ABOUT BABA FARID UNIVERSITY OF HEALTH SCIENCES

BRIEF HISTORY:

The University was established at Faridkot under an Act of Punjab State Legislature (Punjab Act No. 18 of 1998) in the name of great Sufi Saint Sheikh Farid Ganj-E-Shakar, (1173 1265 A.D.) in 1998 for purposes of affiliating, teaching and ensuring proper and systematic instruction, training and research in Modern Systems of Medicine and Indian Systems of Medicine. It is not only affiliating and examining body but also a teaching and research centre in health sciences. It is expected to play a vital role in improving the standards of medical and health education in the state and in conducting relevant research in all aspects of health sciences, basic as well as applied, which ultimately will ameliorate the health standards of the people of Punjab. It is believed that the university will be a trend setter in developing appropriate modes and models of health care to ensure quality health care to the people.

The University has been recognized by MCI vide letter no. V/11015/3/2000-ME (UG) dated 9th June, 2000. The UGC has also included the University in the list of recognized universities maintained by the University Grants Commission, under section 2(1) of the UGC Act. 1956 vide letter no. F.9-3/97 (CPP-I) dated 4 July. 2002. The Regional Director. World Health Organization, Regional Office for South-East Asia, World Health House, New Delhi has also forwarded the name of the University for inclusion in the World Directory of Medical Schools vide letter No. M12/6212 dated 6 May 2002. The University is also included in the list of Commonwealth Universities and their yearbook 2001 at page No. 692 (Vol. I).

Established with a mission to create an intellectual, academic and physical environment conducive to free flow of ideas and exchange of information between various faculties of the university, between this university and other universities of health sciences in the country and abroad, thereby opening a window to the world for the health professionals, health planners, health managers, biomedical and social scientists and educationalists in health sciences of the country. Efforts are on to establish contact with various institutions towards achieving this goal.

UNIVERSITY'S PRESENT STATUS:

New buildings of the University and its constituent college, GGS Medical College & Hospital were completed in the year 2011. The university was shifted to its new building situated at Sadiq Road, Faridkot in July 2011. Hon'ble Chief Minister, Punjab inaugurated two new University buildings (Senate Block and Academic Block) on 22-09-2011. Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister inaugurated the Radiotherapy Unit, and other buildings of GGS Medical College & Hospital, on 23-09-2011. The GGS Medical College & Hospital, a constituent college of the University is also shifted to its new building. The University Campus comprises of GGS Medical College along with Auditorium of 800 capacity, Senate Block, Academic Block, University College of Nursing, University College of Physiotherapy, University Institute of Para-Medical Sciences, University Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Dept. of Nuclear Medicine, Telemedicine, Edusat and a well-equipped state-of-the-art 500 bedded hospital, Drug De-addiction & Treatment Centre at Faridkot. The State Institute of Nursing and Para-Medical Sciences, Village – Badal (Muktsar), Institute of Nursing (University Regional Centre) at Shri Goindwal Sahib and Advanced Cancer Diagnostic Treatment & Research Centre and Drug De-Addiction & Treatment Centre at Bathinda, Mata Gujri State college of Nursing, Dhuri, Sangrur are also run by University. Coveted projects to set up Trauma Centre, Regional Cancer Centre are in process. The University has added to its academic convoy University Library & Informatics Division, Department of Health Sciences Library & Information System, University Centre of Excellence in Research, Rose Garden and Herbal Garden. The university has started number of employment-oriented diploma courses and certificate programs in health sciences and allied services.

COLLEGES AFFILIATED WITH UNIVERSITY:

At present the University is having 167 affiliated colleges (09 Medical, 14 Dental, 125 Nursing, 09 Physiotherapy, 1 Pharmacy, 1 Sports Medicine and 08 Allied and Healthcare Sciences) comprising 155 affiliated and 12 constituent Colleges.

Admissions to various undergraduate and post graduate courses in the affiliated institutions of this University in the State of Punjab are made on merit basis through the conduct of Entrance Tests.

The university is now primarily focusing on strengthening postgraduate medical education and research and evolving as a centre of excellence in a rural backdrop.

Selection of the candidates to any institution shall be made on merit and in transparent manner as per Punjab Government Notification/s.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION SYSTEM:

The University had introduced Onscreen Marking Solution and w.e.f. session 2016 and e-transfer system of question papers of various courses to the examination centers to maintain the sanctity of examinations. This process and implementation strategies will help us to deliver, efficiency, reliability in high stakes examination and their certifications

1. Selection of the candidates to any institution shall be made on merit and in transparent manner as per Punjab Government Notification/s.
- 1.1 The admission to all the Institutions in the State of Punjab shall be done as per the notifications/ instructions/ guidelines/ rules/ executive orders passed by the State Government as per provisions of The Punjab Private Health Sciences Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission, Fixation of Fee and Making of Reservation) Act 2006, from time to time.

APPLICATION FEE

All candidates are advised to read this Prospectus carefully before submitting the Online Admission Application Form. Submission of the application shall be deemed to constitute acceptance of all the terms and conditions contained herein.

A. PAYMENT OF APPLICATION FEE

1. Every candidate seeking admission to the Master of Dental Surgery (MDS) Course shall submit the prescribed **Online Admission Application Fee** through the online payment gateway available on the University website.
2. The Application Fee shall be as follows:

3. The Application Fee shall be deposited only through the online payment gateway provided by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.
4. Candidates are advised to retain the online payment receipt and transaction details for future reference.

RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CANDIDATE

1. The candidate shall ensure that the online payment has been successfully completed before the prescribed deadline.
2. The University shall not be responsible for any failure of payment arising due to internet connectivity issues, banking delays, payment gateway failure, power interruption or any other technical reason beyond its control.
3. Candidates are advised not to wait until the last date for submission of the Online Admission Application Form and payment of the prescribed fee.

NOTE:

1. The Application Fee, once deposited, shall **not be refunded, adjusted or transferred** under any circumstances
2. No claim for refund or adjustment of the Application Fee shall be entertained after its successful deposit.

Admissions shall be governed by the notifications, regulations, policies, guidelines and executive instructions issued by the Government of Punjab, Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot and other competent authorities from time to time.

The information contained in this Prospectus is subject to amendments, corrigenda, notifications and directions issued by the Government of Punjab, the Competent Authority, the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), NBEMS, the concerned Regulatory Authority and the University from time to time. Such amendments shall be binding on all candidates and shall be deemed to form an integral part of this Prospectus.

In case of any conflict between the contents of this Prospectus and any Government Notification, Statutory Regulation or Court Order, the latter shall prevail.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES

All candidates seeking admission to the Master of Dental Surgery (MDS) courses for Session 2026 are advised to read this Prospectus carefully before submitting the Online Admission Application Form. Submission of the application shall be deemed to constitute the candidate's acceptance of all the provisions, terms and conditions contained in this Prospectus.

1.1 GOVERNING RULES

Admission to MDS courses shall be governed by:

1. Notifications, policies and instructions issued by the Government of Punjab from time to time.
2. The applicable guidelines prescribed by the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), Government of India.
3. Applicable Regulations governing postgraduate dental education issued by the competent Regulatory Authority.
4. Any subsequent amendment, clarification, corrigendum or notification issued by the competent authority before completion of the admission process.

In the event of any inconsistency between this Prospectus and any statutory notification or Government instruction issued subsequently, the latter shall prevail.

1.2 CANDIDATE'S RESPONSIBILITY

The candidate shall be solely responsible for:

- ensuring fulfillment of all eligibility conditions;
- furnishing complete, correct and authentic information in the Online Admission Application Form;
- uploading clear and legible copies of all required documents;
- selecting the appropriate category and quota, wherever applicable;
- exercising preferences of college and specialty carefully during online counselling;
- regularly visiting the University website for updates, notices, corrigenda and counselling schedules.

The University shall not be responsible for any loss arising out of negligence, omission or failure on the part of the candidate to comply with the prescribed instructions or timelines.

1.3 ELIGIBILITY

Merely submitting an Online Admission Application Form, appearing in the merit list, participating in counselling or being provisionally allotted a seat shall not confer any right to admission.

Admission shall remain strictly subject to:

- fulfillment of all eligibility conditions;
- verification of original documents;
- verification of category/quota claim;
- verification of NEET-MDS eligibility;
- medical fitness, wherever applicable;
- approval by the Principal of the allotted institution; and
- compliance with Government and University regulations.

1.4 AUTHENTICITY OF INFORMATION

The information furnished by the candidate in the application form shall be treated as final.

If, at any stage, any information, declaration, certificate or document submitted by the candidate is found to be false, fabricated, forged, concealed or misleading, the University shall have the right to:

- reject the candidature;
- cancel the provisional allotment;
- cancel the admission;
- forfeit the prescribed fee and security deposit, wherever applicable; and
- initiate legal or disciplinary proceedings in accordance with law.

Such cancellation may be effected even after completion of admission or commencement of the academic session.

1.5 VERIFICATION OF DOCUMENTS

All original documents shall be produced by the candidate at the time of reporting to the allotted institution.

Failure to produce the requisite original documents within the prescribed period shall render the candidate ineligible for admission, and the provisional allotment shall stand cancelled without further notice.

The decision of the competent authority regarding verification of documents shall be final and binding.

1.6 RESERVATION AND CATEGORY CLAIMS

Reservation of seats shall be regulated strictly in accordance with the applicable Punjab Government notifications.

A candidate claiming reservation under any category shall produce the prescribed certificate issued by the competent authority in the prescribed format.

No claim for change of category, reservation status or quota shall ordinarily be entertained after submission of the Online Admission Application Form, except where specifically permitted under Government instructions.

1.7 ONLINE COUNSELLING

- i. Participation in online counselling does not guarantee allotment of a seat.
- ii. Candidates shall carefully fill their preferences before the prescribed deadline.
- iii. Once the choice-filling period is over, no modification shall ordinarily be permitted.
- iv. The University shall not be responsible for any incorrect or incomplete choices exercised by the candidate.

1.8 PROVISIONAL ALLOTMENT

Seat allotment made during counselling shall be purely provisional.

A provisional allotment shall become final only after:

- verification of eligibility;
- verification of original documents;
- payment of the prescribed fee;
- submission of the joining report; and
- confirmation of admission by the allotted institution and the University.

1.9 FEE

Payment of counselling fee, tuition fee, security deposit or any other prescribed fee shall not, by itself, confer any right to admission.

If the candidate is subsequently found ineligible, the admission shall be cancelled and the fee shall be dealt with in accordance with the applicable Government notifications and University rules.

