Brochure provides an exception/relaxation for claiming seat in the Maharashtra State quota to Children of employees of Government of India or its Undertaking who have passed SSC and/or HSC or equivalent examination from the recognized institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra. However, this clause imposes a rider that such employee of Government of India or its Undertaking being the parent of the candidate seeking admission in the course under the State quota ***“must have been transferred from outside the State of Maharashtra at a place of work, located in the State of Maharashtra and also must have reported for duty and must be working as on the last date of document verification***

at a place located in the State of Maharashtra". The appellant's father was deployed outside the State of Maharashtra in connection with service of the nation and thus, proviso to Clause 4.8 was relied upon by the respondents while cancelling the admission granted to the appellant in CAP1.

(emphasis supplied)

16. Undisputably, but for the above rider in the guidelines, the appellant is qualified to seek admission in the State Domicile (OBC/NCL) category by virtue of clause 4.8 of the Information Brochure and also stands in merit. However, the proviso creates a situation which would be impossible for the appellant to surmount. The appellant who is a domicile of the State of Maharashtra, cannot control the place of deployment of his father who is serving in the paramilitary force i.e., Border Security Force(BSF). Needless to state that the place of deployment cannot be the choice of the employee serving in the armed forces or a paramilitary force. Being the child of a soldier serving on the country's frontiers, the discriminatory and arbitrary treatment meted out to the appellant under the guidelines cannot be countenanced. The High Court, while denying relief to the appellant held that he had not selected any specified reservation

under the head of Children of Defence personnel(DEF) as provided in Clause 9.4.4 of the Information Brochure. However, the fact remains that the appellant had submitted his OBC/NCL credentials/certificates along with the application form and, his claim for admission was clearly against the Maharashtra State quota as being a domicile of the State of Maharashtra whose father was deployed as a Head Constable(General Duty)[HC(GD)] in BSF.

17. The appellant's application was considered favourably and vide communication dated 4th August, 2023, he was granted admission in respondent No.6-College. He also paid the admission fees etc. However, without issuing any notice and without providing opportunity of being heard to the appellant, respondent No.6-College issued the letter/communication dated 9th August, 2023 cancelling his admission in the course. The said letter/communication was promptly challenged by the appellant by filing the captioned writ petition before the Nagpur Bench of the Bombay High Court on the very next day i.e. 10th August, 2023 and he was also provided interim protection by the Court.

18. Before the High Court, the appellant had placed reliance on the Division Bench judgment in the case of **Archana Sudhakar Mandulkar**(*supra*). The relevant guidelines/rules of admission as

extracted in the judgment of **Archana Sudhakar Mandulkar**(*supra*) are quoted hereinbelow for the sake of ready reference: -

“Relevant Clauses of Rules for admission (M.B.B.S.) 1986–87:

Clause B deals with “Reservations”.

Sub clause (1) of Clause B refers to Backward Class etc., sub-clause (2) to Central Government, sub-clause (3) to sons and daughters of servicemen and ex-servicemen, sub-clause (4) to miscellaneous other reservations including son/daughter of Nonresident Indians of Maharashtra origin and sub-clause (5) to Regional Reservation.

Clause B(3) reads thus:—

“(3) Reservation for sons and daughters of servicemen and ex-servicemen— 5 percent seats of the intake capacity of the college limited to five shall be reserved for the children of servicemen as well as ex-servicemen who are domiciles of Maharashtra. The seats so reserved are inclusive of merit;

Clause B(5) reads thus:-

“(5) Regional Reservation— Subject to the exception mentioned in Rule C(6)(iv) below, 70 percent of open seats, after excluding validly reserved seats, available in Government Medical Colleges situated within the jurisdiction of any University in Maharashtra, shall be reserved for the candidates who are eligible as per Rule C below and have passed the requisite qualifying examination from the School/College situated within the jurisdiction of the same University.”

19. The relevant extract from guidelines/rules of admission prevailing in NEET-UG, 2023 germane to the controversy at hand is quoted hereinbelow for sake of ready reference: -

“4.8 Exception for SSC (10th) and HSC (12th) or equivalent examinations:

Children of employees of Government of India or its Undertakings:-

4.8.1 The children of the employees of Government of India or its Undertaking shall be eligible for admission even though they might have passed the S.S.C. (Std.X) and/or H.S.C. (Std. XII) or equivalent exam from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra, provided that such an employee of Government of India or its Undertaking must have been transferred from outside State of Maharashtra at a place of work, located in the State of Maharashtra and also must have reported for duty and must be working as on the last date of Document verification at a place located in Maharashtra.

4.8.2....”

20. On going through the extracted portion of the Division Bench judgment in the case of **Archana Sudhakar Mandulkar**(*supra*), we find that in an almost identical situation which prevails in the case at hand, the Division Bench read down the rule/guideline which provided that the ward of servicemen should have passed his/her 12th standard from an institution located in the State of Maharashtra. The Division Bench held that the servicemen or his ward desiring admission under the State quota could not have had any control over his posting which can be anywhere. The Division Bench held that the rule of denial of admission to a meritorious son/daughter of a serviceman who is domicile of Maharashtra only because of a fortuitous circumstance of his being not posted at the time of his ward studying in 12th standard within the State of Maharashtra cannot have any nexus to the

object of the rule. Mere chance cannot be a valid disqualifying factor. Such rule will not only be arbitrary and unreasonable but will permit discrimination between two classes of servicemen of Maharashtra domicile actually posted at the material time (i) in Maharashtra and (ii) outside Maharashtra. This classification will be clearly invidious having no nexus whatsoever to the object sought to be achieved.

21. In the extant admission process, a slight modification has been made in the guidelines inasmuch as, now as per clause 4.8.1 of Information Brochure, the children of employees of the Government of India or its Undertaking have been made eligible for admission even though they might have passed SSC and/or HSC or equivalent exam from a recognised institution situated outside the State of Maharashtra. However, while making such relaxation, a condition has been imposed that the employee of Government of India or its Undertaking being the parent of the candidate should have been transferred back to the State of Maharashtra and also have reported for duty and must be working as on the last date of the document verification at a place located in Maharashtra. We feel that this condition as imposed by the guidelines, creates a stipulation which would be impossible

for the candidate or his parent to fulfill. It may be reiterated that the place of posting is not within the control of the employee or the candidate. Thus, the distinction drawn by the clause between two categories of employees in the Government of India services (i) those posted in Maharashtra and (ii) those posted outside Maharashtra has no nexus with the intent and purpose of the guidelines/rules and hence the same deserves to be read down to such extent. Thus, this Court has no hesitation in providing that the candidate(s) who are born in Maharashtra and whose parents are also domicile of the State of Maharashtra and are employees of the Government of India or its Undertaking, such candidate(s) would be entitled to a seat under the Maharashtra State quota irrespective of the place of posting of the parent(s) because the place of deployment would not be under the control of the candidate or his parents.

22. The Division Bench of Bombay High Court at Nagpur while rejecting the writ petition filed by the appellant, fell into manifest error in not considering case of the appellant in the correct perspective. For that reason, the impugned judgment is unsustainable in facts as well as in law. *A fortiori*, the letter/communication dated 9th August, 2023 issued by

respondent No. 6 cancelling the admission granted to the appellant against the Maharashtra State quota in CAP1 without giving opportunity to show cause is also illegal and arbitrary and deserves to be quashed and set aside.

23. However, there is a practical hurdle which comes in the way of the appellant for being provided admission in the MBBS course in the current session which has progressed significantly from August, 2023. More than six months have passed by since the session started. As per the reply of the respondents, no seat is lying vacant in any college in Maharashtra State quota as on date.

24. Undisputably, the appellant has been illegally deprived from his rightful admission in the first year of the MBBS course owing to the insensitive, unjust, illegal and arbitrary approach of the respondents and so also on account of the delay occasioned in the judicial process.

25. This Court in the case of ***Manoj Kumar v. Union of India and Others***³ considered the concept of restitutive relief. Hon'ble P.S. Narasimha, J. speaking for the Bench, observed that concomitant duty of the Constitutional Court is to take reasonable measures to restitute the injured which is the overarching

Constitutional purpose. The relevant paras from the aforesaid judgment are extracted below:-

“19. We are of the opinion that while the primary duty of constitutional courts remains the control of power, including setting aside of administrative actions that may be illegal or arbitrary, it must be acknowledged that such measures may not singularly address repercussions of abuse of power. It is equally incumbent upon the courts, as a secondary measure, to address the injurious consequences arising from arbitrary and illegal actions. This concomitant duty to take reasonable measures to restitute the injured is our overarching constitutional purpose. This is how we have read our constitutional text, and this is how we have built our precedents on the basis of our preambular objective to secure justice.

20. In public law proceedings, when it is realised that the prayer in the writ petition is unattainable due to passage of time, constitutional courts may not dismiss the writ proceedings on the ground of their perceived futility. In the life of litigation, passage of time can stand both as an ally and adversary. Our duty is to transcend the constraints of time and perform the primary duty of a constitutional court to control and regulate the exercise of power or arbitrary action. By taking the first step, the primary purpose and object of public law proceedings will be subserved.

21. The second step relates to restitution. This operates in a different dimension. Identification and application of appropriate remedial measures poses a significant challenge to constitutional courts, largely attributable to the dual variables of time and limited resources.

