The application submission, fees payment and counselling for MD (Siddha) will be ONLINE for the academic year 2025-2026.</p>

3.	<p>The candidates are instructed to visit the website at least two times a day for updates from the date of registration till the end of admission process without fail. 8.	The candidates allotted to M.D. (Siddha) course through Selection Committee, Commissionerate of Indian Medicine, and Homoeopathy, Arumbakkam, Chennai, will alone be registered for M.D. (Siddha) Course in The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.																

I. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1.	All the candidates should ensure their eligibility criteria before submitting the online application form. The candidates are instructed to go through the Prospectus carefully and be clear about all the instructions with regard to the submission of the online application form.
2.	The application form other than the one filled in online mode will not be accepted, under any circumstances.
3.	<p>a. Candidates should fill up all mandatory columns, upload all required documents and submit the duly filled in online application. The candidates may download their filled in online application form and secure a copy of the same for their future reference. Subsequent submission of supporting document(s), is not accepted either on courier / post / or in person.</p> <p>b. Scanned PDF copies of all original certificates must be uploaded during filling the online application form. The original certificates should be produced in person only at the time of admission in the respective college.</p>
4.	Service candidates should upload their service particulars as per Annexure-II (Service Proforma) duly certified by the forwarding authority with date and seal along with the filled in online application form. They should submit their hard copy of duly filled online Application only through the proper channel with the remarks of the forwarding authorities in the format prescribed in the application form to the Secretary, Selection Committee, Commissionerate of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy. It should compulsorily reach on or before the last date as mentioned above. If not, applications will be summarily rejected irrespective of the date of submission by the applicant and date of forwarding by the competent authority. Advance copies from the service candidates will not be accepted.
5.	Same passport-size photograph used in AIAPGET 2025 (Siddha) should be uploaded in the space provided.
6.	A list of eligible candidates will be uploaded in our websites www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in , www.tnayushselection.org , along with the corresponding Application Register Number (A.R. No.).
7.	All information pertaining to MD (Siddha) admissions will be published on the Department's official website: www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in , www.tnayushselection.org from time to time for updates regarding the PG provisional rank list, online counselling schedule, and other information / intimations, etc. The Selection Committee shall not be held responsible if any candidate fails to

	register or fails to lock the seat during online counselling due to ignorance of updates published on the website. No individual correspondence will be entertained in this regard.
8.	<p>UNAUTHORIZED ABSENCE:</p> <p>In case of unauthorized absence of candidate for one month or more after getting admitted to the course, the candidate will be treated as having discontinued without notice and the vacancy will be filled up from the waiting list depending on the availability of time before the prescribed cut-off date. Candidates will have to give a declaration to this effect at the time of admission as in Annexure – V. If the period of absence is beyond the stipulated date as specified by Selection Committee, the candidate must pay the discontinuation fee as per clause 46 (ii) of this prospectus.</p>
9.	<p>Note for Special Category: Persons with Bench Mark Disability (PWD)</p> <p>a. The candidates applying under PWD is instructed to submit their required documents through as per Annexure-III through online and hard copy should be sent to Selection Committee along with the details of their application registration number after final submission.</p> <p>b. At the time of filling the online application it is mandatory to upload the necessary supportive documents as mentioned in Annexure - III (with Full Size Photograph exhibiting the deformity).</p> <p>c. Special Category rank differs completely from that of the General Category rank.</p> <p>d. Special Category candidates cannot claim the same rank in the General Category and vice versa.</p> <p>e. Candidates are requested to produce a certificate from the District Medical Board of the district concerned constituted for this purpose assessing the nature and the extent of physical disability in the format prescribed in the Annexure - III. The candidate must have obtained the certificate within 3 months prior to submission of the registration for seeking admission under this category. If the certificate has been obtained earlier, the application will be rejected. The candidates seeking admission under this category should produce the full-size photograph exhibiting the deformity</p> <p>f. The candidates applied for M.D. (Siddha) course have to undergo medical examination in person by a Medical Board constituted for the purpose by the Directorate of Medical Education to ascertain and confirm the nature and extent of physical disability.</p> <p>g. The Counselling for the Special Categories will be done in offline mode before the General Category Online Counselling at Selection committee, Commissionerate of Indian Medicine & Homoeopathy, Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine Campus Arumbakkam, Chennai 106.</p> <p>h. Counselling date for special category will be intimated in the website.</p> <p>i. The claim under Special Category will not be considered, under any circumstances without the required documents and the application of such candidate shall be considered under General</p>