1.10 UNIVERSITY'S RIGHT TO AMEND

The University reserves the right to:

- modify, amend or withdraw any provision of this Prospectus;
- revise the admission schedule;
- alter the counselling process;
- revise the seat matrix;
- incorporate Government notifications issued after publication of this Prospectus; and
- issue corrigenda, clarifications or supplementary instructions whenever considered necessary.

All such amendments shall be binding upon the candidates and shall be deemed to form an integral part of this Prospectus.

1.11 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Any dispute arising out of the admission process shall be subject to the applicable laws, Government notifications and Regulations of Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

1.12 JURISDICTION

Any dispute arising out of the admission process shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the competent courts at Faridkot and the Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh.

1.13 ANTI-RAGGING

Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited.

Every admitted candidate shall comply with the anti-ragging regulations and submit the prescribed undertakings, wherever required, before joining the allotted institution.

Any candidate found involved in ragging shall be liable for disciplinary and legal action in accordance with the applicable laws and regulations.

1.14 INTERPRETATION

In case of any doubt regarding interpretation of any provision contained in this Prospectus, the interpretation of the Government of Punjab and Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot, as applicable, shall be final and binding.

1.15 IMPORTANT NOTE

Candidates are advised to visit the University website regularly for all notices, corrigenda, counselling schedules, seat matrices, merit lists and other admission-related updates. No separate communication shall ordinarily be sent individually to any candidate.

Part A – General Information and Admission Procedure

This Part contains the general procedure for submission of the online application form, admission/counselling process, payment of the prescribed fee, important instructions, reporting and joining formalities, and step-by-step guidelines for filling the online application form and exercising online preferences/choices of course, college and quota during the counselling process.

Part B – Statutory Notifications and Admission Regulations

This Part contains the relevant Notifications issued by the Government of Punjab governing admissions to the Post Graduate MDS Courses, together with the applicable admission rules, regulations, prescribed formats, undertakings and other related documents.

Part C – Annexures and Prescribed Formats

This Part contains the annexures, specimen forms, self-declarations, certificates and other relevant Notifications/Instructions issued by the Government of India, Government of Punjab and other competent authorities, wherever applicable.

Part D – Tentative Distribution of Seats

This Part contains the tentative distribution of seats for admission to the Post Graduate MDS Courses. The distribution of seats is subject to revision in accordance with the directions, approvals, recognition, and notifications issued by the competent authorities from time to time.

PART A

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS (PLEASE READ CAREFULLY)

1. Candidates are advised to carefully read this Prospectus, the relevant notifications/instructions issued by the Government of Punjab, Government of India and other competent authorities before submitting the online application form. The Prospectus is available on the University website www.bfuhs.ac.in.
2. Online registration and submission of the application form for admission to MDS Courses shall be undertaken only through the University website www.bfuhs.ac.in.
3. Candidates are advised to complete the online application process well before the last date to avoid technical issues, server congestion or any other unforeseen circumstances. The University shall not be responsible for any delay attributable to the candidate or any technical failure beyond its control. No application shall be accepted after the prescribed closing date and time.
4. Applications submitted in offline mode or in the form of printed copies by post, courier, e-mail or by hand shall not be accepted.
5. Candidates shall strictly comply with the instructions contained in this Prospectus and those displayed on the University website. Failure to comply with the prescribed instructions may result in rejection of the candidature.
6. Incomplete applications or applications not accompanied by the prescribed application fee or required documents shall be rejected without any further notice. The application fee, once paid, shall neither be refunded nor adjusted under any circumstances.
7. The provisions contained in this Prospectus are subject to amendments, notifications, orders or directions issued by the Government of Punjab, Government of India, the Dental Council/National Dental Commission (where applicable), the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), or the University from time to time. Candidates shall not acquire any vested right merely by submission of an application.
8. Admissions to MDS Courses shall be governed by the applicable notifications, regulations and instructions issued by the Government of Punjab, Government of India, the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), the Dental Council/National Dental Commission and other competent authorities.
9. Submission of an online application or participation in counselling shall not confer any right to admission.
10. Eligibility shall be determined strictly in accordance with the Government Notifications, applicable regulations and the provisions of this Prospectus. Final verification of eligibility and original documents shall be carried out by the Principal of the allotted institution at the time of reporting.
11. Candidates who are found ineligible under the applicable Government Notifications, MCC Guidelines or other statutory regulations shall not be considered for admission. Participation in counselling shall be entirely at the candidate's own risk and responsibility.
12. The candidature of every applicant shall remain purely provisional until verification of eligibility, original documents and fulfilment of all admission requirements.

13. If any information furnished by a candidate is found to be false, fabricated, misleading or concealed at any stage, the candidature/admission shall be cancelled and the candidate shall also be liable for debarment from future admissions conducted by the University, besides any other action permissible under law.
14. Any attempt to influence the admission process directly or indirectly shall render the candidate liable for disqualification.
15. The final seat matrix shall be published by the University before commencement of each round of online choice filling and counselling.
16. Admissions shall be made only against seats approved/recognized by the competent statutory authorities for the relevant academic session.
17. The fee structure applicable to Government and Private Institutions shall be as notified by the Government of Punjab from time to time. Any subsequent amendment shall automatically become applicable.
18. In the event of any inconsistency between this Prospectus and any Government Notification or statutory regulation, the latter shall prevail.
19. Payment of tuition fee or any other fee shall not by itself confer any right to admission. Admission shall remain subject to fulfilment of all eligibility conditions and successful completion of admission formalities.
20. Any change in the counselling schedule or admission process shall be notified only through the University website. Candidates are advised to visit the University website regularly.
21. Candidates should retain a copy of this Prospectus throughout the admission process and shall be deemed to have accepted all conditions contained herein.
22. Allocation of college and specialty shall be made strictly on the basis of:
 - NEET-MDS-2026 merit with addition of incentive marks in case of In-service candidates,
 - applicable reservation policy,
 - eligibility,
 - preferences exercised by the candidate, and
 - availability of seats.
23. All In-Service candidates shall submit the prescribed Undertaking (Annexure-B), failing which their candidature under the In-Service category shall not be considered.
24. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. Any candidate found indulging in ragging shall be dealt with in accordance with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the UGC Regulations and applicable laws.
25. Candidates claiming reservation under any category shall upload valid certificates in the prescribed format and select the appropriate category while submitting the online application. No request for change of category, quota or any other particulars shall be entertained after the last date prescribed for submission of online applications.

26. Candidates shall ensure before applying that their BDS qualification is recognized by the competent statutory authority. If the qualification is found to be unrecognized at any stage, the candidature/admission shall be cancelled.
27. All notices, corrigenda, schedules and other updates shall be published only on the University website. No separate communication shall be issued individually.
28. Every candidate admitted to the MDS Course shall be required to pay the prescribed **Health Sciences Library Network (HSLIBNET)** fee (Rs. 9000/-), as notified by the University from time to time, at the time of admission.

ELIGIBILITY AND ADMISSION UNDER NRI QUOTA

1. Only candidates qualified in **NEET-MDS-2026** shall be eligible to apply for admission under the NRI Quota, subject to fulfilment of the eligibility conditions prescribed by the Government of Punjab.
2. Candidates seeking admission under the NRI Quota shall first obtain a **Provisional Eligibility Certificate** from Baba Farid University of Health Sciences by submitting the prescribed application along with the requisite fee.
3. For determination of NRI status, the candidate shall produce valid documentary proof including, wherever applicable:
 - Foreign Country Passport or
 - Green Card or
 - Permanent Resident Card or
 - Proof of residency of the foreign country issued by the Competent Authority or
 - OCI/PIO Card issued by the Govt. of India
4. Admission under the NRI Quota shall be made strictly in accordance with the Punjab Government Notifications, applicable merit and the order of preference prescribed therein.

The procedure for admission under the NRI Quota shall be as follows:

- (i) Submit the prescribed application for issue of Eligibility/Equivalency Certificate.
- (ii) The candidate must:
 - possess a recognized BDS degree;
 - have completed the compulsory rotatory internship within the prescribed period;
 - have qualified NEET-MDS-2026;
 - be registered with the State Dental Council or Dental Council of India; and
 - Possess recognition/equivalency of the BDS qualification, wherever applicable.
- (iii) After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the candidate shall submit the online application for counselling within the prescribed schedule.
- (iv) Admission shall be made strictly on the basis of merit, eligibility, applicable Government policy and availability of seats.
- (v) The fee structure for admission under the NRI Quota shall be as notified by the Government of Punjab from time to time.

INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING PAYMENT OF FEE FOR NRI CANDIDATES

- A candidate opting to pay the prescribed tuition fee in installments shall, before admission, furnish a **Bank Guarantee and/or Surety Bond**, in the prescribed format, covering the balance fee payable for the remaining period of the course, as may be required by the University.
 - Candidates allotted seats under the **NRI Quota** shall deposit either the **entire course fee (Lump Sum)** or the **First Installment**, as applicable, **before joining the allotted college**, through the University payment portal or by such mode as may be prescribed by the University. The payment shall be remitted from the candidate's or the parents'/sponsor's eligible NRI bank account, as per the applicable Government instructions.
 - Where payment is permitted through **Demand Draft**, the Demand Draft shall be drawn in favour of **Registrar, Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot**, payable at **Faridkot**.
 - The fee shall be remitted **in US Dollars (US\$)** or from the candidate's or the parents' **NRE/Foreign Bank Account**, as permitted under the applicable Government instructions. The candidate shall also furnish a **Bank Certificate/Bank Statement** establishing that the payment has been made from the eligible account.
 - The first instalment/full fees shall be deposited at the time of admission in the manner prescribed by the University.
- Registration/Continuation Fee:** A Registration/Continuation Fee equivalent to **15% of the prescribed tuition fee** shall be payable by candidates admitted under the **NRI Quota**, except in respect of admissions to **Adesh University, Bathinda, Sri Guru Ram Das University of Health Sciences, Amritsar, and Desh Bhagat University, Mandi Gobindgarh**, where the fee shall be governed by the respective University's applicable rules and notifications.
 - The seat matrix for **MDS Courses under the NRI Quota** in various private institutions shall be displayed on the University website before the commencement of the counselling process.