22. The temporal gap between the impugned illegal or arbitrary action and their subsequent adjudication by the courts introduces complexities in the provision of restitution. As time elapses, the status of persons, possession, and promises undergoes transformation, directly influencing the nature of relief that may be formulated and granted.

23. The inherent difficulty in bridging the time gap between the illegal impugned action and restitution is certainly not rooted in deficiencies within the law or legal jurisprudence but rather in systemic issues inherent in the adversarial judicial process. The protracted timeline

spanning from the filing of a writ petition, service of notice, filing of counter affidavits, final hearing, and then the eventual delivery of judgment, coupled with subsequent appellate procedures, exacerbates delays. Take for example this very case, the writ petition was filed against the action of the respondent denying appointment on 22.05.2017. The writ petition came to be decided by the Single Judge on 24.01.2018, the Division Bench on 16.10.2018, and then the case was carried to this Court in the year 2019 and we are deciding it in 2024. The delay in this case is not unusual, we see several such cases when our final hearing board moves. Appeals of more than two decades are awaiting consideration. It is distressing but certainly not beyond us. We must and we will find a solution to this problem.”

26. Seen in the light of the above judgment, it is now to be considered as to the measures of restitutive relief which can be provided to the appellant in the present case.

27. This Court in the case of ***S. Krishna Sradha v. State of Andhra Pradesh and Others***⁴ examined the issue of wrongful denial of admission in a medical course, and propounded the theory of ‘restitutive justice’ by holding as below:-

“13. In light of the discussion/observations made hereinabove, a meritorious candidate/ student who has been denied an admission in MBBS course illegally or irrationally by the authorities for no fault of his/her and who has approached the Court in time and so as to see that such a meritorious candidate may not have to suffer for no fault of his/her, we answer the reference as under:

13.1. That in a case where candidate/student has approached the court at the earliest and without any delay and that the question is with respect to the admission in medical

course all the efforts shall be made by the court concerned to dispose of the proceedings by giving priority and at the earliest.

13.2. Under exceptional circumstances, if the court finds that there is no fault attributable to the candidate and the candidate has pursued his/her legal right expeditiously without any delay and there is fault only on the part of the authorities and/or there is apparent breach of rules and regulations as well as related principles in the process of grant of admission which would violate the right of equality and equal treatment to the competing candidates and if the time schedule prescribed – 30th September, is over, to do the complete justice, the Court under exceptional circumstances and in rarest of rare cases direct the admission in the same year by directing to increase the seats, however, it should not be more than one or two seats and such admissions can be ordered within reasonable time, i.e., within one month from 30th September, i.e., cut off date and under no circumstances, the Court shall order any Admission in the same year beyond 30th October. However, it is observed that such relief can be granted only in exceptional circumstances and in the rarest of rare cases. In case of such an eventuality, the Court may also pass an order cancelling the admission given to a candidate who is at the bottom of the merit list of the category who, if the admission would have been given to a more meritorious candidate who has been denied admission illegally, would not have got the admission, if the Court deems it fit and proper, however, after giving an opportunity of hearing to a student whose admission is sought to be cancelled.

13.3. In case the Court is of the opinion that no relief of admission can be granted to such a candidate in the very academic year and wherever it finds that the action of the authorities has been arbitrary and in breach of the rules and regulations or the prospectus affecting the rights of the students and that

a candidate is found to be meritorious and such candidate/student has approached the court at the earliest and without any delay, the court can mould the relief and direct the admission to be granted to such a candidate in the next academic year by issuing appropriate directions by directing to increase in the number of seats as may be considered appropriate in the case and in case of such an eventuality and if it is found that the management was at fault and wrongly denied the admission to the meritorious candidate, in that case, the Court may direct to reduce the number of seats in the management quota of that year, meaning thereby the student/students who was/were denied admission illegally to be accommodated in the next academic year out of the seats allotted in the management quota.

13.4. Grant of the compensation could be an additional remedy but not a substitute for restitutional remedies. Therefore, in an appropriate case the Court may award the compensation to such a meritorious candidate who for no fault of his/her has to lose one full academic year and who could not be granted any relief of admission in the same academic year.

13.5. It is clarified that the aforesaid directions pertain to Admission in MBBS Course only and we have not dealt with post graduate medical course.”

(emphasis supplied)

28. In the light of the above judgment, it would neither be desirable nor justifiable to grant admission to the appellant in the on-going session of the MBBS(UG) course. However, considering the fact that the order cancelling the admission of the appellant

herein was issued on 9th August, 2023 and the writ petition came to be filed before the High Court promptly i.e. on 10th August, 2023, without any delay whatsoever, the appellant is entitled to restoration of his seat in the first year of MBBS(UG) course in the same college in the next session, i.e., NEET UG-2024.

29. We further direct that until a suitable rectification is made in the guidelines/rules, candidate(s) domicile of the State of Maharashtra having acquired SSC and/or HSC qualification from any recognized institution: -

- (i) Whose parent(s) are domiciles of Maharashtra and employed in the Central Government or its Undertaking, defence services and/or in paramilitary forces viz. CRPF, BSF, etc. and;
- (ii) Such parent(s) are posted at any place in the country as on the last date of document verification, shall be entitled for a seat in MBBS Course in the Maharashtra State quota.

30. It is further directed that the appellant shall be provided admission in the 'OBC category domicile of State of Maharashtra child of person serving the Government of India' in the first year of the MBBS(UG) course commencing from the year 2024 by creating

an additional seat so as to ensure that there is no reduction in the quota of seats to the candidates who succeed in the NEET UG-2024.

31. The impugned orders are set aside. The appeals are accordingly allowed.

32. We also direct respondent No.6-College and respondent No.5-State of Maharashtra to pay compensation to the tune of Rs.1 lakh(Rs. 50,000/- each) to the appellant for the deprivation of one year and harassment on the account of illegal and arbitrary cancellation of his admission.

33. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.

MAHARASHTRA ACT No. XVI OF 2024

An Act to specify certain communities as the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes in relation to the State of Maharashtra and to provide for reservation of seats for admission in educational institutions in the State and for reservation of posts for appointments in public services and posts under the State to such Socially and Educationally Backward Classes in the State of Maharashtra for their advancement and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

WHEREAS it is expedient to specify certain communities as the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes in relation to the State of Maharashtra and to provide for reservation of seats for admission in educational institutions in the State and for reservation of posts for appointments in public services and posts under the State to such Socially

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and Educationally Backward Classes in the State of Maharashtra for their advancement and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto; it is hereby enacted in the Seventy-fifth Year of the Republic of India, as follows :—

Short title and commencement.

1. (1) This Act may be called the Maharashtra State Reservation for Socially and Educationally Backward Classes Act, 2024.

(2) It shall come into force on the date of publication of this Act in the *Official Gazette*.

Definitions.

2. (1) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a) “admission authority”, in relation to admissions to educational institutions, means the authority having supervisory and controlling powers over the educational institutions responsible for admissions to particular educational institutions ;

(b) “appointing authority”, in relation to public services and posts, means the authority empowered to make appointments to such services and posts ;

(c) “Competent Authority” means the Competent Authority appointed under section 7 ;

(d) “educational institutions” includes the educational institutions in the State of Maharashtra owned and controlled by the Government, which receives grant-in-aid from the Government, universities established by or under the relevant Maharashtra Acts, private educational institutions, whether aided or un-aided by the State, other than the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution of India.

Explanation.—For the purposes of this clause, the expression “private educational institutions” means institutions which have been given either prior to coming into force of this Act or thereafter, aid in the form of Government land at concessional rates or any other monetary concessions by the Government, or are recognized, permitted, supervised or controlled by the Government ;

(e) “establishment” means any office of the Government or of a local authority or statutory authority constituted under any Act of the State Legislature for the time being in force, or university or company or corporation or co-operative society in which share capital is held by the Government or any Government aided institutions.

Explanation.—For the purposes of this clause, the expression “Government aided institutions” shall also include institutions or industries which have been given, either prior to coming into force of this Act or thereafter, aid in the form of Government land at concessional rates or any other monetary concessions by the Government or is recognized, licensed, supervised or controlled by the Government ;

(f) “Government” or “State Government” means the Government of Maharashtra ;

(g) “prescribed” means prescribed by rules made under this Act ;

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(h) "public services and posts" means the services and posts in connection with the affairs of the State and includes services and posts in,—

(i) a local authority ;

(ii) a co-operative society registered under the Maharashtra Co-operative Societies Act, 1960, in which the Government is a share holder ;

(iii) a board or a corporation or a statutory body established by or under a Central Act or a State Act which is owned and controlled by the Government, or a Government company as defined in the Companies Act, 2013 ;

(iv) an educational institution owned and controlled by the Government, which receives grant-in-aid from the Government including a university established by or under a Maharashtra Act; and

(v) any other establishment in respect of which reservation was applicable by Government orders on the date of commencement of this Act and which are not covered under sub-clauses (i) to (iv) ;

(i) "reservation" means the reservation of seats, for admission in educational institutions and reservation of posts for appointments in the public services and posts to the persons belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes in the State ;

(j) "Socially and Educationally Backward Classes" means the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes as specified under this Act for the purposes of the State of Maharashtra in accordance with article 342A of the Constitution of India ;

(k) "State" means the State of Maharashtra.