	<p>Category only, if candidate fulfils the norms for the General Category.</p> <p>j. If adequate number of eligible candidates is not available under special category, then the earmarked seats will be reverted back to general category and filled up with candidates on the basis of merit and communal rotation.</p>
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II. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

10.	<p>a. A person possessing the degree of Siddha Maruthuva Arignar (Bachelor of Siddha Medicine and Surgery) from the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University or from any other recognized University or Board or Medical Institution specified in erstwhile Indian Medicine Central Council Act 1970 or National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, and enrolled in Central Council of Indian System of Medicine or Tamil Nadu Siddha Medical Council. With successful completion of CRRI before the date fixed by the NCISM / AIAPGET2025.</p> <p>b. The candidates should fulfill the eligibility criteria for applying AIAPGET 2025; should have qualified in AIAPGET 2025 and should have obtained minimum of marks at 50th percentile. Provided that in respect of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Most Backward Classes and Denotified Community, Backward Classes (Muslim) and Backward Classes; the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile; for candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of persons with disabilities Act, 2016, the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile for the General Category and 40th percentile for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Most Backward Classes and Denotified Community, Backward Classes (Muslim) and Backward classes.</p> <p>Note: Provided further that when sufficient number of candidates in the respective categories fail to secure minimum marks in the All India AYUSH Post graduate Entrance Test (AIAPGET), as specified above, held for any academic year for admission to Post Graduate courses, the central government in consultation with the council may at its discretion lower the minimum marks required for admission to Post Graduate course for candidates belonging to respective categories and marks so lowered by the central government shall be applicable for that academic year only.</p>
11.	The candidate should produce the Degree Certificate or the Provisional Degree Certificate-II issued by the Affiliating University and Medical Registration Certificate issued by Central Council of Indian System of Medicine or Tamil Nadu Siddha Medical Council, Chennai, in Original, at the time of joining in college.
12.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Candidate should be a Citizen of India and a Native of Tamil Nadu or should have undergone B.S.M.S. Course in the State of Tamil Nadu.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Candidates of Tamil Nadu nativity who have completed B.S.M.S. Course in other States shall upload a Certificate of Nativity in Tamil Nadu issued by a competent authority only in the specified format prescribed in Annexure – I, and should also upload the Eligibility Certificate from the Tamil Nadu Dr. M. G. R. Medical university, Chennai and submit the same to the college at the time of joining. • Candidates from other States who have studied BSMS course continuously in Tamil Nadu will be considered under the Open Category. • Submission of a false Nativity Certificate, if detected at any stage during the course of study, will result in expulsion of the candidate and initiation of criminal proceedings against the candidate and their parents, as per the law. • Previously obtained Nativity Certificates (Old format) or e-Nativity Certificates in the latest updated format issued by an authority not below the rank of Zonal Deputy Tahsildar of the concerned Revenue Jurisdiction will be accepted. • Community Certificates issued by other States will not be considered for reservation. Such candidates will be treated under the Open Category. • Candidates who are claiming community reservation of Tamil Nadu should upload both following certificates, <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Community certificate issued by competent authority from Revenue Department of Tamil Nadu Government with official seal; and (ii) Community certificate of either of their Parents issued by competent authority from Revenue Department of Tamil Nadu Government with official seal.
13.	Candidates must fill their AIAPGET 2025 (Siddha) Hall Ticket Roll Number, Marks scored and All India rank in the relevant fields of the registration form. The original Hall Ticket and Marks Statement must be produced at the time of joining.
14.	<p>NOT ELIGIBLE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Candidates who join a Post Graduate Degree [MD (Siddha)] in any branch and discontinue the course on any grounds after the cutoff date fixed by NCISM are not eligible to apply for two subsequent academic years. • Candidates who have completed a Post Graduate Degree [MD (Siddha)] or the candidates who possess a Post Graduate Degree [MD (Siddha)] in one Specialty / Branch of study are not eligible to apply for admission to any other Post Graduate degree i.e., in any other branches. • List of Candidates notified / intimated as NOT Eligible by AYUSH Admissions Central Counselling Committee (AACCC) from time to time.