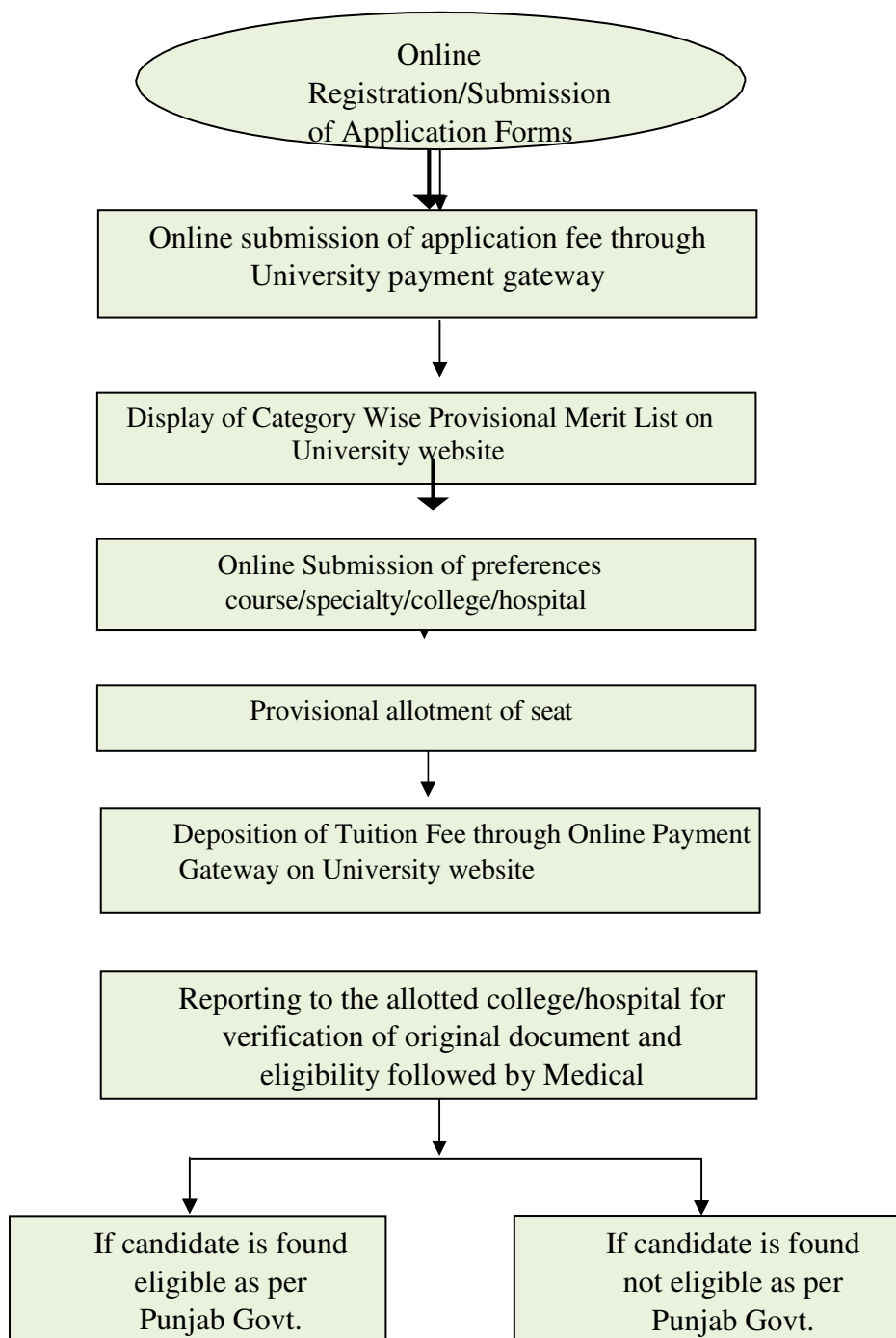
1. The above fees are payable in the manner prescribed by the University and are **non-refundable and non-adjustable** under any circumstances.
2. Fees deposited towards the **Eligibility Certificate** and/or the **Application Fee for admission under the NRI Quota** shall not be refunded, transferred or adjusted against any other fee or admission, irrespective of the outcome of the admission process or withdrawal of candidature.
3. The above fee structure shall be subject to amendment by the University or the Government of Punjab, as applicable, from time to time.

NOTE: The fee deposited towards the Eligibility Certificate and the Application Fee for admission to NRI Quota seats shall be non-refundable and non-adjustable under any circumstances. Once deposited into the University account, the said fee shall neither be refunded nor adjusted against any other fee or admission process, irrespective of whether the candidate applies, withdraws, is found ineligible, or is not allotted a seat

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

1. Admission to the **Master of Dental Surgery (MDS) Courses** shall be open only to candidates who have **qualified NEET-MDS-2026** and fulfil the eligibility conditions prescribed under the applicable notifications issued by the Government of Punjab, together with any subsequent amendments, corrigenda or instructions issued from time to time. The candidate must possess a recognized **Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS)** degree and satisfy all other eligibility requirements prescribed by the competent authorities.
2. A candidate shall **not acquire any right to admission merely on the basis of qualifying NEET-MDS-2026 or securing a particular All India Rank/State Merit Rank**. Admission shall be subject to fulfilment of all eligibility conditions, verification of original documents, applicable reservation policy, and availability of seats. The eligibility and merit of the candidate shall be determined by the **Admission Committee/Competent Authority** at the time of reporting/admission in accordance with:
 - the applicable Government of Punjab Notifications and amendments thereto;
 - the provisions contained in this Prospectus; and
 - the guidelines, regulations and instructions issued by the Government of India, Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), National Dental Commission/Dental Council of India, and other competent authorities.
3. Counselling and admission to the MDS Courses shall be conducted by the **Admission Committee/Competent Authority** constituted by the Government of Punjab, in accordance with the applicable statutory provisions, Government Notifications and the counselling schedule notified by the University.
4. **Minority Quota Seats:** Admission to seats earmarked under the Minority Quota shall be made in accordance with the applicable Government of Punjab Notifications, the relevant statutory provisions and the admission policy of the respective Minority Institution. The final determination of eligibility for admission under the Minority Quota shall rest with the concerned Minority Institution, subject to verification of eligibility and compliance with the applicable rules and regulations.

Procedure for Submission of Online Application Form and Online Choice Filling for Counselling

A. SUBMISSION OF ONLINE APPLICATION FORM

1. Candidates are advised to carefully read this Prospectus, the applicable Government of Punjab Notifications and all instructions available on the University website www.bfuhs.ac.in before submitting the online application form.
2. Only candidates who have **qualified NEET-MDS-2026** and fulfil the prescribed eligibility conditions shall be eligible to submit the online application for admission to the MDS Courses.

3. Documents to be Uploaded

The following documents shall be uploaded while filling the online application form:

- Recent passport-size colour photograph of the candidate (maximum file size: **30 KB**).
- Signature of the candidate (maximum file size: **30 KB**).

4. Specifications for Photograph

The uploaded photograph shall conform to the following specifications:

- i) Recent colour photograph measuring approximately **35 mm × 45 mm**, with the face and head covering at least **75%** of Candidate.
- ii) The candidate's name and the date of photograph should be printed below the photograph.
- iii) Photograph should be taken against a plain white or light-coloured background.
- iv) Caps, hats and goggles are not permitted. Spectacles may be worn only if regularly used. Computer-generated, scanned or Polaroid photographs shall not be accepted.
- v) The photograph shall display a full front view of the face with the candidate looking directly at the camera and maintaining a neutral facial expression.
- vi) The photograph should be free from shadows, reflections, red-eye effects or any distortion.
- vii) The original photograph should be of high quality with a minimum resolution of **600 dpi**.
- viii) The photograph should have natural colour and skin tone.
- ix) The photograph should not contain folds, scratches, stains or any visible damage.

Note: Applications containing blurred, unclear or non-conforming photographs are liable to be rejected.

5. Upon successful registration, the system shall generate a unique **Registration ID (Login ID)**. The password shall be sent to the candidate on the registered mobile number and/or e-mail address. The Login ID and password shall be required throughout the admission process and must be kept confidential.
6. Submission of the online application form along with the prescribed application fee shall **not confer any right to admission**.
7. Candidates shall ensure that their **BDS qualification is recognized by the competent statutory authority**. If at any stage the qualification is found to be unrecognized, the candidature/admission shall stand cancelled.
8. A candidate shall submit **only one online application**. Submission of multiple applications by the same candidate may result in rejection of all applications.
9. Candidates shall carefully fill all particulars in the online application form. Incomplete, inaccurate or misleading information may result in rejection of the candidature.

10. The prescribed application fee shall be paid **only through the online payment gateway** provided on the University website.
11. Applications submitted in offline mode or in the form of printed copies by post, courier or by hand shall not be accepted.
12. Candidates are advised to retain a printed copy of the submitted online application form and payment receipt until completion of the admission process.
13. Incomplete applications, applications without payment of the prescribed fee or applications not complying with the provisions of this Prospectus shall be rejected. The application fee shall not be refunded or adjusted under any circumstances.

CATEGORY SELECTION

Candidates shall carefully select and fill the appropriate **Category Code(s)** in the Online Admission Application Form. The category claimed by a candidate shall be based on his/her eligibility and the supporting documents prescribed under the applicable Government of Punjab notifications. The category selected at the time of filing cannot be changed under any circumstances.

A candidate may claim one or more category codes, wherever applicable, in accordance with the provisions of this Prospectus. The Category Code(s) are intended solely to facilitate the preparation of category-wise merit lists and counselling.

The mere selection or claim of a reserved category in the Online Admission Application Form shall **not** confer any automatic right or entitlement to reservation or admission against a reserved seat. The claim for reservation shall be considered only if the candidate satisfies the prescribed eligibility conditions and produces valid supporting documents issued by the competent authority, in accordance with the applicable Government of Punjab notifications, University regulations, and the decisions of the Selection/Admission Committee constituted for this purpose.

Candidates who:

- do not claim any category in the Online Admission Application Form;
- select an incorrect or invalid Category Code; or
- fail to submit the prescribed supporting documents,

shall be considered under the **Open (General) Merit Category**, provided they are otherwise eligible.

No benefit of reservation shall be admissible unless the claim is made in the Online Admission Application Form within the prescribed time.

Candidates may modify or correct their category and other particulars only up to the last date prescribed for submission of the Online Admission Application Form or within the correction period, if any, specifically notified by the University. **After the expiry of the prescribed last date/correction period, no request for addition, deletion, change, or correction of the claimed category or any other particulars shall be entertained under any circumstances.**

The decision of Baba Farid University of Health Sciences regarding acceptance or rejection of a claim for reservation, based on the applicable Government notifications and verification of documents, shall be final and binding.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PERSONS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITIES (PWBD)

- Candidates seeking reservation under the **PwBD Category** shall obtain a Disability Certificate from one of the **Designated Disability Assessment Centres** notified by the Government of India under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. The list of designated centres is available on the MCC website.
- Candidates shall produce the original Disability Certificate in the prescribed format at the time of counselling/reporting.
- No separate Medical Board shall be constituted by the University for determination of disability. Disability Certificates issued by authorities other than the designated centres shall not be accepted.