(2) The words and expressions used in this Act, but not defined, shall have the same meanings respectively assigned to them in the Maharashtra State Public Services (Reservation for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, De-notified Tribes (*Vimukta Jatis*), Nomadic Tribes, Special Backward Category and Other Backward Classes) Act, 2001.

3. The Maratha Community is hereby specified as the Socially and Educationally Backward Class for the purposes of the State.

4. (1) This Act shall apply to all the direct recruitments and appointments made in the public services and posts in the State except,—

(a) the super specialized posts in medical, technical and educational field ;

(b) the posts to be filled by transfer or deputation ;

(c) the temporary appointments of less than forty-five days duration ; and

(d) the post which is single (isolated) in any cadre or grade.

(2) This Act shall also apply, for admissions in educational institutions including private educational institutions, whether aided or un-aided by the State, other than the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution of India.

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(3) The State Government shall, while entering into or renewing an agreement with any educational institution or any establishment for the grant of any aid as provided in the explanation to clauses (d) and (e) of section 2, respectively, incorporate a condition for compliance of the provisions of this Act, by such educational institution or establishment.

(4) For the removal of doubts, it is hereby declared that nothing in this Act shall affect the reservation provided to the Other Backward Classes under the Maharashtra State Public Services (Reservation for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, De-notified Tribes (*Vimukta Jatis*), Nomadic Tribes, Special Backward Category and Other Backward Classes) Act, 2001 and the Maharashtra Private Professional Educational Institutions (Reservation of seats for admission for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, De-notified Tribes (*Vimukta Jatis*), Nomadic Tribes and Other Backward Classes) Act, 2006.

5. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in any judgment, decree or order of any court or other authority, and subject to the other provisions of this Act,—

(a) ten per cent. of the total seats in educational institutions including private educational institutions, whether aided or un-aided by the State, other than minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution of India ; and

(b) ten per cent. of the total appointments in direct recruitment in public services and posts under the State,

shall be separately reserved for the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes :

Provided that, the above reservation shall not be applicable to the posts reserved in favour of the Scheduled Tribes candidates in the Scheduled Areas of the State under the Fifth Schedule to the Constitution of India as per the notification issued, from time to time, by the Governor, in this behalf.

(2) The principle of Creamy Layer shall be applicable for the purposes of reservation to the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes under this Act and reservation under this Act shall be available only to the persons belonging to the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes who are not falling in Creamy Layer.

Explanation.—For the purposes of this sub-section, the expression "Creamy Layer" means the person falling in the category of Creamy Layer as declared by the Government by general or special orders issued in this behalf, from time to time.

Reservation
not to be
affected.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in section 5, the claims of students or persons belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes shall also be considered for the allotment on unreserved seats and appointments on public services and posts which shall be filled on the basis of merit, and where students or persons belonging to such classes is selected on the basis of merit, the number of seats and appointments reserved for the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes, shall not in any way be affected.

Competent
Authority.

7. (1) The Government may, by notification in the *Official Gazette*, appoint any officer not below the rank of the District Social Welfare Officer to be the Competent Authority for such area as may be specified in such

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notification for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this Act and the rules made thereunder.

(2) The Competent Authority shall exercise such powers and perform such functions, as may be prescribed.

8. (1) If in respect of any recruitment year, any vacancy reserved for Socially and Educationally Backward Classes of persons remains unfilled, such vacancy shall be carried forward upto five years in case of direct recruitment :

Carrying forward of reserved vacancies.

Provided that, on the date of commencement of this Act, if any Government Order, Resolution, Circular and Office Memorandum regarding filling of posts is in force then, the same shall continue to be in force unless modified or revoked by the Government :

Provided further that, if the sanctioned posts are not adequate to allocate atleast one post for each reserved category, then the reserved post shall be filled in by applying the principle of rotation in accordance with the Government roster orders or rules as may be prescribed or modified in this behalf.

(2) When a vacancy is carried forward as provided in sub-section (1), it shall not be counted against the quota of the vacancies reserved for the concerned classes of persons for the recruitment year to which it is carried forward :

Provided that, the appointing authority may, at any time, undertake a special recruitment drive to fill up such unfilled vacancies and if such vacancies remain unfilled even after such special recruitment drive then, it shall be filled up in the manner prescribed by the Government.

9. (1) The Government may, by order in writing, entrust upon every admission authority or appointing authority or any officer under such authority, with the responsibility of ensuring the compliance with the provisions of this Act.

Responsibility and powers for compliance of Act.

(2) The Government may, in the like manner, invest the admission authority or appointing authority or officer with such powers or authority as may be necessary for such authority or officer, to effectively discharge such duty assigned to such authority or officer.

10. (1) Any admission authority or appointing authority or officer or employee entrusted with the duty or responsibility who willfully acts in a manner intended to contravene or defeat the purposes of this Act shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to ninety days or fine, which may extend to twenty-five thousand rupees, or with both.

Penalty.

(2) No court shall take cognizance of an offence punishable under this section except with the previous sanction of the Government or officer authorized in this behalf by the Government.

11. When it comes to the notice of the Government or is brought to its notice that any person belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes is adversely affected, on account of non-compliance with the provisions of this Act or the rules made thereunder or the Government orders

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issued in this behalf, by any admission authority or appointing authority, it may call for such records and pass such appropriate orders as it deems fit.

(1) The provisions of this Act shall not apply to the cases in which selection process has already been initiated before the commencement of this Act, and such cases shall be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of law and the Government orders as they stood before such commencement. <i>Explanation.</i>—For the purposes of this section, the selection process shall be deemed to have been initiated where, under the relevant service rules,— (i) recruitment is to be made on the basis of written test or interview only, and such written test or the interview, as the case may be, has started; or

(2) The provisions of this Act shall not apply to admissions in educational institutions and the cases in which the admission process has already been initiated before the commencement of this Act and such cases shall be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of law and the Government orders, as they stood before such commencement.

Explanation. - For the purposes of this section, the admission process shall be deemed to have initiated where,—

(i) admission is to be made on the basis of any entrance test, and procedure for such entrance test has started; or

(ii) in case of admission to be made other than on the basis of entrance test, the last date for filling the form is lapsed.

19. (1) If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Government may, as occasion arises, by an order published in the *Official Gazette*, do anything not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, which appears to it to be necessary or expedient for the purpose of removing the difficulty :

Power to remove difficulty.

Provided that, no such order shall be made after expiry of the period of two years from the date of commencement of this Act.

(2) Every order made under sub-section (1) shall be laid, as soon as may be, after it is made, before each House of the State Legislature.

20. (1) The Maharashtra State Reservation (of seats for admission in educational institutions in the State and for appointments in the public services and posts under the State) for Socially and Educationally Backward Classes (SEBC) Act, 2018 is hereby repealed.

Repeal and saving.

(2) The provisions of section 7 of the Maharashtra General Clauses Act with regard to effect of repeal shall apply.

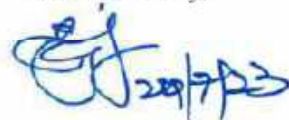

With reference to the subject and the Acts/Gazette notifications mentioned above (as amended from time to time), I am directed to say that the NCISM has decided to designate the following authorities for the conduction of counselling for admission in ASU-UG & PG courses for the academic session 2023-24.

- Counseling for admission in AIQ seats of ASU-UG & PG courses under Government, Government Aided ASU colleges, National Institutes, Central Universities, and Deemed Universities shall be conducted by AACCC, Ministry of Ayush.
 - Counseling for admission in AIQ seats of ASU-UG & PG courses of Private Institutions other than Deemed Universities shall be conducted by the respective counseling authorities of State/UT Government.
 - Counseling for admission in ASU-UG & PG courses of State/UT quota seats shall be conducted by the respective counseling authorities of State/UT Government.
2. The guidelines / schedule for conduction of Central and State/UT Counseling for admission for the academic year 2023-24 will be issued by the NCISM and all counselling authorities are directed to abide by the guidelines and counselling schedule accordingly.

1. The Commission shall not approve any admission/registration if made through offline mode or without the approval of the designated Counseling/Admission authority.
2. To strictly adhere to / comply the directives issued by the Competent Authority and regulatory provisions with respect to Counseling for Admission in Undergraduate courses of Homoeopathy for the academic session 2023-24.
3. The non-compliance or violation to the issued directives regulatory provisions for admission/registration by the participating institutes shall invite strict action/penalties.
4. To visit AACCC UG portal (www.aaccc.gov.in) and National Commission for Homoeopathy website (www.nch.org.in) frequently to note for any updation / change, further direction, counseling scheme/schedule, FAQ's and other notices about counseling for admission.

Homoeopathy (ASU&H) Streams for the Academic Session 2023-2024**

A. DIRECTIVE FOR COUNSELING AUTHORITIES (CENTRAL/STATE/UT)

I. Directive for Central/State/UT Counseling and Admissions:

Eligibility Criteria to Participate in the Counseling:

1. Colleges/Institute who have received permission from the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) for Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani streams; Medical Assessment and Rating Board, National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH) for admission to ASU&H- UG courses for the academic session 2023-2024 shall only be eligible to participate in the counseling process.