III. DEFINITION OF SERVICE CANDIDATES & NON-SERVICE CANDIDATES

SERVICE CANDIDATES:

15. The following categories of Siddha Medical Graduates only will be treated as Service candidates and considered for selection against 50% of seats reserved exclusively for service candidates.

- (i) Siddha Medical Graduates who were selected by the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission / Medical Services Recruitment Board and other regularized service candidates and appointed in the Tamil Nadu Medical Service on regular basis, who have put in minimum of TWO years satisfactory and continuous service excluding leave period such as Earned Leave, Unearned Leave on Medical Certificate, Unearned Leave on Private Affairs, Maternity Leave and any other unauthorized absence, as on 31.07.2025 either in Tamil Nadu Medical Service or local bodies and state organizations.
- (ii) Candidates above 50 years as on 31.07.2025 are not eligible to apply.
- (iii) Siddha Medical Graduates who are approved Probationers and who are working
 - a. As Medical Officers working (continuously for two years) in Local Bodies in Tamil Nadu. A doctor absorbed from the Panchayat Union into Government Service as per G.O.Ms. No 435 / H&FW / IMI-2 Dept. dated: 23-11-2000 will be considered as Service Candidates provided that they should have completed 2 years of service.
 - b. In Government of India Institutions in the State of Tamil Nadu.
 - c. In Public Sector Undertaking and Organizations under the Control of Government of India in Tamil Nadu.
 - d. In undertaking or organization of Government of Tamil Nadu.

Note:

The candidates under Clause 15, sub clause (iii) item (a) to (d) above should give an undertaking to the concerned authorities that they will serve for 5 years in their respective institutions after the completion of course. They should produce a certificate from the concerned authority to show that they have given such an undertaking as per Tamil Nadu Government rules.

NON-SERVICE CANDIDATES:

The following category of Siddha Medical Graduates will be treated as Non-Service Candidates

- a. Private Siddha Practitioners Registered under Tamil Nadu Board of Indian Medicine.
- b. Those service candidates selected by **TNPSC / MSRB** who have put in **less than two years of** continuous regular service as on 31.07.2025 will be treated as non-Service candidates.
- c. All others who have put in less than two years of state government service or who are working in Central Government, Public Sector undertaking, Central Government Health Scheme

	(CGHS), Local bodies, National Rural Health Mission and Municipalities in Tamil Nadu and Tamil Nadu Government undertakings and organizations will be treated as non-Service candidates.

III. Declaration and Verification

- All entries in the online registration form must be filled carefully by the candidate.
- The candidate must ensure that all information, including academic marks and uploaded documents, are true and accurate.
- If any discrepancy is found during scrutiny:
 - a. The candidate will forfeit their admission, regardless of the stage of the course.
 - b. The candidate will be debarred from pursuing any other course for a period of three years.
 - c. Legal/criminal action will be initiated against the candidate for submitting false documents (e.g., mark sheet, degree certificate, community certificate, nativity certificate etc).

1. This Certificate should be issued by an officer of the Revenue Department not below the rank of Tahsildar in the Taluk concerned.
2. This Certificate should not be issued by the Special Tahsildars, Deputy Tahsildars such as Loans, Land Acquisition, Election, Excise and HQs, Deputy Tahsildars, Special Deputy Collectors, Assistant Commissioner of Agricultural Income, Excise, and Elections etc.

 - (vi) To ensure that wrong or incorrect address had not been furnished to obtain the certificate.
 - (vii) The birth place, the present place of residence of the parent / father, Permanent assets, mother tongue, place of education, place of marriage of the applicant / parents, the period of stay in and outside Tamil Nadu can also be considered before issuing certificate.