Instructions for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

- Candidates claiming reservation under the **EWS Category** shall produce a valid EWS Certificate issued **only by the competent authority of the Government of Punjab** in the prescribed format.
- EWS Certificates issued by authorities of any State or Union Territory other than Punjab shall **not** be accepted.
- Reservation under the EWS Category shall be governed strictly in accordance with the notifications, guidelines and instructions issued by the Government of Punjab from time to time.

STEP-III THE PROVISIONAL MERIT LIST

After completion of the scrutiny of applications, the University shall prepare and display the **State Merit List** of all eligible registered candidates on its official website. Thereafter, the online portal shall be activated for submission of **preferences/choices of course, college and quota** by the eligible candidates.

Online counselling shall be conducted strictly in accordance with the counselling schedule notified by the University on its official website. Candidates are advised to regularly visit the University website for updates regarding the counselling schedule, choice filling, seat allotment and other admission-related notifications.

B. INSTRUCTIONS FOR FIRST ROUND OF ONLINE COUNSELLING

- Only those candidates who have successfully completed **online registration** and deposited the prescribed application fee within the stipulated date and time shall be eligible to participate in the online counselling process. No candidate shall be permitted to participate in any round of counselling without valid registration.

2. Candidates are advised to carefully read the eligibility conditions prescribed in the Government of Punjab Notifications and this Prospectus. Mere participation in the counselling process or submission of online preferences shall not confer any right to admission.

The final eligibility of a candidate shall be determined by the **Principal of the allotted institution** at the time of reporting after verification of original documents and fulfilment of all eligibility conditions. Candidates found ineligible under the applicable Government Notifications, statutory regulations or medical fitness requirements prescribed by the competent authority shall not be admitted.

3. Counselling for admission to the MDS Courses shall be conducted **online**, followed by **physical reporting** at the allotted institution.

During online counselling, candidates shall submit their preferences in order of priority for:

- Course;
- Specialty;
- College; and
- Applicable Quota.

Seats shall be allotted strictly on the basis of merit, reservation policy, eligibility and the preferences exercised by the candidate. Candidates are, therefore, advised to exercise their choices carefully, as the allotment shall be made accordingly.

4. Candidates belonging to reserved categories who have secured marks **equal to or above the minimum qualifying marks of the Open/General Category** shall first be considered for allotment against Open Merit seats. In case a seat of the candidate's preference is not available under Open Merit, the candidate shall be considered against the respective reserved category, subject to availability of seats and fulfilment of eligibility conditions.
5. Candidates belonging to reserved categories who have secured marks below the minimum qualifying marks prescribed for the Open/General Category shall be considered only against seats reserved for their respective categories, subject to the qualifying criteria prescribed for NEET-MDS-2026 and the applicable Government Notifications.
6. After provisional allotment of a seat, the candidate shall download the Provisional Allotment Letter from the University website by logging into the admission portal and shall report to the allotted institution within the prescribed period along with all original documents for verification.

Issue of a Provisional Allotment Letter shall not, by itself, confer any right to admission. Admission shall remain subject to verification of documents, fulfilment of eligibility conditions and approval by the Principal of the allotted institution.

7. Payment of tuition fee after allotment shall not by itself confirm admission. Admission shall be deemed complete only after successful verification of eligibility, original documents and completion of all admission formalities.
8. A candidate who fails to report to the allotted institution within the prescribed period or fails to complete the admission formalities shall forfeit the allotted seat automatically without any further notice. Such seat shall be treated as vacant and shall be made available in the subsequent round(s) of counselling.
9. A candidate desirous of surrendering the allotted seat after joining during the First Round shall submit a written request to the Principal of the concerned institution within the period prescribed by the Government of Punjab and/or the University.

10. The facility of **Free Exit** shall be available only during the **First Round of Counselling**, in accordance with the schedule and guidelines notified by the Government of Punjab and the University.

STEP V – Provisional Allotment of Seat

1. Seat allotment made through the online counselling system shall be **purely provisional** and shall be subject to verification of original documents, fulfilment of eligibility conditions and approval by the Principal of the allotted institution.
2. **Seats** shall be allotted provisionally on the basis of:
 - NEET-MDS-2026 merit with addition of incentive marks in case of In-service candidates
 - Applicable Reservation Policy;
 - Eligibility of the candidate;
 - Preferences exercised during online choice filling; and
 - Availability of seats.
3. **Every** provisionally allotted candidate shall report to the allotted institution within the prescribed period for verification of original documents and determination of eligibility. The **Principal of the concerned institution** shall be responsible for verifying the eligibility of the candidate before permitting admission.
4. The distribution and allotment of seats shall be made strictly in accordance with the Government of Punjab Notifications and the approved seat matrix.

Where a candidate is eligible under more than one quota, allotment shall be made according to the order of priority prescribed by the Government. For eligible candidates in Private Institutions, allotment shall ordinarily be considered first against the **Management Quota**, wherever applicable. If a seat is not available under the Management Quota, the candidate shall be considered against the **Institutional Preference (IP) Quota** or any other applicable quota, subject to eligibility and availability of seats.

5. Similarly, for candidates belonging to the Punjab State Reserved Categories (SC/BC/EWS), allotment shall be made in accordance with the order of preference prescribed in the Government Notifications. Where an eligible candidate is entitled to be considered against more than one category or quota, the online counselling software shall allot the seat in the manner that is most beneficial to the candidate while ensuring compliance with the applicable reservation policy.

The complete seat matrix indicating the distribution of seats specialty-wise, college-wise, quota-wise and category-wise shall be displayed on the University website before commencement of online choice filling. Candidates are advised to carefully examine the seat matrix before exercising their preferences.

STEP VI – Verification of Documents and Reporting at the Allotted Institution

1. Candidates who are provisionally allotted a seat shall deposit the prescribed tuition fee through the **University Online Payment Gateway** within the stipulated period. Thereafter, the candidate shall report to the allotted institution along with the fee payment receipt and all original documents for verification of eligibility and completion of admission formalities.

Admission shall be subject to verification of original documents, fulfilment of eligibility conditions prescribed under the applicable Government of Punjab Notifications, statutory regulations and the

provisions of this Prospectus. Only after successful verification, medical fitness (wherever applicable) and completion of all prescribed formalities shall the candidate be permitted to join the allotted institution.

2. After completion of admission formalities, the concerned institution shall forward the **Registration Return**, together with the prescribed registration proforma, registration fee and all other required documents, to the University within the stipulated period for registration of the candidate in the allotted course, specialty and quota.

If, at the stage of University registration or at any subsequent stage, a candidate is found ineligible under the applicable Government Notifications or statutory regulations, the provisional allotment/admission shall be cancelled without any further notice.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF REPORTING

Every provisionally allotted candidate shall report to the allotted institution with the following original documents along with one set of self-attested photocopies:

1. One valid Government-issued Photo Identity Proof (Aadhaar Card, Passport, Voter Identity Card, Driving Licence or PAN Card).
2. Receipt of payment of the prescribed tuition fee.
3. NEET-MDS-2026 Admit Card.
4. NEET-MDS-2026 Result/Rank Card.
5. Matriculation/Secondary School Certificate or Birth Certificate as proof of date of birth.
6. Marks Sheets of all BDS Professional Examinations.
7. BDS Degree Certificate or Provisional Degree Certificate.
8. Compulsory Rotatory Internship Completion Certificate issued by the Head of the Institution.
9. Permanent or Provisional Registration Certificate issued by the State Dental Council/Dental Council of India.
10. Provisional No Objection Certificate (NOC), wherever applicable, in the case of In-Service candidates.
11. Category Certificate(s), wherever applicable, namely:
 - Scheduled Caste (SC) Certificate issued by the competent authority of the Government of Punjab;
 - Backward Class (BC) Certificate issued by the competent authority of the Government of Punjab in the prescribed format;
 - Economically Weaker Section (EWS) Certificate issued by the competent authority of the Government of Punjab;
 - Disability Certificate issued by a Designated Disability Assessment Centre in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the applicable NEET-MDS Information Bulletin.
12. Undertaking in the prescribed format (Annexure-B), wherever applicable.
13. Any other document(s) required under the Government Notifications, statutory regulations or by the University.

VERIFICATION OF MINORITY QUOTA CANDIDATES

Candidates claiming admission under the **Sikh Minority Quota** or **Christian Minority Quota** shall report to the respective Minority Institution for verification of minority status within the schedule notified by the University.

The concerned Minority Institution shall verify the eligibility of such candidates strictly in accordance with the applicable Government Notifications and its approved admission policy. Only those candidates whose minority status is duly verified and certified by the concerned institution shall be considered for admission under the respective Minority Quota during the online counselling process.

The list of eligible Minority Quota candidates, duly authenticated by the concerned institution, shall be forwarded to the University for incorporation in the counselling process.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

1. Provisionally allotted candidates shall deposit the prescribed tuition fee through the University Online Payment Gateway by logging into their admission portal within the stipulated period and shall carry the payment receipt while reporting to the allotted institution.
2. The **Provisional Allotment Letter/Selection Slip** shall be generated only after successful confirmation of receipt of the prescribed fee by the University.
3. Mere issuance of the Provisional Allotment Letter, payment of fee or reporting at the allotted institution shall not confer any right to admission. Admission shall be confirmed only after verification of eligibility, original documents and completion of all admission formalities by the concerned institution and the University.
4. Failure to report within the prescribed period or failure to produce the requisite original documents shall result in cancellation of the provisional allotment, and the seat shall be treated as vacant for subsequent round(s) of counselling.

Only those candidates, who submit their willingness within the prescribed schedule and deposit the requisite **Security Deposit**, wherever applicable, shall be eligible to participate in the respective round of counselling.

The Security Deposit shall be deposited only through the University Online Payment Gateway in accordance with the applicable Government Notifications.

2. Second Round of Online Counselling

Candidates who are satisfied with the seat allotted in the First Round and do not wish to upgrade or change their allotted seat need not participate in the Second Round.

Candidates seeking upgradation/change of specialty, college or quota shall:

- submit willingness within the prescribed period;
- deposit the prescribed Security Deposit, wherever applicable; and
- exercise fresh preferences for course, specialty, college and quota.