Seat Matrix (AIQ & State/UT Quota):

2. The seat matrix for admission in the Government, Government-aided institutions and Private Institutions shall be fifteen per cent (15%) for All-India Quota and eighty-five per cent (85%) for State/Union Territory Quota as specified in the NCISM and NCH Regulations in force at the time of admission (Sl.No:15 of this directives).

Provided that-

- i. the AIQ for the purpose of admission in all the Deemed Universities (both Government and Private - established under Central Act), shall be hundred per cent;
- ii. the University and institute, which are already having more than fifteen per cent All-India Quota seats, shall continue to maintain that quota;
- iii. five per cent. of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government and Government-aided institutions shall be filled up by candidate with specified disability in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) and based on the merit list of NEET(UG)-2023.

3. In case of 85% of State/UT quota, the seat matrix for Government Quota, Management Quota, NRI quota etc., shall be as per respective State and UT policy; however, all admissions in all quotas (except foreign nationals) shall be through counseling conducted by State/UT counseling authority.

4. The Management seats under the State/UT Quota in Private Institutions shall be treated as domicile free.

Reservation:

5. Category-wise reservation of seats shall be as per Central or State or UT Reservation Policy, as the case may be.

6. Reservation for allotment of 15% AIQ-UG seats in Private ASU&H Institutes:-All AIQ-UG seats of Private ASU & H Institutes are open in nature (all category candidates are eligible). However, as mentioned in relevant regulations, the relaxation in qualifying criteria may be provided category-wise.

Counseling schedule:

7. Central and State/UT conseling authorities shall prepare the counseling schedule for the A.Y. 2023-2024 in concurrence to the schedule specified by NCISM/NCH as given below:

Counseling and Admissions:

8. All sanctioned/permitted seats by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (MARBISM)/NCISM/ Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy (MARBH)/NCH/Government of India, irrespective of categories/reservations, are to be filled only through online counseling, i.e., Central/State/UT counseling as the case may be (except foreign nationals).

9. Ayush Admissions Central Counseling Committee (AACCC), Ministry of Ayush will conduct "AIQ-UG Online Counseling" for admission in Govt./Govt. Aided Colleges/Institutes, Central/Deemed Universities and National Institutes of ASU&H streams.

10. Further, the State/UT Counseling authorities shall conduct counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act).

11. State/UT Counseling Authorities have to conduct counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act) in adherence with directive/schedule provided by NCISM/NCH to avoid the overlapping of the Schedule of AACCC counseling and State/UT counseling.

12. In case of 85% of State/UT Quota, the seat matrix for Government Quota, Management Quota, NRI Quota etc., shall be as per respective State and UT policy; however, all admissions in all quotas (except foreign nationals) shall be through counseling conducted by State/UT counseling authority.

13. Seat allotment in any category shall be as per inter-se-merit.

14. No candidate who has failed to obtain the minimum eligibility marks in NEET (UG)-2023 shall be eligible for admission to Undergraduate courses for the academic year 2023-24.

15. Qualification Criterion: (As per the ASU&H-UG Regulations in force at the time of admission)

(a) *National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022*

(b) *National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Unani Education) Regulations-2022*

(c) *National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Siddha Education) Regulations-2022*

(d) *National Commission for Homoeopathy (Homoeopathy Graduate Degree Course-Bachelor Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S) Regulations-2022*

For admission to ASU&H-UG Courses:

16. Passing marks for eligibility in admission to ASU&H-UG courses should be as per the ASU&H-UG regulations and should be followed strictly. The details of qualifications for different categories are as follows:

(a) For ASU- UG Courses -Candidate must have obtained a minimum of 50% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology at the 10+2 or equivalent examination

in the case of general category and 40% Marks in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, and Other Backward Classes.

(b) For Homeopathy-UG Course - Candidate must have obtained a minimum of 50% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Biotechnology at the 10+2 or equivalent examination in the case of general category and 40% Marks in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, and Other Backward Classes.

(c) In respect of persons with disability as specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum qualifying marks in the said qualifying examination as follows: a) shall be 45% in the case of the general category. b) 40% in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

17. No candidate shall be admitted to BAMS, BSMS, BUMS & BHMS Degree Courses unless he/she has attained the age of seventeen years on or before the 31st December of the year of his/her admission in the first year of the course. Further, there is no upper age limit for admission to ASU&H-UG courses.

18. In order to be eligible for admission to an undergraduate course for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in the 'National Eligibility Entrance Test for the undergraduate course' held for the said academic year:

Provided that in respect of-

(a) candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at the 40th percentile;

(b) candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile in the case of the General category and 40th percentile in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

19. No Authority or Institution shall admit any candidate to the Undergraduate courses in contravention of the criteria or procedure in respect of admissions, and any admissions made in contravention shall be cancelled by the NCISM/NCH.

20. Admissions made beyond/over and above the intake capacity sanctioned/permited by MARBISM/NCISM/MARBH/NCH/GOI for the said academic session shall not be approved.

21. There shall not be any offline admission or admission without counseling (Central/State/UT), and any admissions in contravention of this shall not be approved (except foreign nationals).

22. Seats allotted by the respective counseling authorities to the individual institutes, the original documents of the candidates must be verified by the institutes for fulfilling the eligibility criteria, failing which the admission shall not be approved by NCISM/NCH.

23. Admission made in violation of the NCISM / NCH directives will be treated as invalid, and action will be initiated under NCISM Act, 2020 / NCH Act, 2020.

24. Institutes will be held responsible in case students face hardship due to admission irregularities such as offline admissions, admission without counseling and admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity. In such case, students shall be discharged from the course and institution, and the institute will be subjected to face consequences as per the provision laid down under the sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28 of NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act 2020, and the person responsible will be prosecuted as per the section of IPC concerned.

25. Admissions made after the cut-off date by any means, shall not be approved NCISM/NCH.

26. No authority has the power to extend or modify the cut-off date of admission specified by NCISM/NCH, and such admissions shall not be approved.

27. No authority has the power to modify the intake capacity for admission into UG courses in ASU&H colleges sanctioned by MARBISM/NCISM/MARBH/NCH/GOI.

28. State/UT Counseling Authorities may direct ASU&H colleges/institutes to ensure the eligibility of the candidate as laid down in respective NCISM (MSE-UG) Regulations 2022 for Ayurveda, Siddha & Unani for admissions in ASU-UG courses and NCH (Homoeopathy Graduate Degree Course – Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S). Regulations- 2022 for admissions in Homoeopathy-UG courses by proper scrutiny of the relevant certificates and documents at the time of admission.

29. AACCC, M/o Ayush will circulate the list of ineligible candidates to the State/UT counseling Authority during the 2nd, 3rd & Stray Vacancy Round of AACCC-UG counseling to prevent them from participating in the State/UT counseling. State/UT Counseling Authorities are requested to ensure that such candidates have not been allotted any seat through any round of State/UT counseling for admission in ASU&H-UG courses.

30. State/UT Counseling Authorities may direct ASU&H colleges/institutes to ensure the authenticity and correctness of the details of admitted students before completing the admission procedures. No modifications/ corrections after the cut-off date and time of admission as specified by NCISM/NCH shall be entertained.

31. Central/State/UT Counseling authorities have to submit a list of allotted students (i.e. college-wise consolidated list of allotted students through all rounds of counseling) to NCISM/NCH within 15 working days from the cut-off date of admission in the format and in manner as prescribed by NCISM/NCH.

32. All State/UT Counseling Authorities are requested to see the website of AACCC, M/o Ayush (www.aaccc.gov.in), from time to time for AACCC-UG counseling scheme & FAQs, Schedule and any updates/notices uploaded regarding All India Quota-ASU&H-UG counseling for the A.Y 2023-24.

33. State / UT counseling for ASU&H, UG Courses shall be started only after Central Counseling has commenced, in accordance with the schedule issued by NCISM/NCH.

Admission of foreign national candidates:

34. The admission of ICCR (Indian Council for Cultural Relations) sponsored foreign national candidates shall be made through Ministry of Ayush.

Determination of fees and other charges in case of ASU&H colleges/institutes under NCISM/NCH:

35. The fee for 50 percentage (50%) of total sanctioned/permitted seats in Private ASU&H medical colleges/institutes and deemed universities which are governed under the NCISM Act, 2020/NCH Act, 2020, is to be determined by Fee fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of the respective State/UT/Deemed University as per the directive for "Determination of fee and all other charges" prescribed by NCISM (BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16-09-2022), and NCH (F.No 1-11/2022/NCH/10322-10331 dated 23.11.2022) which has been implemented from the A.Y 2022-23 onwards.

Tuition fee:

36. All State/UT Counseling authorities are requested to ensure that the tuition fee, as laid down and fixed by respective governing or fee fixation committees as applicable, shall be charged in each academic session for four and half years only by the institutes. No tuition fee shall be charged for an extended duration of study in case of failing in examinations or for any other reasons, and there shall not be any fee for internship training at the same institute.

37. All State/UT Counseling authorities are requested to ensure that the college should display tuition fees, hostel fees, and other fees if any on institute's website as well as on the Institute profile while uploading to central/state/UT counseling Portal. The same is to be charged from student at the time of admission. No other charges other than the displayed fees should be charged/collected.

