1.	The candidate must ensure the candidates eligibility criteria before submitting the online application. The candidates are instructed to go through the Prospectus carefully and be clear about all the instructions with regard to the submission of the online application form.
2.	The application form other than the one filled in online mode will not be accepted, under any circumstances.
3.	<p>i) Candidates should fill up all mandatory columns, upload all required documents and submit the duly filled in online application. The candidates may download their filled in online application form and secure a copy of the same for their future reference. Subsequent submission of supporting document(s), is not accepted either on courier / post / or in person.</p> <p>ii) Scanned PDF copies of all original certificates must be uploaded during filling the online application. The original certificates should be produced in person only at the time of admission in the respective college.</p>
4.	Service candidates should upload their service particulars as per Annexure–II (Service Proforma) duly certified by the forwarding authority with date and seal along with the filled in online application form. They should submit their hard copy of duly filled online Application only through the proper channel with the remarks of the forwarding authorities in the format prescribed in the application form to the Secretary, Selection Committee, Commissionerate of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy. It should compulsorily reach on or before the last date as mentioned above. If not, applications will be summarily rejected irrespective of the date of submission by the applicant a date of forwarding by the competent authority. Advance copies from the service candidates will not be accepted.

8.	<p>UNAUTHORIZED ABSENCE:</p> <p>In case of unauthorized absence of a candidate for one month or more after getting admitted to the course, the candidate will be treated as having discontinued without notice, and the vacancy will be filled from the waiting list, depending on the availability of time before the prescribed cut-off date. Candidates will have to give a declaration to this effect at the time of admission, as in Annexure–IV. If the period of absence is beyond the stipulated date as specified by the Selection Committee, the candidate must pay the discontinuation fee.</p>
9.	There is no reservation for Eminent Sports Persons or Persons with Benchmark Disabilities in Self-Financing Colleges.
II. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION	
10.	<p>a. A person possessing the Degree of Homoeopathy (Bachelor of Homoeopathy Medicine and Surgery) from the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University or from any other recognized University or Board or Medical Institution specified in erstwhile Indian Medicine Central Council Act 1970 or National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, and enrolled in Central Council of Homoeopathy / NCH or Tamil Nadu Homoeopathy Medical Council, with successful completion of CRRRI before 31.08.2025 fixed by the NCH / AIAPGET-2025.</p> <p>b. The candidates should fulfill the eligibility criteria for applying AIAPGET 2025; should have qualified in AIAPGET 2025 and should have obtained minimum of marks at 50th percentile. Provided that in respect of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Most Backward Classes and Denotified Community, Backward Classes (Muslim) and Backward Classes; the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile; for candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of persons with disabilities Act, 2016, the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile for the General Category and 40th percentile for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Most Backward Classes and Denotified Community, Backward Classes (Muslim) and Backward classes.</p> <p>Note: Provided further that when sufficient number of candidates in the respective categories fail to secure minimum marks in the All India AYUSH Post graduate Entrance Test</p>

15.	<p>SERVICE CANDIDATES</p> <p>The following categories of Homoeopathy Medical Graduates only will be treated as Service candidates and considered for selection against 50% of seats reserved exclusively for Service Candidates.</p> <p>(i) Homoeopathy Medical Graduates who were selected by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission / Medical Services Recruitment Board and other regularized service candidates and appointed in the Tamil Nadu Medical Service on regular basis, who have put in minimum of TWO years satisfactory and continuous service excluding leave period such as Earned Leave, Unearned Leave on Medical Certificate, Unearned Leave on Private Affairs, Maternity Leave and any other unauthorized absence, as on 31.08.2025 either in Tamil Nadu Medical Service or local bodies and State Organizations.</p> <p>(ii) Candidates above 50 years as on 31.08.2025 are not eligible to apply.</p> <p>(iii) Homoeopathy Medical Graduates who are approved Probationers and who are working</p> <p>a. As Medical Officers working (continuously for two years) in Local Bodies in Tamil Nadu. A Doctor absorbed from the Panchayat Union into Government Service as per G.O.Ms. No 435 / H&FW / IMI-2 Dept. dated: 23-11-2000 will be considered as Service Candidates provided that they should have completed 2 years of service.</p>

	<p>b. In Government of India Institutions in the State of Tamil Nādu.</p> <p>c. In Public Sector Undertaking and Organizations under the Control of Government of India in Tamil Nadu.</p> <p>d. In undertaking or organization of Government of Tamil Nadu.</p> <p>Note: The candidates under Clause 15, sub clause (ii) item (a) to (d) above should give an undertaking to the concerned authorities that they will serve for 5 years in their respective institutions after the completion of course. III. Declaration and Verification

- All entries in the online application form must be filled carefully by the candidate.
- The candidate should ensure that all information, including academic marks and

- If any discrepancy is found during scrutiny:
 - a. The candidate will forfeit their admission, regardless of the stage of the Course.
 - b. The candidate will be debarred from pursuing any other Course for a period of three years.
 - c. Legal/criminal action will be initiated against the candidate for submitting false documents (e.g., Mark Sheet, Degree certificate, Community/nativity certificate).

20.	<p>Provisional Rank List:</p> <p>A Provisional Rank List of eligible candidates will be prepared based on the marks and rank obtained in AIAPGET (HOMOEOPATHY) – 2025. Admission to the M.D. (Homoeopathy) course will be made strictly from this rank list only.</p> <p>The Secretary, Selection Committee, will publish the tentative rank list on the official website: www.tnayushselection.org</p> <p>Tie-Breaking Criteria (Inter-se Merit):</p> <p>If two or more candidates have secured the same number of marks, the tie shall be resolved and inter-se merit shall be determined based on the higher rank in AIAPGET 2025 (Homoeopathy).</p>
21.	<p>i) Non-Service candidates:</p> <p>Admission to the course will be made purely on merit, based on the marks obtained in the AIAPGET 2025 (Homoeopathy).</p> <p>ii) Service Candidates:</p> <p>Admission to the course will be made based on marks obtained in AIAPGET 2025 (Homoeopathy) with additional weightage marks awarded to eligible in-service Candidates. One mark will be awarded for each completed year of Government Service. 22.	<p>ALLOTMENT OF SEATS:</p> <p>Rule of Reservation will be 200-point roster as per Government of Tamil Nadu as the number of seats is less than 8 in each branch.</p>
23.	<p>SEATS RESERVED FOR SERVICE CANDIDATES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A total of 50% of the seats in each specialty are reserved for Service Candidates, in addition to those selected under the Open Category. If there is an odd number of seats sanctioned in any specialty, the extra seat shall be allotted to the Open Category, and will be filled based on merit and Communal rotation.
24.	Any remaining unfilled seats for want of adequate number of eligible candidates belonging to SCA communities shall be filled by candidates belonging to SC community other than Arunthathiyars as per merit and vice versa without exceeding the quota for SC community as

	a whole.
25.	Any remaining reserved seats in ST quota for want of adequate number of eligible candidates belonging to ST community shall be allotted to candidates belonging to SC community as per merit without exceeding the quota for SC and ST community as a whole.
26.	Any remaining unfilled seats in BCM Community for want of adequate number of eligible candidates after exhausting the merit list shall be filled up on merit basis by candidates belonging to BC community without exceeding the quota for BC community as a whole.
27.	Candidates will be allowed to choose their Branch of Study at the time of choice filling, subject to the availability of vacancy in that branch in the college, when the candidate gets his / her turn. Branch once opted and allotted at the time of online Counselling shall be final and will not be allowed to change subsequently under any circumstances after round 3. Similarly, no transfer from one branch to another branch will be allowed during the course period of 3 years.