Candidates are advised to fill preferences according to their genuine order of choice irrespective of the displayed vacancy position, as additional vacancies may arise during the allotment process due to upgradation, resignation, conversion of seats or any other reason permissible under the applicable Government policy.

Where a candidate is allotted an upgraded seat in the Second Round, the tuition fee already deposited shall be adjusted against the revised fee payable. The candidate shall deposit only the balance amount, if any.

Candidates who have already deposited Security Deposit equal to or exceeding the prescribed amount shall not be required to deposit the same again.

3. THIRD AND SUBSEQUENT ROUNDS OF ONLINE COUNSELLING

Candidates who have accepted the seat allotted in the earlier rounds and do not wish to seek upgradation need not participate in the Third or subsequent rounds.

Candidates desirous of seeking upgradation/change of specialty, college or quota shall submit fresh willingness and exercise fresh preferences within the prescribed schedule.

Candidates are advised to exercise preferences according to their actual order of preference irrespective of the displayed vacancy position, as vacancies may arise due to:

- upgradation of candidates;
- resignation, wherever permitted;
- conversion of seats;
- filling of NRI or Reserved Category seats; or
- any other process prescribed under the Government policy.

Seat allotment shall be made strictly on the basis of merit, eligibility, reservation policy, applicable Government Notifications and the preferences exercised by the candidate.

Where a candidate is allotted an upgraded seat, the tuition fee already deposited shall be adjusted and only the balance amount, if any, shall be payable.

Candidates who have already deposited the prescribed Security Deposit shall not be required to deposit it again.

RESTRICTION ON UPGRADATION

Upgradation or shifting of seats shall not be permitted after the 3rd round of counselling, except where specifically permitted under the applicable Government of India or Government of Punjab guidelines.

General Instructions

1. Security Deposit shall be deposited only through the University Online Payment Gateway in accordance with the applicable Government Notifications.
2. Candidates who did not participate in the First Round or who were not allotted any seat despite being duly registered shall remain eligible for the Second Round and subsequent rounds, subject to the applicable Government policy.
3. Candidates who surrender the seat within the period prescribed under the applicable Government guidelines and do not participate in any subsequent round shall be governed by the refund and forfeiture provisions notified by the Government of Punjab and the Government of India.
4. The counselling process shall be governed strictly by the Notifications issued by the Government of Punjab, the Government of India, the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), the National Medical Commission/National Dental Commission (as applicable), and the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, as amended from time to time.
5. Candidates are advised to regularly visit the University website (www.bfuhs.ac.in) and the MCC website (www.mcc.nic.in) for counselling schedules, notices, corrigenda and other updates. No separate communication shall be issued individually.
6. The Security Deposit shall be liable to forfeiture in accordance with the applicable Government Notifications and MCC Guidelines, including where a candidate:
 - fails to join the allotted institution after allotment;
 - resigns from the allotted seat after the stage at which resignation is not permissible;
 - furnishes false, incorrect or misleading information;
 - fails to produce the prescribed original documents;

- is found ineligible at any stage; or
 - has the admission cancelled for any reason attributable to the candidate.
7. Where a penalty is prescribed under the applicable Government of India or Government of Punjab Notifications for non-joining, resignation or other violations, the same shall be imposed in addition to forfeiture of the Security Deposit, wherever applicable.
 8. Candidates joining the seat allotted in the 3rd round of counselling shall not be permitted to resign thereafter and shall not be eligible to participate in any further counselling, except where otherwise permitted under the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India or the applicable Government policy.
 9. Eligibility for participation in subsequent rounds of counselling shall be governed entirely by the applicable Government of India and Government of Punjab Notifications prevailing for the relevant admission session.

10. Forfeiture of Security Deposit

The refundable Security Deposit shall stand forfeited under, inter alia, the following circumstances:

- i) Where a candidate is allotted a seat in the Second or any subsequent round but fails to report to the allotted institution within the prescribed period.
- ii) Where the admission is cancelled after allotment on account of submission of false or incorrect information, suppression of material facts, non-production of requisite documents, failure to fulfil eligibility conditions, or any other reason attributable to the candidate.

IMPORTANT

Candidates shall regularly visit the official websites of the University (www.bfuhs.ac.in) and the Medical Counselling Committee (www.mcc.nic.in) for all notices, schedules, corrigenda and updates relating to counselling and admissions.

SCHEME OF COUNSELLING, CONVERSION OF SEATS AND FORFEITURE

The scheme of counselling, conversion of vacant seats, resignation, security deposit, forfeiture, penalties and all other matters relating to admission shall be governed strictly by the **applicable Notifications, Regulations and Guidelines issued by the Government of India, the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), the Government of Punjab, the National Medical Commission/National Dental Commission, and the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India**, as amended from time to time. SUBJECT: Admission to Post Graduate Degree/Diploma courses, and Six month training in Ultrasonography in the Health Sciences Educational Institutions (Medical/Dental)/ Hospitals in the State of Punjab - Session 2023 onwards.

1. The Government of Punjab is pleased to notify policy for admissions to Post Graduate Degree/Diploma courses and six month training in Ultrasonography "The Fundamentals in Abdomino-Pelvic Ultrasonography: Level one for MBBS Doctors", in the Health Sciences Educational Institutions (Medical/Dental) in the State of Punjab for the year 2023.
2. All admissions of Govt. and Private Institutions, including Private/ Deemed Universities and Minority Institutions, shall be based on merit of National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (Post Graduate) (NEET-PG-2023).
3. The eligibility criteria and other conditions shall be as prescribed in Information Bulletin for National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (Post Graduate) for admission to MD/MS/Post Graduate Courses 2023 issued by National Board of Examinations, New Delhi.
4. The Government of Punjab is further pleased to authorize Baba Farid University of Health Sciences (BFUHS), Faridkot to conduct centralized counselling for admission to 50% State Quota seats in Govt. Colleges and all seats in Private Medical / Dental Colleges, including Private/ Deemed Universities and Minority Institutions of the State of Punjab, on the basis of Merit of NEET-PG 2023 as per procedure laid down by National Medical Commission /Dental Council of India. The process and schedule of counselling shall be decided by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot. The details shall be published by the Baba Farid University of Health Sciences , Faridkot (www.bfuhs.ac.in).
5. One year compulsory rotatory internship is an essential prequalification for acquiring eligibility for admission to Post Graduate courses and the candidate should be registered with the State Medical Council/Dental Council. The cut off date for completion of Internship shall be as decided/fixed by NMC/DCI. However, the condition of one year Compulsory Rotatory Internship is not applicable to those candidates who have been specifically exempted.
6. A candidate who, after passing the final qualifying examination (MBBS/BDS or the foreign Medical/Dental Degree recognized by GOI/MCI/DCI), is undergoing 12-month compulsory rotatory Internship/practical training and is likely to

complete the same by date as decided by NMC/DCI, shall be eligible for admission provided he/she completes the compulsory rotatory Internship and obtains provisional or permanent registration. Such a candidate shall produce a certificate from the Head of Institution that he/she will be completing internship by the date decided by NMC/DCI.

7. The tentative distribution of seats shall be displayed by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot on its official website i.e. www.bfuhs.ac.in.
8. Any candidate who has taken admission in previous session in MD / MS / PG courses shall be eligible for fresh admission in new MD / MS / PG courses as a fresh candidate based on basis of result of NEET / PG. However, in case a candidate was admitted previously and drops out or leaves the Post Graduate Degree/Diploma course in between and seeks a fresh admission, the candidate shall have to deposit fee for full course (3 years for degree & 2 years for diploma course and Bond if applicable).
9. A Candidate having completed P.G. diploma, shall be eligible to apply for Postgraduate Degree course.
10. The schedule of admission process i.e. commencement of classes, cut-off date etc. shall be as declared by the National Medical Commission /Councils.
11. The application for admissions, complete in all respect shall be submitted to the Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot, Punjab. BFUHS may fix and charge fee for Prospectus, Application Fee etc. as approved by competent authority.
12. A candidate from reserve category shall have the right to compete for admission in open merit or general category seats as per his/her merit on the day of counselling and candidate so selected shall not be counted towards admission in the reserve category. A combined merit list and separate merit lists of each category shall also be prepared and displayed on the website of the University.
13. In case of any dispute in distribution of seats for medical courses for all the institutions situated in the State of Punjab, Director, Medical Education and Research, Punjab shall be the appellate authority.
14. **ADMISSION COMMITTEES:** In the overall supervision of Vice Chancellor of Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot, the following committees are constituted for holding counselling and finalizing the admissions:

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15. Distribution of Seats in Govt. Institutions (Govt. Medical/Dental College, Amritsar & Patiala, GGS Medical College, Faridkot)

15.1 In the Govt. Institutions, 50% of the total seats shall be filled by the Government of India at All India level, and remaining 50% seats shall be filled at the State level as State Quota seats.

- 15.2(i) All the seats of state quota in general category, PWD category and EWS category shall be Institutional preference seats.
- 15.2(ii) PCMS doctors covered under Para 15.3 of the notification, whether they have passed their qualifying examination from Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot or any other University located in Punjab or any other University located outside Punjab, will be eligible to be considered under Institutional preference category.
- 15.2(iii) The PCMS doctor who have completed one year of service including period of RMO service as on 31.03.2023, are also eligible for seeking admissions in PG courses based on NEET PG without any incentive marks. Such candidates will be considered as institutional preference candidates irrespective of University from where they have passed their qualifying examination and these candidates will have to get NOC from the competent authority of Punjab Govt.
- 15.2(iv) Reservation shall be as per the existing policy.
- 15.3 Eligibility shall be as decided vide memo. No. 26/142/18-2HB2/1509055/1 - 3 dated 25.06.2019 & 17.10.2020 issued by Department of Health & Family Welfare (Annexure-A) For PCMS/DCMS Dental candidates eligible under para 2 of Annexure A, Incentive marks shall be granted as per para 2.1(a) & (b), who fulfill the eligibility criteria as mentioned in clauses 15.4.1(a) & 15.4.2.