II. Directive for State/UT counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act)

1. The State/UT Counseling authorities shall conduct counseling for 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under Central Act).

2. State/UT Counseling Authorities have to conduct counseling for admission in 15% of AIQ-UG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/ State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under Central Act) in adherence with directive/schedule provided by NCISM/NCH to **avoid the overlapping** of the Schedule of AACCC counseling and State or UT counseling.

3. State/UT counseling authorities shall conduct 2 Rounds of counselling for admission in 15% All India Quota (AIQ) UG seats of Private ASU&H Institutes/Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act). The AIQ seats that remain vacant after the second round of State/UT counselling may be transferred and converted to the State/UT Government quota seats, and the same shall be filled up in further rounds as per State Government norms/ rules.

4. State/UT counseling authorities should give wider publicity among NEET(UG)- 2023 qualified ASU&H-UG aspirants regarding the registration process of counseling & provide sufficient time for registration before each round of counseling for admission in AIQ-UG seats of Private ASU&H Institutes.

5. State/UT may decide on an all-inclusive application Cost/Non-refundable Registration Fee for counseling for admission in ASU&H-UG seats for all category students. However, the maximum ceiling limit for this fee will be Rs 2000/-.
6. State/UT may decide on refundable security money, which will be refunded to candidates after joining the allotted college or if the candidate does not get any seat during counseling. However, the maximum ceiling limit for this fee will be Rs. 50,000/- for UG seats.
7. The Security money will be forfeited if a candidate does not join the allotted seat of Round-2 or surrender/withdraw the seat allotted in Round-2 based on the candidate's request. Further, the Security money will also be forfeited if the allotted seat of Round-2 is cancelled due to any unforeseen reason from the candidate's end. For example, the candidate gives wrong information at the time of registration on the basis of which a seat may be allotted and later cancelled by the Admission Authorities at the time of reporting or fails to produce the required documents at the time of admission (within the stipulated time).
8. Make a provision to Round-2 admitted candidates of All India Quota Private (UG) counseling so that they can withdraw/surrender their admitted seat by forfeiting of security money only during a specific time period provided by State/UT authority (State/UT authorities can decide this time period to withdraw/surrender the admitted seat of Round-2 as per their counseling schedule). After the said period, candidates will not be allowed to withdraw/surrender their admitted seats of Round-2. If they do so, they will be ineligible for any further AYUSH counseling conducted by Central/State/UT.
9. No domicile certificate is required for allotment of AIQ-UG seats of Private ASU & H Institutes.
10. Reservation for allotment of 15% AIQ-UG seats in Private ASU&H Institutes:- all AIQ-UG seats of Private ASU & H Institutes are open in nature (all category candidates are eligible). However, as mentioned in relevant regulations, the relaxation in qualifying criteria may be provided category-wise.
11. For PwD candidates, the PwD certificate should be as per the directive issued by Central Government and notified by the NCISM/NCH. (available on counseling website (www.aaccc.gov.in) under Counseling Scheme & FAQs.
12. State/UT Counseling authority shall run an effective Query Redressal System to facilitate the counseling and admission process of UG courses and provide email ID & Phone no of the same on the State/UT counseling Authority's website.

B. DIRECTIVE FOR UNIVERSITIES

1. In case of admission in Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani and Homoeopathy courses, University shall approve the admissions made by any college/institute with proper permission from the MARBISM/MARBH/NCISM/NCH Government of India for the academic session 2023-2024.
2. University shall not approve offline admissions; admissions without counselling (Central/State/UT); admissions after cut-off-date and beyond sanctioned intake capacity.
3. AACCC, M/o Ayush conducts three rounds of online counseling for ASU&H-UG seats under Deemed Universities. The seats that remain vacant after 3rd Round of AACCC-UG counseling will be reverted to the respective Deemed Universities (established under Central

Act) to conduct Stray Vacancy Round at the institute level, for which the AACCC, M/o Ayush will provide the list of registered eligible candidates and is to be exercised strictly in order of merit. Only candidates registered in the AACCC-UG counseling are eligible for the Stray Vacancy Round, conducted by Deemed Universities.

C. DIRECTIVE FOR COLLEGES/INSTITUTES

1. No candidate who has failed to obtain the minimum eligibility marks in NEET (UG)-2023 shall be admitted to ASU&H Undergraduate courses, for the academic year 2023-24.
2. No Authority or Institution shall admit any candidate to the Undergraduate courses in contravention of the criteria or procedure in respect of admissions, and any admissions made in contravention shall be cancelled by the NCISM/NCH.
3. Admissions made beyond/ over and above the intake capacity sanctioned/ permitted by MARBISM/NCISM/MARBH/NCH/GOI for the said academic session shall not be approved.
4. There shall not be any offline admission or admission without counseling (Central/State/UT) or admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity, and any admissions in contravention of this shall not be approved.
5. Admission made in violation of the NCISM / NCH directives will be treated as invalid, and action will be initiated under NCISM Act, 2020/NCH Act, 2020.
6. Institutes will be held responsible in case students face hardship due to admission irregularities such as offline admissions, admission without counseling and admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity etc. In such case, students shall be discharged from the course and institution, and the institute will be subjected to face consequences as per the provision laid down under the sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28 of NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act 2020, and the persons responsible will be prosecuted as per the section of IPC concerned.
7. Admissions made after the cut-off date by any means, shall not be approved NCISM/NCH.
8. No authority has the power to extend or modify the cut-off date of admission specified by NCISM/NCH, and such admissions shall not be approved.
9. No authority has the power to modify the intake capacity for admission to UG courses in ASU&H colleges sanctioned by MARBISM/NCISM/ MARBH/ NCH/GOI.
10. ASU&H colleges/institutes should ensure the eligibility of the candidate as laid down in respective regulations as mentioned in this directive (Sl.No:15).
11. It is requested that all participating institutes must visit Central (AACCC-UG portal: www.aaccc.gov.in), and concerned state/UT counselling portal from time to time for counseling scheme& FAQs, Schedule and any updates/notices regarding UG counseling 2023-24.
12. ASU&H colleges/institutes should ensure the authenticity and correctness of the details of admitted students before completing admission procedures. No modifications/ corrections after the cut-off date and time of admission as specified by NCISM/NCH shall be entertained.

13. The colleges should follow the central/state/UT counseling schedule and upload the details of admitted students and vacant seats if any for each round on the concerned counseling authority portal even on holidays.

14. The list of all admitted students with all details shall be uploaded and submitted to NCISM/NCH in the format prescribed by NCISM/NCH on or before 6 pm on the cut-off date (20-11-2023) for admission as specified by NCISM/NCH.

Determination of fees and other charges in case of ASU&H colleges/institutes under NCISM/NCH:

1. The fee for 50 percentage (50%) of total sanctioned/permitted seats in Private ASU&H medical colleges/institutes and deemed universities which are governed under the NCISM Act, 2020/NCH Act, 2020, is to be determined by Fee fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of the respective State/UT/Deemed University as per the directive for "Determination of fee and all other charges" prescribed by NCISM (BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16-09-2022), and NCH (F.No 1-11/2022/NCH/10322-10331 dated 23.11.2022) which has been implemented from the A.Y 2022-23 onwards.

Tuition fee:-

2. The tuition fee, as laid down and fixed by respective governing or fee fixation committees as applicable, shall be charged in each academic session for four and half years only. No tuition fee shall be charged for an extended duration of study, in case of failing in examinations or for any other reasons, and there shall not be any fee for internship training at the same institute.

3. The college shall display tuition fees, hostel fees, and other fees if any on institute's website as well as on the Institute profile while uploading on central/state/UT counseling portal as applicable. The same is to be charged from student at the time of admission. No other charges other than the displayed fees should be collected from the candidates.

MAHARASHTRA UNAIDED PRIVATE PROFESSIONAL EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS (REGULATION OF ADMISSIONS AND FEES) ACT, 2015.

No.MED-1024/CR-465/24/Edu-02— In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015), the Government of Maharashtra hereby makes the following rules to regulate the admissions to the First year of the Full Time Professional Naturopathy and Yogic Sciences (B.N.Y.S.) undergraduate course in the Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions in the State of Maharashtra, namely ;

1. *Short title and commencement.*—(1) These rules may be called the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission to the Full Time Undergraduate Bachelor of Naturopathy and Yogic Sciences (B.N.Y.S.) Course) Rules, 2025.

(2) They shall come into force with effect from the date they are published in the *Gazette*.

2. *Definitions.*—(1) In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a) "Act" means the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015) ;

(b) "Admission Reporting Institution" means a institution where the Candidate shall report for confirmation for admission by submission of documents and payment of fees;

(c) "Application Form" means the prescribed form to be filled up online or offline by the candidate for admission to the Courses as defined in clause (f) ;

(d) "CAP Seats" means the seats filled in through the centralized process of admission carried out by the Competent Authority ;

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(e) "Competent Authority" means the Commissioner, State CET Cell, Mumbai for selection and admissions at Unaided Private and Minority Bachelor of Naturopathy and Yogic Sciences Colleges;

(f) "Courses" means the Undergraduate course in Bachelor of Naturopathy and Yogic Sciences, conducted in the State as per the approval of the Government of Maharashtra, respective council and Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik ;

(g) "Council" means respective Central Council for the courses ;

(h) "Document Verification Centre" means the city or town declared by the Competent Authority or the respective admitted college where the document verification is to be conducted ;

(i) "Eligible Candidates" means the candidates who are eligible for Bachelor of Naturopathy and Yogic Sciences course as notified by the Government, from time to time under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act ;

(j) "HSC" means the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Standard XII) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education as per provisions of the Maharashtra Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Boards Act, 1965 (Mah. XLI of 1965) or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board ;

(k) "Institutional Quota" means seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Institution level as declared by the Government or appropriate authority from time to time ;

(l) "inter-se-merit" means the order of merit in respect of various classes/category of Candidates ;

(m) "Minority Quota" means seats earmarked for the Minority Community students from within the State of Maharashtra, belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs ;

(n) "MUHS" means the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences established under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998 (Mah. X of 1999);

(o) "National Eligibility cum-Entrance Test" or "NEET" means the examination conducted by National Testing Agency, New Delhi for admission to under graduate Medical, Dental and Ayush Courses.

(p) "Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)" means a candidate or person registered as an Overseas Citizen of India as declared by the Central Government under section 7A of the Citizenship Act 1955 and includes Persons of Indian Origin (PIO).

Explanation- For the purposes of this clause, all the existing Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) cardholders registered under notification of the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs No. F.No. 26011/04/98- F. I. dated 19th August 2002 and shall now be deemed to be Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) card holders by virtue of Notification of Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, No. 25024/9/2014-F.I. dated 9th January 2015 ;

(q) "Qualifying Examination" means the Higher Secondary Certificate (12th Standard) or equivalent examination, from an institution situated in the State of Maharashtra with English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology (Botany and Zoology) at the time of examination.

(r) "SSC" means the Secondary School Certificate (Standard X) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education as per the provisions of the Maharashtra Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Boards Act, 1965 (Mah. XLI of 1965) or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board ;

(2) Words and expressions used but not defined in these rules, shall have the same meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

3. *Invitation of Application Form*— The Competent Authority shall invite Online or Offline Application Form, in the form prescribed by it, from the candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process (CAP) for seeking admission to the Course for which the NEET-UG is required for the respective academic year.

4. *Declaration of medium, pattern, syllabus, schedule, etc. for NEET-UG.*—

(a) Medium, Pattern, Syllabus, Schedule shall be as per the Information Bulletin of the NEET-UG. CAP rounds for respective academic year ; and

(b) the detailed schedule regarding the CAP rounds, admission on the basis of Institutional Quota, admission by Minority Educational Institution, and other matters relating to admission; and

(c) any other matter which is, or may be, necessary for the purposes of conducting the NEET-UG. The syllabus relating to the NEET-UG shall be declared by the Competent Authority of NEET-UG.

5. *Candidature Type.*—

(1) Maharashtra State Candidature, -

(A) Eligibility Criteria, -

(i) The candidate must be an Indian National.

(ii) Overseas citizen of India (OCI) candidate shall be eligible, provided such candidate have obtain the OCI status before 04/03/2021 and also have passed 10th and 12th from the State of Maharashtra and should be domicile of Maharashtra or staying in the State of Maharashtra for minimum period of 10 years.

(iii) Non Resident Indian (NRI) shall not be eligible.

(iv) The candidate must have completed 17 years of age on or before 31st December of the year of admission to the course. The Birth certificate indicating name of the candidate, Secondary School Certificate examination i.e. SSC or equivalent examination certificate or School Leaving Certificate endorsing the date of birth may constitute a valid proof. (The eligibility of age shall be as prescribed by respective Central Council or Government of Maharashtra, from time to time)

(v) The candidate must be medically fit.

(vi) The candidate must have passed the SSC or equivalent examination from an Institution situated in the State of Maharashtra. However, except for the year 2016, candidate who has passed SSC or equivalent examination from an institute situated outside Maharashtra State and HSC or equivalent examination from an institute situated within Maharashtra State is eligible for seeking admission to the courses, provided that he or she is Domicile of Maharashtra.

(vii) The candidate must have passed the qualifying examination i.e. HSC or equivalent examination.

(B) Exception for sub-clause (vi) of clause (A) for SSC or sub-clause (vii) of clause (A) for HSC or equivalent examinations for children of employees of the Government of Maharashtra or its Undertakings, -

(i) The children of such employees of the Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking who have joined service since beginning at a place situated outside the State of Maharashtra but who have been transferred to a place situated within the State of Maharashtra shall be eligible for admission even though such children might have passed the SSC or HSC or equivalent examination from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra; provided that, such employee of the Government of Maharashtra or its Undertaking must have been posted or transferred or deputed at a place of work located in the State of Maharashtra and also must have reported for duty i.e. joined the duty before the last date of submission of preference form.

(ii) The candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at (i) above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such employee of Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking has reported for duty, as a proof that such employee has joined the office and/or reported for duty before the cut-off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of Preference Form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer or posting order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting. A copy of transfer or posting order should also be produced at the time of filling the preference form.

(iii) The children of such employees of Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking who have been transferred or deputed to a place situated outside the State of Maharashtra or who have returned to the State of Maharashtra after initial transfer or deputation shall be eligible for admission even though such children might have passed the SSC or HSC or equivalent examinations from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra.

(iv) The candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at (iii) above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such employee of Government of Maharashtra or its undertaking has reported for duty, as a proof that such employee has joined the office and/or reported for duty before the cut-off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of Preference Form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer or posting order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting. A copy of transfer or posting order should also be produced at the time of filling the preference form.

(C) Exception for for sub-clause (vi) of clause (A) for SSC or sub-clause (vii) of clause (A) for HSC or equivalent examinations for Children of employees of the Government of India or its undertaking:—

(i) The children of the employees of Government of India or its Undertaking shall be eligible for admission even though they might have passed the SSC and/or HSC or equivalent examination from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra; provided that, such an employee of Government of India or its undertaking must have been transferred from out of Maharashtra state and posted at a place of work, located in the State of Maharashtra and also must have reported for duty, i.e. joined the duty before the last date of submission of preference form.

(ii) The candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at (i) above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such an employee of Government of India or its undertaking has reported for duty, as a proof of the fact that such employee has joined the office or reported for duty before the cut-off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of preference form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation, transfer and posting order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting. A copy of transfer and posting order should also be produced at the time of filling the preference form.

(iii) The Children of the officers of the All India Services, officers of the Central Government Services and Defence Personnel (including all types of defence services) having domicile certificate of the State of Maharashtra and posted outside the Maharashtra, shall be eligible for admission even though they might have passed the SSC and / or HSC or equivalent examination from the recognized Institutions situated outside the State of Maharashtra.

(iv) The Candidates belonging to the aforesaid category at (iii) above shall be required to produce the requisite certificate from the office at which such officer of All India Services, Central Government Services and Defence Personnel has reported for duty, as a proof of the fact that he has joined the office or reported for duty before the cut-off date for eligibility, i.e. the last date of submission of preference form. The certificate shall contain full name of the employee, designation and posting order number and date, date of joining and present status of posting.

(2) Minority Candidature.-The Maharashtra domiciled Candidate belonging to a particular linguistic or religious minority community from within the State fulfilling eligibility criteria as per sub-rule (1) of rule 5 shall be eligible under this category.

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(3) NRI Candidature.-The candidate who fulfils the conditions as defined in clause (n) of section 2 of the Act shall be eligible under this category.

(4) OCI Candidature.- The candidate who fulfils the conditions as defined in clause (o) of sub-rule (1) of rule 2 shall be eligible under this category.

6. Eligibility-

(a) Eligibility Marks for Admission to Bachelor of Naturopathy and Yogic Sciences (B.N.Y.S.)- The eligibility for admission to the first year of the course shall be such as notified by the Government under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act.

(i) The Candidate should have passed the HSC or equivalent examination with subjects English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology (Botany and Zoology).

(ii) Candidates shall be selected to above stated course on basis of merit in NEET-UG.

(b) Cut-off date for eligibility.-The eligibility of the candidate shall be determined or decided for all purposes including for applicability of all these Rules and Regulations by considering the last date of submission of preference form as the cut-off date. It is made abundantly clear that if a candidate is found ineligible as on the last date of submission of preference form, in terms of these Rules and Regulations, and if such ineligible candidate acquires the requisite eligibility after the aforesaid cut-off date i.e. after the last date of submission of preference form, such subsequent acquisition of eligibility will not make an ineligible candidate eligible for any purpose whatsoever, much less for the purpose of admission.

7. Sanctioned Intake Seats for Course.- The Sanctioned Intake for First Year of undergraduate B.N.Y.S Course shall be as per the approval given by the Authority which is competent for giving approval and affiliation given by the MUHS.

8. Allocation of Seats.- The percentage of allocation of seats for various types of candidates through NEET-UG for First Year of the Course shall be as per the respective Central Council regulations, and in accordance with the policy of the Central / State Government specified in the Schedule.

(1) Maharashtra State Candidature Seats.—The Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature as specified in sub-rule of rule 5, shall be eligible for these seats.

(2) Minority Candidature Seats.—The Candidates having Candidature mentioned in sub-rule (2) of rule 5 shall be eligible for these seats as specified in the Schedule. These seats shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of sub- section (2) of section 6 of the Act.