15.4 **A. Eligibility criteria :-**

15.4.1 For in-service Regular PCMS/PCMS (Dental) doctors (Incentive Category):-

- a) The Eligibility requirements for grant of incentive (of 30% / 20% marks) shall be as decided vide memo no. 26/142/18-2HB2/1509055/1-3 dated 25.06.19 & 07-10-2020 and as per notification Memo No.26/142/2018-2H2(4H2)/3440 dated 26-11-2020 issued by department of Health & Family Welfare.
- b) The period of rural service shall be computed as on 31.03.2023. **No experience after this date will be considered.**
- c) Adhoc service rendered in respective category will be counted for the purpose of computing the stipulated period.
- d) PCMS/ PCMS (Dental) in service candidates will submit along with the application a certificate regarding length of service, length of rural service, number of years of service left after completion of PG course & that no department/vigilance inquiry is pending against the candidate and that based on this Certificate, the Department of Health & Family Welfare will grant eligibility certificate for participation in counseling for PG admission.
- e) Once this Eligibility Certificate is granted to a candidate by the

Department of Health & family Welfare, the candidate shall, subject to other conditions mentioned above, be eligible for submitting an application under the 'incentive category for counselling for admissions to PG courses. However, upon selection for admission to PG courses, the candidate would be required to furnish an 'Indemnity Bond' as mentioned in sub-para (f) below. After submission of 'Indemnity Bond' by a candidate, Department of Health & Family Welfare would issue him NOC for admission and the candidate would stand relieved from the Department of Health & Family Welfare.

- f) All in service doctors shall have to submit a bond as notified by the Health Department. If the candidate fails to do so he/she shall have to deposit the bond money with the Government as per notification by Health Department, Punjab.
- g) In-service PCMS doctors of incentive category would get full pay (including NPA) as decided by Hon'ble High Court vide its order dated 23.07.2019 in CWP No. 11372 of 2017 and other cases.

15.4.2 Candidates other than in service Regular PCMS/PCMS (Dental) doctors (Non-Incentive category)

Eligibility and other conditions shall be as decided vide memo no. 26/142/18-2HB2/1509055/1-3 dated 25.06.19 & Order No. HFW/HLH2028/45/2020-4HB3/2532-39 dated 07-10-2020 as per notification Memo No.26/142/2018-2H2(4H2)/3440 dated 26-11-2020 issued by Department of Health & Family Welfare.

B. Other doctors

(i) This category would include doctors working in other departments namely Rural Medical Officers (RMOs) in the Department of Rural Development, doctors in Municipal Corporations under the Department of Local Bodies, doctors serving in various Boards & Corporations of Punjab Government and fresh candidates.

(ii) Doctors who are serving in Boards and Corporations and other Departments will be allowed to participate in the counselling only after they produce NOC from their employer. Doctors would be required to abide by the terms and conditions of the NOC issued to them by their respective employers. These doctors would get fixed emoluments / stipend as determined by the Punjab Government from time to time.

(iii) Doctors who are not employed in other Departments, Boards & Corporations of the Punjab Government and other fresh candidates, would be required to submit an indemnity bond of Rs. 15 lakhs to serve the Punjab Government for a period of 2 years after completion

of diploma / degree course. This clause will not be applicable in case the offer is not given by the Punjab Government within a period of six months of passing of the PG course or they join SR ship in any of the Government colleges of Punjab subject to availability.

The candidate will inform the Punjab Government that he / she has passed PG examination. Failure to serve the Punjab Government for a period of two years will lead to recovery of bond money by the Punjab Government. If a candidate is selected for higher studies after passing PG course her/his bond shall be extended till study completed.

These doctors would get fixed emoluments / stipend as determined by the Punjab Government from time to time for the complete course.

15.4.3 For All India quota candidates

All India quota candidates shall submit a bond of Rs. 10 Lakhs to serve the State of Punjab for one year after completion of Post Graduate course. All other conditions would remain the same as for State quota candidates.

16.1 **Distribution of seats :-**

Distribution of Seats in the following private institutions/universities would be as under:-

(a) **Dayanand Medical College (DMC), Ludhiana :**

Open Merit Category (Govt. Quota) – 50%
Management Quota 50% out of which NRI quota upto 15%

(b) **Christian Medical College(CMC) and
Christian Dental College(CDC), Ludhiana :**

Christian Medical College and Christian Dental College Ludhiana have been categorized as Christian Minority institutions and Hon'ble Supreme Court in its order dated 09.08.2004 and final order dated 02.12.2010 in Writ Petition (Civil) No. 357 of 2004 allowed them to make admissions as per the procedure followed by them for more than 25 years till 2002-2003.

(c) **Sri Guru Ram Das University of Health Sciences,
Amritsar:**

General Quota 50% out of which NRI quota upto 7.5%
Sikh Minority Quota 50% out of which NRI quota upto 7.5%

(d) **Adesh University of Health Sciences & Research,
Bathinda:**

Distribution of seats shall be as provided in The Adesh University Act, 2012 and in their statutes. 85% seats are earmarked for bonafide residents of Punjab and 15 % seats earmarked for candidates of other states. For P.G. course seats, no reservation based on place of domicile is allowed as per orders of Supreme Court of India and High Courts. Accordingly, Adesh University can admit 50% students from Institutional Preference and 50% from open category. For 50% Institutional Quota, the admissions shall be made from candidates who have done MBBS from Adesh University Bathinda. Remaining 50% seats shall be filled up from among other students who have done MBBS from universities other than Adesh University Bathinda. There is no provision of NRI quota in the statutes of the University as such there shall be no quota for NRI candidates.

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16.2 Distribution of seats in Private Institutions:-

(a) Reservation: shall be as under:

i)	SC Category	25%

iv)	EWS	10%

EWS seats are over & above the sanctioned intake subject to grant of permission by BoG-MCI as per letter No-MCI23(1)2019-Med1685002 dated 02-12-2019.

As per 2006 Act the reservation would be the both in Government quota and management quota. Accordingly it is clarified that in DMC, Ludhiana the reservation would be both in Government/Open Merit and Management quota. As regard, CMC & CDC, Ludhiana and SGRD University, Amritsar, the reservation would only be in "Open Category quota". As far as Adesh University is concerned, the reservation shall be in all the 100% seats.

The scheduled castes and backward classes candidates have to be domicile from the Punjab irrespective University/college from where they have graduated. The persons with physical disability will have no such restriction.

(b) Institutional Preference:-

The PCMS doctors who have completed one year of service as on 31-03-2023 are also eligible for seeking admission in PG courses based on their NEET Marks without any incentive marks. Such candidates will be considered as institutional preference (IP) candidates including Rural Medical Service irrespective of University from where they have passed their qualifying examination and these candidates will have to get NOC from the competent authority of Punjab Govt.

After earmarking the seats for Scheduled castes and Backward classes as explained in para- (a) above, the remaining seats in Government Quota/Open Quota in DMC, Ludhiana, CMC & CDC, Ludhiana and SGRD University, Amritsar shall be reserved for General Category and Physically Disabled categories by way of Institutional Preference i.e., for the candidates who have passed out MBBS from BFUHS Faridkot (in respect of DMC, Ludhiana and CMC & CDC, Ludhiana) Adesh University & SGRD, Amritsar respectively.

As regards Adesh University, Bathinda / SGRD, Amritsar, after

earmarking the seats for SC and BC out of 50% of the seats, all the remaining seats shall be reserved by way of Institutional preference i.e. for candidates who have passed out MBBS from Adesh University, Bathinda/ SGRD, Amritsar respectively.

If adequate number of Institutional Preference (IP) candidates are not available in a University, then IP candidates from other two universities can be admitted based however, on their own merit.

The remaining seats in management quota/minority quota and 50% seats in Adesh University, Bathinda / SGRD Amritsar respectively shall be filled-up on all India basis.

- (c) EWS seats are over & above the sanctioned intake subject to grant of permission by BoG-MCI as per letter No.MCI-23(1)/2019-Med/1685002 dated 02.12.2019.

16.3 NRI Seats

As explained in para 16.1 above, private institutions and universities have been allowed upto 15% NRI seats of total seats. Detailed distribution has also been explained in Para 16.1 above. These seats shall be filled on the basis of merit in NEET-PG-2023, in order of preference as under:-

Category I : NRIs/Children of NRI who originally belonged to the State of Punjab.

Category II : NRIs/ Children of NRI who originally belonged to an Indian State other than Punjab.

- (a) Under this policy Non Resident Indian means, a person of Indian origin, whether holding an Indian Passport or Foreign Passport, who is either permanently or temporarily settled outside India and in either case:
- (i) For or on taking up employment outside India ; or
 - (ii) For carrying on a business or vocation outside India; or
 - (iii) For any other purpose, in such circumstances, as would indicate his intention to stay outside India for an uncertain period;
- For ascertaining the eligibility relevant documents including Foreign Country Passport or Green Card or Permanent Resident Card or Proof of Residency of Foreign country issued by competent authority or OCI/PIO Card issued by the Government of India shall be taken into consideration.
- (b) If sufficient number of candidates under first category are eligible and available then they will be admitted first even if students under subsequent category are higher in merit.
- (c) The left over seats in the NRI quota in private institutions will go to management quota and shall be filled on merit based upon the

NEET-PG-2023.

- (d) Candidates applying under NRI category must get eligibility certificate from BFUHS, Faridkot.
- (e) The NRI students will have to give a Bank Guarantee / Surety Bond for the balance of fee, if they opt to pay the fee in instalments on annual basis proportionately.
- (f) Any misrepresentation, false information, fake documentation and impersonation for securing admission shall be punishable under the relevant provisions of Indian Penal Code and other applicable laws along-with cancellation of admission.
- (g) Availability of NRI seats shall be as per roster maintained subject-wise by each Private College.

18. **Schedule of Fee:-**

- i) Tuition fee for six month shall be paid to Registrar, Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.
- ii) If candidate is shifted from one College to another in the subsequent Counselling, the fee shall be refunded / adjusted after completion of the admission process. The University shall refund / adjust the fee within 30 days.
- iii) The fee shall be payable on six month basis and the institutes shall not insist the candidate to deposit fee of the entire course in advance.
- iv) Hostel fee and security advance (Annual and provisional) for private

institutes.

- a. Non Air Conditioned Independent Room: Rs.16,500/- per year for the First year (Maximum) for single bedroom. This fee may be hiked by maximum upto 5% for each subsequent year.
- b. Special Room (Attached bathroom and AC): Rs.26,400/- per year (Maximum). This fee may be hiked by maximum upto 10% for each subsequent year.
- c. Security Advance Rs.27,500/- or its equivalent (refundable in the shape of demand draft).
- d. Mess charges- Actual and to be managed by the students.
- e. These charges are exclusive of electricity and water charges but inclusive of every other charge. All charges shall be levied from students on six monthly basis.

- v) The fee for six month will be collected on the spot by the Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot on behalf of the respective institutions at the time of counselling and the same will be transferred to the respective institutions after completion of admission process.
- vi) The fee will be payable on six month basis for all the categories and the institutes shall not insist upon the candidate to deposit fee of the entire course in advance. At the most, candidates can be asked to furnish a Bond/Bank Guarantee that they will be liable to pay the balance fee for the whole course even if they leave the institute/course midway.
- vii) The fee shall be refunded / adjusted if candidate is shifted from one college to another in the subsequent counselling.

19. **Procedure for conversation of seats during 2nd round of counselling.**

- i) The left over NRI seats shall be shifted into General pool.
- ii) All seats remaining vacant after exhausting reserve category and NRI candidates the remaining vacant seats will be converted into general pool into respective quota during 2nd counseling itself.
- iii) No fresh applications shall be called by individual institutions.

20. **Admission criteria for training in Ultrasonography.**

- a) Admission shall be based on merit in the NEET-PG-2023.
- b) Counselling for Six month training in Ultrasonography shall be held at once, however, classes for 2nd batch will commence after completion of 1st batch.
- c) Only PCMS candidates shall be eligible for admission in Govt. Medical Colleges. However, remaining vacant seats shall be filled from eligible Medical Graduates from the State of Punjab. After exhausting Punjab

- state graduates, the remaining seats may be offered to other state candidates as per NEET-PG merit.
- d) From amongst PCMS doctors, only those doctors are eligible who have rendered minimum one year service.
 - e) The PCMS candidate shall have to serve Government of Punjab for 4 years after training and shall have to furnish bond of Rs 10 Lakhs for serving 4 years in PCMS.
 - f) Medical Graduates from the State of Punjab are eligible for admission in Private Institutions for training in Ultrasonography. After exhausting Punjab state graduates, the remaining seats may be offered to other state candidates as per NEET-PG merit.
 - g) There shall be reservation of seats as prescribed for PG Degree courses in Government and Private Institutions.
 - h) Fee in Government institutions for whole course shall be Rs. 20,000/- only.
 - i) Fee in private institutions shall be Rs. 1,00,000/- only.
 - j) No stipend shall be granted.
21. If candidate after passing M.D./M.S. exam, is selected for higher studies, then bond will be extended.
22. Guidelines of Medical counselling committee, MOHFW, Govt. of India (NMC) shall be followed from time to time in the process of counselling.
23. In case of any doubt, the Administrative Secretary, Department of Medical Education & Research, Government of Punjab may issue clarification which will have force of the policy.
24. For any dispute arising out of this notification or of the admissions under this notification, the Administrative Secretary, Department of Medical Education & Research, Government of Punjab shall be competent to resolve, whose decisions shall be final.
25. This notification supersedes all the previous notifications for admission to the postgraduate degree/ diploma courses & six month course in Ultrasonography, in the State of Punjab.

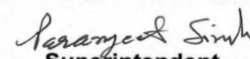

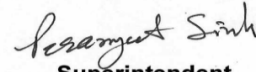

Sub:- Regarding issuance of No Objection Certificate to PCMS/PCMS (Dental) Doctors for admission to Post Graduation (Diploma/Degree) Courses and Super Specialty Courses in Government and Private institutions situated within and outside the State of Punjab.

Detailed instructions in regard to issuance of NOC to in-service PCMS/PCMS (Dental) doctors for admissions to PG/Super Specialty courses were issued vide Memo No. 26/12/94-5HB2/126-128, Dated 08-01-2010. Thereafter following 9 amendments have been carried out-

1. Memo No. 26/12/94-5HB2/4456-58, Dated 17-07-12,
2. Memo No. 26/12/94-5HB2/196-99, Dated 23-04-13,
3. Memo No. 26/12/94-5HB2/434, Dated 22-05-13,
4. Memo No. 26/12/94-5HB2/1640, Dated 23-07-13,
5. Memo No. 26/12/94-5HB2/4047-49, Dated 29-10-13,
6. Memo No. 26/12/94-5HB2/166398/1-6, Dated 20-02-14,
7. Memo No. 27/35/15-5HB2/447931/1, Dated 26-03-15
8. Memo No. 26/12/94-5HB2/61-72, Dated 04-05-16 and
9. Memo No. 26/12/94-2HB2/996864/1-3, Dated 7-6-17

The above amendments have been consolidated and incorporated in these guidelines. Besides, some major changes have been made and accordingly, in supersession of all previous instructions on the subject, the following guidelines would be applicable to PCMS/PCMS (Dental) Doctors for admission to Post Graduate (PG) and Super Specialty Courses w.e.f. academic year 2020-21.

1. Common terms for Post Graduation (Diploma/Degree) Courses and Super Specialty Courses

1.1 Detailed conditions for admission to the different courses and categories have been indicated in relevant Paras and it is necessary to invite the attention of the candidates towards some of the common and important conditions as mentioned in the following paragraphs.

1.2 The existing instructions require different bonds for different categories of candidates. For example, for PG courses, the bond required

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is for 10 years of service and Rs.50 lakh if admission is given under 30% incentive category or 5 years and 15 lakhs if admission is based on the merit of the student without any incentive marks. However, if a candidate is sponsored to PGI, then the requirement of bond is for 15 years of service and Rs.70 lakh. Then, there are other conditions regarding completion of rural area service, probation period etc.

The instruction have been accordingly amended and only 2 broad categories i.e. candidates sponsored by the State Government and candidates who secure admission on the basis of their own merit have been envisaged. The first category candidates would either be sponsored by the State Government or they would get incentive marks and would get full pay during the PG Courses. The bond would be for 10 years or for Rs. 50 lakh. The second category candidates would be given leave of the kind due during the PG Courses and would be required to execute a bond of 5 years or Rs. 15 lakh. For diploma courses the requirement would be less.

Secondly, the requirement of minimum number of years of service in 'difficult rural area' (category 'D') and 'other rural area' (category 'C') as eligibility criteria for grant of incentive marks of 20% and 30% has also been reduced from 4/6 years to 2/3 years.

Besides, there are some minor changes which may kindly be noted.

- 1.3 **Eligibility Certificate:** The in-service PCMS/PCMS(Dental) doctors desirous of seeking admission in PG courses will submit an application accompanied by a Certificate from Civil Surgeon regarding length of service, length of rural service and the number of years of service, left after completion of PG/Super Specialty Course and that no Departmental or Vigilance inquiry is pending against the candidate. Based on this certificate the DHS would determine the eligibility of the candidates for admission for PG/Super Specialty Courses as per these guidelines and make the recommendation to the Government. Based on this recommendation the Department of Health and Family Welfare will grant Eligibility Certificate for participation in counseling/admission process for PG/Super Specialty course admissions.

- 1.4 **NOC and Bond:** Based on this Eligibility Certificate the candidate can apply for admission. Upon selection for admission to PG/Super Specialty Course, the candidate would be required to furnish Indemnity Bond. After submission of Indemnity Bond by the candidate, the Department of Health

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and Family Welfare would issue him NOC for admission and the candidate would stand relieved from the Health and Family Welfare Department.

Doctors would be required to comply with the conditions of the Indemnity bond. In case they do not complete the stipulated years of service after completion of the PG Course or do not deposit the required amount, their action would be treated as gross misconduct and the Department would among other steps have the registration of such doctors struck off from the register of Punjab Medical/Dental Council.

The Department would consider, for grant of NOC, only those PCMS/PCSM(Dental) doctors who are serving in the Department and who have completed minimum of 2 or 1 year of service as explained para 2.1 and 3.1. There have been many cases in the past where doctors pursuing PG Courses have been granted NOC upon their selection into PCMS on the basis of their joining the Health and Family Welfare Department for a day or so. This does not make any sense at all and such doctors will have to either join the PCMS immediately full time or seek extension from the Department of Health and Family Welfare for completing the PG Courses. After completion of the Courses, they would be allowed to join the Department and given seniority from the date of joining.

2. 30% incentive Category

- 2.1 **Eligibility** - As per Regulation 9 (IV) of Medical Council of India (MCI) under the Heading -"Selection of Post Graduate Students", it has been provided as under:-

"Provided that in determining the merit of candidates who are in service of government/public authority, weightage in the marks may be given by the Government/Competent Authority as an incentive at the rate of 10% of the marks obtained for each year of service in remote and/or difficult areas upto the maximum of 30% of the marks obtained in National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test. The remote and difficult areas shall be as defined by State Government/Competent Authority from time to time."

Accordingly, the candidate must fulfill the following conditions for incentive marks:-

- (a) Regular PCMS doctors who have completed 2 years of service in 'difficult rural area' (category 'D') or 3 years of service in 'other rural area' (category 'C') or appropriate combination (1:1.5) thereof would get 20% incentive marks.

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- (b) Regular PCMS doctors who have completed 3 years of service in 'difficult rural area (category 'D') or 4.5 years of service in 'other rural area' (category 'C') or appropriate combination (1:1.5) thereof would get 30% incentive marks.
- (c) Has cleared the probation period.
- (d) Good service record i.e. there is no charge sheet pending under Rule 8 or no challan has been submitted in judicial courts regarding any criminal case; and
- (e) Should have minimum of 6 years and 10 years of service left after completion of diploma or Post Graduate degree respectively

2.2 **Pay:** The doctors under 30% incentive category i.e., para 2.1(a) & (b) would get full pay and allowances admissible from time to time as per instructions of Finance and Department of Health and Family Welfare. As of now as per letter No.27/35/15-5HB2/447931/1 dated 26.3.2015 of the Department of Health and Family Welfare, such candidates would get full pay and allowances except for non-practicing allowance which was stopped as per decision of Council of Ministers dated 11.6.2014.

The candidate would be required to complete diploma and degree courses within 2 or 3 years. If they are not able to complete the course within this stipulated period, they would be allowed leave of the kind due to complete the course/appear in examination. The candidates can take admission in Diploma/Degree only once under this 30% incentive category. In case the candidate abandons the course midway then he/she shall be debarred from reapplying for PG admission in this category and the time spent would be treated as 'leave without pay'.

2.3 **Bond :** The candidates upon their admission would be required to give an indemnity bond for rendering minimum number years of service after completion of PG Course or bond money in lieu thereof with the following details-

Sr.No.	Name of Course	Bond money	Period
1	PG Diploma Course	Rs. 25 lakh	06 years
2	PG Degree Course	Rs. 50 lakh	10 years

If the doctors do not complete the prescribed minimum service after completion of their PG/Diploma Course as mentioned above, the State Government shall invoke the bond. This action would also be treated as gross misconduct and the Department would have the registration of such doctors struck off from the Register of Punjab Medical Council/Punjab Dental Council.