(3) Institute Quota Seats.—The Institution can admit Eligible Candidates against 15 percent of the Sanctioned Intake, as per the Schedule, on All India Basis, including Non-Resident Indians and Overseas Citizens of India, who had appeared for the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test in accordance with *Inter-se-merit* amongst candidates, who apply for institutional quota seats, subject to the approval by the Admission Regulating Authority subject to following conditions, namely :—

(i) the candidates having candidature mentioned in sub- rules (1), (2) and (3) of rule 5 shall be eligible for these seats, as may be applicable;

(ii) the NRI Candidates shall be admitted under the Institution quota seats, subject to the approval by Admission Regulating Authority;

(iii) if the seats reserved for the NRI remains vacant, those vacant seats may be filled in by the Institution, from the Eligible Maharashtra State Candidature as given in sub- rules (1) and (2) of rule 5 on the basis of inter-se-merit of NEET-UG.

9. Distribution of Seats.- The distribution of seats shall be allotted by the Competent Authority ;

(i) Selection to B.N.Y.S course at the Private Unaided institutions through CAP shall be subject to permission or approval or affiliation from, (1) Government of India; (2) Respective

Central Council; (3) Government of Maharashtra; and (4) MUHS. The "intake capacity" at a particular college shall be the 'minimum number of seats' permitted by the above said authorities;

(ii) The Constitutional Reservation will be applicable to Unaided Private Institutions and SEBC and EWS reservation will be as per Government Rules.

(iii) There shall be 30 per cent. female reservation.

10. Preparation of Merit list.—The Competent Authority shall conduct the examination, evaluate the answer sheets and declare the result;

(i) Preparation of Merit List for Selection to B.N.Y.S Courses. —

—Merit List for selection to the B.N.Y.S course shall be prepared on the basis of marks obtained by the candidate at the NEET-UG in the descending order of Merit of NEET-UG.

(ii) Method for calculating NRI merit —The merit list for NRI Candidates stated at sub-rule (3) of rule 5 shall be prepared on the basis of the percentage of marks at NEET-UG, in descending order of merit of the NEET.

11. Centralised Admission Process (CAP).—

(i) The Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall admit Candidates through the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) as referred in sub-section (3) of section 3 of the Act. The stages of CAP shall be as mentioned below, namely :—

(a) display or publication of college wise and category wise distribution of seats on website ;

(b) display or publication of Time Schedule for preference form filling process on website ;

(c) display or publication of Brochure of Preference Form filling and counselling process for admission to Courses ;

(d) verification of documents and endorsement of eligibility of the successful candidates for the admission process at the document verification centers / respective allotted college.

(e) display or publication of allotment of seats for Round-I of CAP by way of computerised process and joining of the candidates at respective institution as per the allotment within stipulated time ;

(f) display or publication of subsequent computerised round(s) if seats remain vacant after completion of CAP Round-I ;

(ii) Candidate shall be given a chance to retain a seat that has been allotted, by way of Status Retention form at the end of each CAP round. If a Candidate accepts the offered seat and he do not want to participate in any further rounds of seat allocation, such candidate shall not be considered in subsequent rounds of admission.

12. CAP allotment stages and process of allotment.—Allotment of seats under CAP shall be made in the following manner,—

(1) Maharashtra State Candidature; The stages of computerised allotments are as follows:—

Stage : I : For all the Candidates,—

(a) All the Candidates belonging to various categories shall be considered for allotment of seats as per their inter-se merit and availability of seats.

(b) The Minority category candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seats by virtue of their inter-se merit and in Minority Quota seats by virtue of merit in their respective minority community to which the institution belongs.

(c) Backward Class Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their Inter-se merit or in the irrespective Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.

(d) SBC Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *inter-se-merit* or in OBC Category seats, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.

(e) Economically Weaker Section (EWS) Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *Inter-se-merit* or in their respective Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.

(f) Socially and Educational Backward Category (SEBC) Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *Inter-se-merit* or in their respective Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.

Stage: II: For respective groups of Backward Class Category Candidates,—

inter-se-merit amongst the reserved categories shall be operated at the end of each round if necessary against the unfilled reserved category seats as per merit and choice of the reserved category candidates. The seats remaining vacant from various category shall be filled in during *inter-se-merit* admission process as follows :—

(a) The remaining vacant seats shall be filled from among the candidates of their respective group by *inter-se merit*. The groups are as follows :—

Group I

- (i) Scheduled Castes and Schedule Caste converted to Buddhism (S.C.)
- (ii) Scheduled Tribes (S.T.)

Group II

- (i) Vimukta Jati (DT) (A)
- (ii) Nomadic Tribes [NT (B)]

Group III

- (i) Nomadic Tribes [NT (C)]
- (ii) Nomadic Tribes [NT (D)]
- (iii) Other Backward Classes (OBC) including SBC.

(b) If the seats still remain vacant, then the seats shall be filled from,- amongst the candidates of all categories mentioned above from the all categories combined merit list.

(c) If the seats still remain vacant, then the seats will be filled among the candidates of the common merit list.

(d) The seats remaining vacant from EWS and SEBC category will be allotted to the general category candidates.

(e) The candidate should have claimed the constitutional reservation in the original application form. The candidates belonging to the backward class categories will be required to submit the Caste Certificate at the time of submitting the preference form, failing which the category claimed, shall not be granted and the candidate will be treated as general candidate.

(f) The candidates belonging to SC, ST, VJ/DT(A), NT-B, NT-C, NT-D, SBC, OBC, SEBC categories shall be required to submit the Caste Validity Certificate at the time of document verification or at the time of admission at allotted college, failing which the category claimed, shall not be granted and the candidate shall be treated as a general candidate.

(g) Non-Creamy Layer Certificate: A candidate belonging to VJ/DT(A), NT-B, NT-C, NT-D, OBC (including SBC) and SEBC shall be required to produce Non-Creamy Layer Certificate valid upto 31st March of the following year of the NEET-UG examination, at the time of document verification or at the time of admission at allotted college, failing which the category claim shall not be granted.

(h) EWS Certificate: A candidate belonging to Economically Weaker Section (EWS) shall be required to produce Eligibility Certificate for EWS of Government of Maharashtra only valid for academic year, at the time of document verification or at the time of admission at allotted college, failing which the category claim shall not be granted.

(i) 30 percent seats at the disposal of the Competent Authority shall be reserved for female candidates. The female reservation shall be provided in State seats of concerned category. If requisite numbers of female candidates are not available then these seats shall be offered to male candidates of respective category.

Stage III : For all Backward Class Category Candidates,— If the seat reserved for group of Backward Class Category Candidate remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate of *inter-se-merit* of all Backward Class Category candidates taken together.

Stage : IV: If the seat reserved for Backward Class Category Candidate remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate of General *inter-se-merit*.

(2) Minority Candidature.—The stages of computerised allotments are as follows :-

(a) The Minority Category candidate shall be considered for allotment in Open category seats by virtue of their *inter-se-merit* and in Minority Quota seats by virtue of merit in their respective minority community to which the institution belongs.

(b) For minority seats, *inter-se-merit* shall be operated at the end of each round if necessary, against the unfilled minority category seats as per merit.

(c) Amongst the total seats at Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution, which are declared as "Minority Institutions" by the State Government, the seats distribution shall be as mentioned in schedule.

13. Selection process through CAP round.—The Unaided Private Professional Education Institution shall admit candidates through the Centralised Admission Process is below :-

(a) The selection of the candidates shall be made on the basis of preferences given by the candidates. Seat allocation shall be made centrally on the basis of NEET-UG merit list, eligibility and preferences exercised by the candidates.

(b) The preference form shall be available online on the website of Competent Authority. The candidate shall submit online preference form.

(c) There shall be three or more rounds of selection of candidates depending on the availability of vacant seats during the subsequent rounds. The selection shall be on the basis of merit and the preferences submitted by the candidates. For second or subsequent round separate preference shall be filled by the candidate. The choices of colleges, once entered in the record or data, after verification by the candidate, shall be final and irrevocable.

(d) The merit list shall be operated from State Merit List Number-One onwards in each round of selection. The candidate getting selected in previous round shall considered for betterment in the subsequent round. The betterment herein means the higher preference exercised by the candidate. The shift in such betterment shall be compulsory and mandatory except for those who have filled 'Status Retention Form.' Such a candidate who has filled Status Retention Form shall not be considered for any subsequent rounds of selection process for the same academic year. The last date for filling Status Retention Form will be notified along with the selection list of each CAP round.

(e) After concluding the first round, for the further rounds candidates who have been allotted seats in the earlier rounds and joined the course, as also the candidates who have not been allotted any seat, shall be eligible. In the subsequent rounds, betterment chances shall be given to the candidates who have already been allotted seats.

(f) It is hereby made abundantly clear that shifting on account of a better choice given by a candidate in any round, shall be effected only and only if such a candidate in the subsequent rounds is found entitled for 'change of college'. Mere possibility of a 'change in category' on account of availability of seat in the same college and/or same course in the further rounds shall not amount to betterment as such and therefore, no shifting shall be effected in such an eventuality. Such a 'change in category' shall include *inter-alia* change from reserved category to open category or *vice-versa*. The shift in such betterment shall be compulsory and mandatory, except those who have filled Status Retention Form.

(g) Based on preferences given, the seat will be allotted on merit and the allotment will be displayed on website.

(h) Candidates as per allotment should report alongwith all original certificates and a set of attested photocopies of all requisite document at allotted college within the prescribe time. The Dean/Principal should verify all the original documents before finalizing the admission.

(i) Earmarking for reserved category candidates. — Reserved category candidate entitled to admission on the basis of merit in an open category seat will have the option of taking admission either against his respective category seat or on an open category seat. If he opts for the reserved category he will be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as reserved category candidate. In such case the particular seat in the college where he was eligible for admission against open seat shall be earmarked for a candidate belonging to the respective reserved category. Such earmarked seat will be made available immediately to the successive reserved category candidate from the same category merit during the counselling.

(j) If the candidate is selected in Round-1 of counselling and does not report at the allotted Institute, this will be considered as a "free exit" (option available only in Round-1 and Round-2). No new registration is required. However, such a candidate may participate again in Round-2 and Round-3 after logging in with their earlier registration details and filling fresh preference(s). His / Her selection of Round-1 stands cancelled. The seat so allotted to such a candidate who does not join will be presumed to be a vacant seat as on the last date of joining and from the next date after the date set out as a last date for joining the college in terms of such allotment. Such a vacant seat will be allotted in Round-2 of the admission process.

(k) The *inter-se round* shall be conducted for remaining vacant seats from the category as per rule 12 (1), if necessary at the end of each round.

(l) If a candidate is selected during Round 3 he/she will have to join the college / seat allotted during that round. Candidate selected during Round 3 will not be eligible for subsequent round(s) of State Counselling Process.

(m) After Round 3, subsequent Online Stray Vacancy Round(s) will be conducted if seat(s) remain vacant.

(n) The cut-off date for Course will be as prescribed by the respective Central Council from time to time.

14. Institutional Level Round.— If the seats remain vacant after all CAP and Stray Vacancy Rounds, the said seats shall be filled in by the institution through Institutional Level Round with the prior approval of the Competent Authority. The institute shall invite applications from desirous candidates who are declared eligible in the NEET-UG. The admission shall be granted by the institution strictly on the basis of *inter-se-merit* of the NEET-UG as per the instructions from the Competent Authority.

15. Cancellation.—The selected candidate must join the college at which he or she is selected, on or before the date prescribed by the Competent Authority, failing which his or her admission shall stand cancelled. The selected candidate who has joined the college and wants to cancel the admission should cancel it, at the respective college. The college shall accept the cancellation letter and inform the Competent Authority alongwith copy of the cancellation letter immediately.

16. *Disqualification for admission.*— The selected candidates, who cancel their admission after the cut-off date of course, shall not be eligible for admission for subsequent two years or the decision taken by Government of Maharashtra time to time.

17. The fee for the course shall be paid at the respective college by Demand Draft from any Nationalised or Scheduled Commercial Bank in favour of Dean or Principal of College, as applicable.

(a) Refund of Fees by the College after change of College or Cancellation of admission.—The candidate who has been admitted and desires to cancel the admissions shall submit application to the respective college or institute to cancel admission. The refund of fees to such candidate admitted in the college shall be made after deduction as under :—

(i) Before cut-off date as declared by Competent Authority - Rs.1500 (Rs. One thousand five hundred only) to be deducted and rest of the fees to be refunded;

(ii) On or after cut-off date as declared by Competent Authority -No refund of fees.

(iii) The Dean or Principal of the college shall be responsible for making refund of the fees, after receiving cancellation letter from the candidate. If the candidate expires or becomes invalid within 90 days from the date of admission, no deduction shall be made.

(b) Penalty will be applicable for lapse of seat due to cancellation on or after Cut-off date as decided by Government of Maharashtra.

18. *Approval of Merit List and Admitted Candidates List.*—

(1) After completion of Admission process every Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall submit the Admission approval proposal to the Directorate of Ayush, Mumbai, as the case may be and the Admission Regulating Authority in accordance with the sub-section (5) of section 9 of the Act.

(2) The admission-approval proposal shall include the list of all candidates admitted under Reservation, marks at qualifying examinations etc., as well as the required documents including list of candidates who have applied and list of admitted candidates at institution level.

19. *Conduct and Discipline.*—

(a) Failure of the candidate in making full and correct statements in the application form or suppression of any information would lead to disqualification of the candidate, even at later date. Such a candidate shall be debarred from the entire selection process.

(b) It is responsibility of every candidate to submit proper documents. Any attempt to submit documents which are not genuine will lead to cancellation of the admission of the candidate, forfeiture of the fees, deposits and expulsion of the candidate from the college by the Competent Authority or by his authorised official. The name of such candidate/s shall be deleted from the State Merit List and he or she shall not be eligible for further rounds of the selection process and shall be debarred from the selection process.

(c) The student while studying in the Health Sciences Courses, if found indulging in antinational activities, unlawful activities or ragging in any form, contrary to the provisions of Acts and Law enforced by the Government, shall be liable to be expelled from the college by the Dean or Principal of the College.

(d) Pursuant to orders in Writ Petition (Civil) No. 656 of 1999, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, has directed the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India, to take all necessary steps to curb the menace of ragging and take severe action against the students involved in such activities.

(e) As per the provisions of the Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act of 1999 (Mah. XXXIII of 1999), students indulging in ragging shall be liable to be punished under the Act.

(f) In case of dispute arising relating to the issues dealt herein above shall be dealt with, by the Competent Authority.

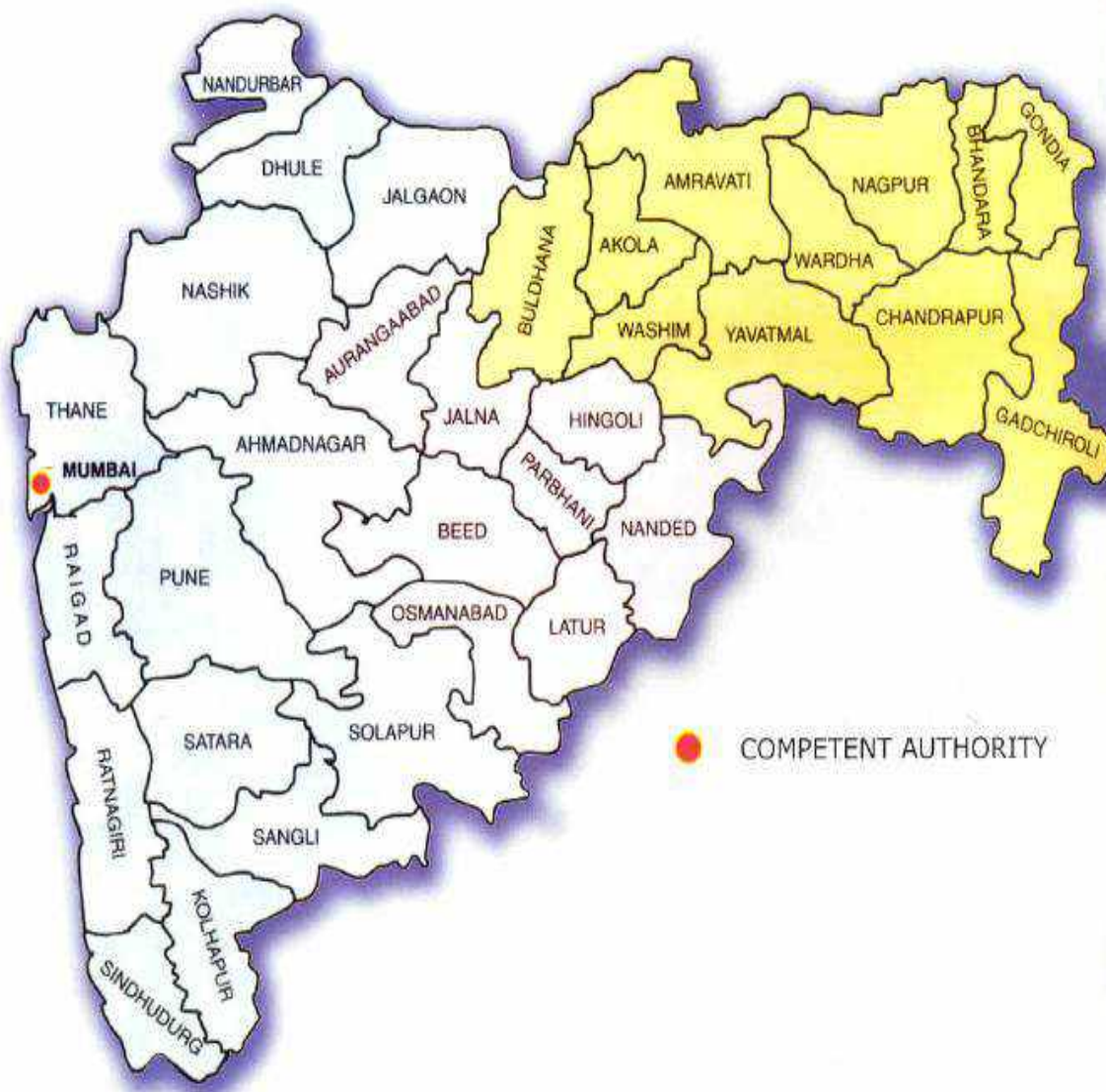