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3. Non Incentive Category

- 3.1 The PCMS doctors who have completed 1 year of service but may or may not have completed rural service and who may or may not have cleared the probation period are also eligible for seeking admission in PG courses based on their NEET marks without any incentive marks provided that their service record is good i.e. no charge sheet is pending under Rule 8 or no challan has been submitted in judicial courts in respect of a criminal case.
- 3.2 The PCMS doctors mentioned in para 3.1 above would be eligible to take admissions in-
- (i) Punjab Government Medical/Dental Colleges;
 - (ii) Private Colleges and Universities in Punjab; and
 - (iii) Government and private Colleges and Universities outside the State.
 - (iv) PGIMER, Chandigarh and other such Institutions in non-sponsored category
- 3.3 The requirement of minimum service after completion of PG/Degree course and bond money would be as under-

Sr.No.	Name of Course	Bond money	Period
1	PG Diploma Course	Rs. 10 lakh	03 years
2	PG Degree Course	Rs. 15 lakh	05 years

Those candidates would complete the degree/diploma course at their own expense and they would be granted leave of the kind due for the duration of the course. These doctors would be allowed to do PG/Diploma course only if they have 5 years and 3 years of service left. The candidates who leave the course in between, would be debarred and will not be allowed to apply for the course again.

4. Sponsored candidates for PGIMER, Chandigarh

- 4.1 PCMS doctors would be sponsored for admission (Degree/Diploma Courses) in Pediatrics, Gynecology, Anesthesia, Radiology, Psychiatry, Eye, ENT, Medicine, Surgery, Nuclear Medicine, Radiotherapy, Skin and Ortho in PGIMER, Chandigarh.
- 4.2 The candidates would be required to execute a bond of Rs 50 lakh for serving the Government of Punjab for at least 10 years after completion of the course. The period spent on completing the course in PGIMER, Chandigarh shall be treated as part of duty. They would get full pay and allowances as per instructions issued from time to time. As of now they are

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not allowed NPA and Deputation Allowance as per instructions dated 26.3.2015. of Health Department. The candidate must fulfill the following conditions:

- (a) Regular PCMS doctors who have completed 3 year of rural service i.e., either in category "C" or category "D" institutions.
- (b) Should have minimum of 6 years and 10 years of service left after completion of diploma or Post Graduate degree respectively
- (c) Who have cleared probation period.
- (d) Who have good service record i.e. no charge sheet is pending under Rule-8 or no challan has been submitted in judicial courts in respect of a criminal case.

5. Super Specialty Course

- 5.1 The following terms and conditions will be applicable for the PCMS Medical Officers (Specialist) who apply for the Super Specialty Courses:
- a) He/She shall complete the minimum 1 year of regular service.
 - b) He/She has good service record i.e. no charge sheet is pending under rule 8 of the Punjab Civil Service Rules, 1970 and challan has been submitted in any judicial courts in respect of a criminal case.
- 5.2 The department of Health shall issue the No Objection Certificate only for those Super Specialty Course in which the Department is having the shortage/requirement.
- 5.3 The eligible PCMS doctors can apply for the Super Specialty Course in any Government/Private institutions within or outside the State of Punjab
- 5.4 The PCMS doctors shall have to furnish Bond Money of Rs. 50 lakh for 10 years service with Punjab Government in case, he/she is sponsored by the Punjab Government and his/her admission is based on that sponsorship. They will get full pay minus NPA
- If he/she takes admission based on his/her own merit then, the Bond required would be Rs.15 lakh for 5 years of service and they will be given 'leave of kind due'.
- 5.5 Only those PCMS doctors who have 05 or 10 years of service left after completion of course, as required as per para 5.5 above. will be sent for the Super Specialty Course. Doctors who are already bonded for PG Course and who want to apply for Super Specialty Course will be allowed NOC/Eligibility Certificate leave only if service left after Super Specialty Course is adequate to fulfill the requirements of two bonds It is clarified that the two bonds will have to be satisfied both in terms of amount and minimum service to be rendered in Punjab Government.

6. Regarding Ultrasonography Training for six months:

- 6.1 The following terms and conditions will be applicable for the PCMS doctors

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who want to apply for the six months Ultrasonography training

- a) The candidate has completed the 1 year in regular service.
- b) He/She has good service record i.e. no charge sheet is pending under rule 8 of the Punjab Civil Service Rules, 1970 and challan has been submitted in any judicial courts in respect of criminal cases.

6.2 Before relieving from the department of Health and Family Welfare, an Indemnity bond as under shall have to be furnished by those PCMS doctors who have been selected for the six months Ultrasonography under this category.

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) in direct recruitment in civil posts and services in the Government of India.

In continuation of this Department's Office Memorandum of even number dated 19.01.2019, the following instructions are issued in consultation with Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment and Department of Legal Affairs regarding reservation for EWSs not covered under the reservation scheme for SCs/STs/OBCs in respect of direct recruitment in civil posts and services in the Government of India.

2. QUANTUM OF RESERVATION

The persons belonging to EWSs who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs and OBCs shall get 10% reservation in direct recruitment in civil posts and services in the Government of India.

3. EXEMPTION FROM RESERVATION:

3.1 "Scientific and Technical" posts which satisfy all the following conditions can be exempted from the purview of the reservation orders by the Ministries/ Departments:

(i) The posts should be in grades above the lowest grade in Group A of the service concerned.

(ii) They should be classified as "scientific or technical" in terms of Cabinet Secretariat [OM No. 85/11/CF-61(1) dated 28.12.1961], according to which scientific and technical posts for which qualifications in the natural sciences or exact sciences or applied sciences or in technology are prescribed and the incumbents of which have to use that knowledge in the discharge of their duties.

(iii) The posts should be 'for conducting research' or 'for organizing, guiding and directing research'.

3.2 Orders of the Minister concerned should be obtained before exempting any posts satisfying the above condition from the purview of the scheme of reservation.

4. CRITERIA OF INCOME & ASSETS:

4.1 Persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs and OBCs and whose family has gross annual income below **Rs. 8.00 lakh (Rupees eight lakh only)** are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.

Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:-

- i. 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
- ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
- iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
- iv. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.

4.2. The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.

4.3 The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

5. INCOME AND ASSET CERTIFICATE ISSUING AUTHORITY AND VERIFICATION OF CERTIFICATE:

5.1 The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Income and Asset Certificate issued by any one of the following authorities in the prescribed format as given in **Annexure-I** shall only be accepted as proof of candidate's claim as belonging to EWS: -

- (i) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/Additional Deputy Commissioner/1st Class Stipendary

- Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner
- (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate
 - (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and
 - (iv) Sub-Divisional Officer or the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.

5.2 The Officer who issues the certificate would do the same after carefully verifying all relevant documents following due process as prescribed by the respective State/UT.

5.3 The crucial date for submitting income and asset certificate by the candidate may be treated as the closing date for receipt of application for the post, except in cases where crucial date is fixed otherwise.

5.4 The appointing authorities should, in the offer of appointment to the candidates claiming to be belonging to EWS, include the following clause :-

"The appointment is provisional and is subject to the Income and asset certificate being verified through the proper channels and if the verification reveals that the claim to belong to EWS is fake/false the services will be terminated forthwith without assigning any further reasons and without prejudice to such further action as may be taken under the provisions of the Indian Penal Code for production of fake/false certificate."

The appointing authority should verify the veracity of the Income and asset certificate submitted by the candidate through the certificate issuing authority.

5.5 Instructions referred to above should be strictly followed so that it may not be possible for an unscrupulous person to secure employment on the basis of a false claim and if any person gets an appointment on the basis of such false claim, her/his services shall be terminated invoking the conditions contained in the offer of appointment.

6. EFFECTING RESERVATION - MAINTENANCE OF ROSTERS:

6.1 Department of Personnel and Training had circulated Office Memorandum No.36012/2/96-Estt(Res) dated July 2, 1997 regarding implementation of post based reservation roster. The general principles for making and operating post

based reservation roster would be as per the principles laid down in the said Office Memorandum.

6.2 Every Government establishment shall now recast group-wise post-based reservation roster register for direct recruitment in accordance with format given in **Annexure II, III, IV and V**, as the case may be, for effecting 10% reservation for EWSs interpolating them with the SCs, STs and OBCs. While fixing roster point, if the EWS roster point coincides with the roster points of SCs/STs/OBCs the next available UR roster point has been allotted to the EWSs and also the principle of "squeezing" has been kept in view. While drawing up the rosters, the cadre controlling authorities may similarly "squeeze" the last points of the roster so as to meet prescribed 10% reservation.

6.3 Where in any recruitment year any vacancy earmarked for EWS cannot be filled up due to non availability of a suitable candidate belonging to EWS, such vacancies for that particular recruitment year shall not be carried forward to the next recruitment year as backlog.

6.4 Persons belonging to EWS selected against the quota for persons with benchmark disabilities/ex-servicemen shall be placed against the roster points earmarked for EWS.

7. ADJUSTMENT AGAINST UNRESERVED VACANCIES:

A person belonging to EWS cannot be denied the right to compete for appointment against an unreserved vacancy. Persons belonging to EWS who are selected on the basis of merit and not on account of reservation are not to be counted towards the quota meant for reservation.

8. FORTNIGHTLY/ANNUAL REPORTS REGARDING REPRESENTATION OF EWS:

The Ministries/Departments shall send single consolidated fortnightly report including their attached/subordinate offices beginning from 15.2.2019 as per format at **Annexure-VI**.

From 01.01.2020, the Ministries/Departments shall upload data on representation of EWSs in respect of posts/services under the Central Government on the URL i.e. www.rrcps.nic.in as on 1st January of every year. All Ministries/Departments have already been provided respective usercode and password with guidelines for operating the URL.

9. MAINTENANCE OF REGISTER OF COMPLAINTS BY THE GOVERNMENT ESTABLISHMENT:

9.1 Every Government establishment shall appoint a senior officer of the Department as the Grievance Redressal Officer.

9.2 Any person aggrieved with any matter relating to discrimination in employment against any EWS may file a complaint with the Grievance Redressal Officer of the respective Government establishment. The name, designation and contact details of the Grievance Redressal Officer may be displayed prominently on the website and in the office of the concerned establishment.

10. LIAISON OFFICER:

Ministries/Departments/Attached and Subordinate Offices shall appoint Liaison Officer to monitor the implementation of reservation for EWSs.

11. The above scheme of reservation will be effective in respect of all direct recruitment vacancies to be notified on or after 01.02.2019.

12. All the Ministries/Departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all appointing authorities under their control. In case of any difficulty with regard to implementation of the provisions of this OM, the concerned authorities may consult DOP&T through their administrative Ministry/Department.

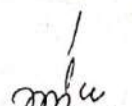
